



<u>Greece: Threats to Marine Turtles</u> in Thines Kiparissias

Habitat Degradation due to Uncontrolled Development in a Protected Sea Turtle Nesting Area






- A NATURA 2000 site: GR2550005
 "Thines Kyparissias: Neochori Kyparissia"
- Extensive sand dunes system with Juniperus spp.
- The largest reproductive population across the Mediterranean for the protected loggerhead sea turtle (*Caretta caretta*). During the 2023 nesting season over 5.000* nests were recorded in the nesting core area (from Neda to Arkadikos River which spans 9,5 km)

The issuance of the Presidential Decree




Overview



Rec. No 174. Measure No 1: Appropriate Protection status Presidential Decree (PD) a positive step but not ensuring adequate protection



No buffer zone between Nature Protection Area & Agricultural Landscape Zone Presidential Decree designates Kyparissia Bay as a Nature Protected Area NOT as a National Park



- Adjacent areas to the Nature Protection Areas, are designated as Agricultural Landscape Zones where construction is permitted
- Part of the coastal area behind the core nesting beaches (red rectangles) is designated as Agricultural Landscape Zones, putting in extreme danger the reproduction of sea turtles and the adequate protection of the habitat

Rec. No 174. Measure No 2: Permanent Prohibition of Construction (buildings, roads, etc.)

Presidential Decree fails to adequately protect Kyparissia Bay from constructions







Core nesting area, Agiannakis to Elaia & Vounaki, 6th July 2023. The five illegal roads are not restored yet, in violation of the PD. Blockades placed by the Ministry of Environment and Energy fail to prevent vehicles accessing the beach. See top picture, vehicle has bypassed the blockades and is on the side of the beach





Rec. No 174. Measure No 3:

Prevent cars & caravans from reaching the proximity of the nesting beaches





Kalo Nero core nesting area 6th July 2023. No management measures exist to prevent cars and caravans (17 counted) parking in close proximity to the nesting beach, during the day and campsin overnight. Nests in red circles, caravans and cars behind them.



Vounaki core nesting area, 6th July 2023. Traces (in yellow line) of cars and vehicles driving on the nesting beach. Nests in red circles.



Core nesting area between Agiannakis and Elaia village, 6th July 2023. Camping directly behind the core nesting area in the protected forestry area and illegal roads. Presence of dogs as well (white circle). No action is taken by the authorities to prevent it.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 4: Adjustments to existing buildings & Restoration of Original Dune and Forest Habitat





Kalo Nero, 6th July 2023. Cultivation of invasive species *Carpobrotus sp.* encroaching onto the high density nesting area (Red circles, nests) of the beach from Kalo Nero to Vounaki [A]. Cultivation of non-indigenous species Musa sp. (red circle) behind a high density nesting area [B]



Agiannakis – August 2023 – The red circle indicates a beach-side villa, which severely alters and degrades the sand dune zone. The operating beach bar (yellow circle) apart from causing light pollution, attracts a significant number of vehicles which park in the sand dune zone.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 5: No agriculture on public land & the dune area





Exactly behind the core nesting areas of Vounaki and Agiannaki, 6th July 2023. Sand dune destruction due to agricultural use; ongoing watermelon (above red line) and zucchini (below red line) cultivation.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 6: Light Pollution reduction





Kalo Nero core nesting area, 5th July [A] & 26th June [B] 2023. Light pollution emitted from the beach bars/restaurants. Beach furniture not removed during the night, causing obstacles for nesting females & hatchlings and limiting the availability of nesting space. A nesting female [B] (red circle), is stuck under unstacked sunbeds.

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Rec. No 174. Measure No 7: Beach Equipment management





Kalo Nero core nesting area 6th July 2023. Illegal wooden walkways placed by local businesses not removed and no enforcement of demolition protocols. Shower (yellow circle) runoff flows on the protected nesting beach, next to a nest. No beach management exists to provide a safe distance between visitors and sea turtle nests (red circles).



