Open file 2020/09 - Bosnia and Herzegovina: Possible negative impact of hydropower plant development on the Neretva river

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- Recommendations no. 217 (2022)

- Set of fifteen (15) recomm. adopted during 42nd meeting of the StC in Dec 2022, which are in presentation presented in 6 "clusters":
- Recomm. No. 1-6 calls for rapid declaration for protection of "Gornji tok Neretve" as Emerald Network site and to ensure adequate mitigation measures
- Recomm. No. 7 calls for halting the construction of HPP Ulog
- Recomm. No. 8-9 calls for prohibition of implementation of Gornja Neretva hydro scheme in RS, HPPs in FBiH, cancelation of concessions and removal from SP's
- Recomm. No. 10-11 calls for suspension of all planning and permitting of projects along the Upper Neretva tributaries, assessment of habitats and species
- Recomm. No. 12-13 calls for banning of further development of hydro projects in all other candidate Emerald sites in the Neretva river basin
- Recomm. No 14-15 calls for collaboration and establishment of an FP for the BC

Declaration of protection of "Gornji tok Neretve" as **Emerald Network site** and elaboration of adequate mitigation measures

Not implemented

- > Drafting and approval of EIA for Phase I (3 SHPPs) is temporary suspended
- RS entity level protection-granting procedure on "stand by" since 2021, however, it is important to emphasize that this is not the protection which was primarily advised by Recomm. No. 1
- Emerald Network site (BA000002) remains unprotected
- For Phase II (4 SHPP's) all domestic legal remedies have been exhausted, but the project remains in place with legal grounds to apply for construction permits
- The Complainants remain concerned that eventual entity-level protection (IV category regime) will not hinder future realization of 7 SHPPs
- Uncertain operational mode of HPP Ulog (technical possibilities for hydropeaking hard to ignore), and project falls out of the (eventually) protected area

Halting the construction of HPP Ulog (35 MW)

- Not implemented
- > The construction of the HPP Ulog has not been halted nor was it imposed
- Moreover, the construction has significantly intensified. According to the investors, the expected finalization is latest in 2024
- In July 2023, the RS authorities re-approved the EIA (originally approved in 2013) for installation of 20 km of power-lines until 2028, without requesting new EIA
- The most recent activities on HPP Ulog (during Sept/Oct 2023) already resulted in a severe negative impact (!)
- Prolonged water pollution led to suffocation of fish downstream of the HPP Ulog construction site
- No penalties for the misconduct were imposed by the RS inspection which failed to assess the impact on the site

Prohibition of implementation of Gornja Neretva hydro scheme (7 SHPPs) in RS, large HPPs in FBiH, **cancelation** of concessions and **removal** from SP's

- Not implemented
- The 7 SHPPs are still pending. So far, no physical realization of any of the SHPPs, but all concession contracts remain binding and in place
- Request for information submitted to all relevant RS authorities proved the RS authorities haven't conducted any steps
- RS Government (as grantor) exclusively titled to cancel these concessions, but clearly, so far, no real intention and zero legal steps were taken to implement Recomm. No. 8
- Also, limited initiative from FB&H authorities were noted, but eventually no legal action was conducted to cancel or prohibit the projects downstream of HPP Ulog (HPP Glavatičevo and HPP Bjelimići)

Suspension of all planning and permitting of projects along the Upper Neretva tributaries, assessment of habitats and species

Not implemented

- Nine (9) SHPPs on Ljuta river in FB&H, Neretva's most valuable tributary, remain as planned and still under permiting procedures
- Jezernica hydro scheme (4 SHPPs) in RS, another tributary of Neretva, still under active planning
- The concession for HES Jezernica scheme was recently transferred from private company to Elektroprivreda Republike Srpske (RS public electricity producer)
- So far, none of the projects planned on Upper Neretva tributaries were not terminated nor red-flaged by any authority
- Findings obtained through NSW initiative yet to be consulted by authorities

Rapid formulation of management plan and **banning** of further development of hydro projects in all other **candidate Emerald sites** in the Neretva river basin

Not implemented

- > The realisation of the Upper Horizons hydropower scheme (3 HPPs) has intensified
- Neretva Delta in Croatia (Natura 2000 site), and Nevesinjsko, Dabarsko, Fatničko, Popovo poljes - four Emerald sites in B&H can be impacted by Upper Horizons projects
- In June 2023, the RS officials declared the beginning of the main construction works on HPP Dabar (160 MW) on the site in Dabarsko karst field Emerald site (BA0000024)
- The channel in Fatničko karst field Emerald site (BA0000023) is already constructed, whereas the screening procedure for HPP Bileća (32 MW) is currently ongoing

Collaboration between the authorities and concerned parties and establishment of **FP for the BC** on state level

Limited implementation

- Focal Point for the BC officialy appointed on entity level
- NGO's were not consulted or invited for collaboration after the Interentity Body for Environmetal Protection meeting in February 2023
- Letter sent in June 2023 to the newly appointed RS Minister for environment, proposing a consultative meeting on the status of play regarding ongoing protection procedure, left without any feedback
- Concession contracts for Gornja Neretva hydro scheme (RS), Construction permits for HPP Dabar (RS) and documentation for Ljuta river (FBiH) persistantly remain undisclosed to the Complainats

Neretva Science Week (2023)



Main findings from NSW (May/June 2023)

- Confirms the Neretva River basin as of extremely high biodiversity value
- 70 scientists have extended the research to tributaries (Ljuta and Jezernica rivers), the nearby karst field (Nevesinjsko polje), and Zalomka river
- Over 800 vascular plant species registered, at least 2 new specimens of bats were discovered, at least 4 new species of butterflies of high value
- A species discovered during NSW 2022 was officially confirmed as a new species for science and was named after Neretva river (Baeoura neretvaensis)
- Endemic species of the Adriatic soft-mouth trout (Salmo obtusirostris), critically endangered (IUCN categorization) as the most important finding
- The eDNA samples to be verified very soon

Conclusion

Recommendations No. 217 (2022), including halting construction, cancelation of concessions and mandatory protection, have been <u>practically almost ignored</u> by the relevant B&H authorities

Disconcerning narattive(s):

1. Statement by the RS authorities (included in the latest Progress report) that the "Decision making (...) has been prolonged until the RS Government takes its position on final purpose of the subject area", and that the "Construction of HPP Ulog has not been halted as it falls outside of scope of the protected area" (?)

2. Blame-shifting by FB&H authorities (after deliberately discarding all the HPP Ulog-related archives in 2019) and vague action regarding federal projects

Proposal

- The Complainants call upon the Standing Committee to take a clear position and to direct the authorities of B&H to urgently follow up on recommendation in a more <u>diligent, cooperative and appropriate way</u>, and to ensure involvement of both state and entity level authorities and the complainants in a joint consultations on the most appropriate actions
- Proposal to rename the Case file from "Possible negative impact (...)" to "Negative impact of hydro-power plant development on the Neretva river"
