## Ad hoc Working Group on Reporting

- Requested to provide recommendations on the objectives and scope of reporting under Resolution 8 (2012) in light of capacities and needs of Parties, cost effectiveness, and feasibility of aligning with EU Nature Directives Article 17 and 12 Reporting
- The Working Group met twice in 2022, with key outcomes being:
  - The reporting procedure needs to be simplified
  - Reporting needs to be useful to Parties
  - Reporting should be complimentary to other MEA reporting
  - Data should be as up to date as possible



## 3<sup>rd</sup> Ad hoc Working Group on Reporting

June 27th 2023

Four options proposed for simplification:

#### 1. Report on all features and in the full format.

- Full compatibility with EU reporting
- Large reporting burden

#### 2. Report on a reduced number of features, full format.

- Omit entire taxonomic groups
- Meaningful analysis possible
- Compatibility with EU reporting

# 3<sup>rd</sup> Ad hoc Working Group on Reporting



#### June 27th 2023

Four options proposed for simplification:

- 3. Report on the same selection of features as in 2019 and full format.
- Comparison with trial reporting
- Limitations in data analysis and use

#### 4. Report on all features but revise the reporting format.

- New definition of conservation status needed
- Data not comparable with EU reporting
- New reporting tool needed
- No support from European Environment Agency



# Option 2: Report on a reduced number of features, full format

- The Working Group's recommendations were to:
  - Focus on the habitats where there is 1:1 correlation between Annex I in the Habitats Directive and Bern Resolution 4
  - Omit birds as these tended to be reported on by other means (e.g. Pan European Common Birds Monitoring Scheme)
- Weaker reasons to exclude invertebrates and/or plants
- Potential to exclude marine mammals as they are reported under OSPAR
- Agreed reports should cover the period 2019 2024 and will be due in January 2026.

#### **Checklists of Species and Habitats**

- Country size and number of biogeographical regions significantly influences the number of features a Party must report
- Marine features will not be included in the checklists, but Parties can report voluntarily
- Parties are *invited* to report on species subject to reservations
- Resolution No.6 (1998) species marked with '#' should be included in checklists



## **Reporting Format**

Change	Nature of the change / intention	Group's decision
General reporting format	<ul> <li>Addition of success stories to showcase conservation successes</li> <li>Deletion of sections to avoid duplication of reported data</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Simplification and deletion of sections welcomed</li> </ul>
Short-term trend magnitude	<ul> <li>Measure the extent of change</li> <li>Ranges are provided in case a value is unknown</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Need to be able to report 'unknown'</li> <li>Guidelines needed</li> </ul>
Favourable reference values	<ul> <li>Lack of accuracy of operators used in the past (&gt;, &gt;&gt;, &lt;)</li> <li>Ranges are provided if precise favourable reference value is unknown</li> </ul>	<ul><li>Data available likely limited</li><li>Important to record quality of data</li></ul>
Species population size units	<ul> <li>Vertebrates to be measured in individuals</li> <li>Vascular plants to be measured in individuals, m<sup>2</sup> or 1x1 km grids</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Option to use 'Additional population size' field when individuals unknown</li> <li>Report won't be blocked if field left empty</li> </ul>
Pressures and threats	<ul> <li>Focus on pressures (not on threats anymore)</li> <li>Assessment of the scope and influence of pressures</li> </ul>	<ul> <li>Data availability likely limited</li> <li>Further consideration needed</li> </ul>
Reference date	Reference date for population / range when the Convention came into force	<ul> <li>Agreed date of adoption of Res. No 8 (2012)</li> </ul>
Invasive Alien Species List	Adoption of list of Invasive Alien Species of Union concern	Advice needed from Bern Group of Experts on Invasive Alien Species