Kalo Nero, 8th August 2023, 6:00am. Local businesses do not stack beach furniture. Wooden pathways limit the nesting females and hatchlings.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 8: Prohibits any sand & gravel extraction or any new structures near the sea





Kalo Nero, 25th May 2023. Beach cleaning with heavy vehicles (red circle) drastically affects the beach profile.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 9: Further construction outside the urban-planning areas



Disregard to the Presidential Decree's prohibition of the expansion of settlements and buildings in the Nature Protections Areas, newly constructed house as recorded during 2023 survey





Top Agiannakis & Bottom Vounaki core nesting areas, 6th July 2023. Two newly constructed houses completed in 2021 (red circles).

Rec. No 174. Measure No 10: Regulation of vessel navigation & fishing practices





Kalo Nero, 20 June 2023. Fishing with nets at a very close distance from the shore is a constant threat to nesting females, as they may get entangled and injured in their attempt to reach the beach for nesting. Fisheries regulations are not addressed by the Presidential Decree – Urgent need of a Management Plan


The Regulation of fishing activities are not considered in the Presidential Decree. This significant threat is supposed to be addressed in the Management Plan which is yet to be developed!

Urgent action is needed to reduce/ eliminate this threat. Regarding sea turtle strandings, 9 turtles were recorded by ARCHELON between early May and late September. Overall, according to the Coast Guard, 23 dead sea turtles were found in the whole of Kyparissia Bay (43.5km) since the beginning of the year.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 11: Human presence on the nesting beach







Kalo Nero, 5th August 2023. A festival with loud music and bright headlights was held a few meters behind the nesting beach. Red arrows indicate nests right below the festival.

Kalo Nero core nesting area, 5th & 6th July 2023. Top & Middle; 17 Caravans parked during the day and overnight for camping directly behind the core nesting area. Bottom; evidence of bonfires (in yellow – nests in red circles), in close proximity to sea turtle nests.


Rec. No 174. Measure No 11: Human presence on the nesting beach



Giannitsochori, 3rd August 2023. A festival with loud music & bright floodlights is taking place just behind the nesting beach.



Giannitsochori, 29th July 2023. Members of the public are engaging in a beach party with loud music and bright lights resulting in hatchling disorientation. Big umbrellas and a "bar" construction have been installed on the beach and the sand dune area, resulting in the trampling of the vegetation.



Giannitsochori, 8th August 2023. Freelance camping and semi-permanent constructions on the beach hinder the nesting process.

Rec. No 174. Measure No 11: Human presence on the nesting beach









Kalo Nero core nesting area. A poster calling for horse riding at Elaia nesting beach 5th July 2023 (top), picture taken from the official Instagram account posted 2nd of June 2023 and horse droppings at Agiannakis high density nesting beach (down).



Rec. No 174. Measure No 11: Control feral dogs as they have proved to attack and hurt many nesting sea turtles

No feral dogs attacks were recorded this year.

Conclusions



Rec. No 174 has not been fully implemented

- The ongoing projects for carrying out Special Environmental Studies for the issuance of Presidential Decrees and Management Plans for all Natura 2000 sites in Greece is fraught with delays and implementation problems. There are serious concerns about the process and the expected outcomes
- Contracts signed for the exploration and potential extraction of hydrocarbons in the adjacent marine protected areas constitute a new significant additional threat

MEDASSET



Calls upon the Authorities to:

- Safeguard and enforce implementation of the Presidential Decree (PD) regulations
- Urgently issue and implement a Management Plan in collaboration with the Protected Areas Management Unit, which will also cover unresolved issues not addressed in the PD (e.g. fishing activities and nighttime beach use and operation of beach bars)
- Impose fines and penalties in order to stop illegal activities and restore the habitat especially the sand dune habitats, which are degraded year by year
- Keep the Standing Committee informed about progress in the implementation of the above Recommendations

Calls upon the Bern Convention Standing Committee to:

- Encourage authorities to provide further information to the Standing Committee, as requested above
- Urge authorities to implement Recommendation No.174 (2014)
- Discuss the case file at the 43rd Meeting of the Standing Committee
- Bring the issue to the European Commission as part of the infringement process for noncompliance with CJEU's judgment C-504/14
