





# GREECE: Recommendation No. 9 (1987) on the protection of Caretta caretta in Laganas Bay, Zakynthos







In view of the recent recommendations/clarifications requested by the Bureau, Greece would like to provide the following information:

### Funding of surveillance and monitoring activities of NECCA/OFYPEKA

• The funding of surveillance and monitoring activities in the area of the National Marine Park of Zakynthos (e.g., surveillance, wages of the scientific staff, cost of fuel for the vehicles, equipment, infrastructure, maintenance, etc.) has been secured by the NECCA\*/OFYPEKA, through the undisrupted operation of the recently (2022) established Management Unit of National Parks of Zakynthos, Ainos and Protected Areas of Ionian Islands-Headquarter Zakynthos (PAMU 11), thus allowing the continuity of mitigation measures which have been implemented in the protected area since 2000

NECCA consists of local Management Units for Protected Areas throughout Greece







### The staff of NECCA: extra authorities

- Art. 182 of the new national law no. 5037/2023 (Government Gazette, no. 78/A/29.03.2023) stipulates that
  the surveillance and scientific staff of NECCA/OFYPEKA Management Units of Protected Areas & their
  Annexes throughout the country, are from now on authorized to conduct environmental inspections within
  their jurisdiction, draw up on-the-spot appraisal reports, summon people against whom on-the-spot
  appraisals have been carried out or even issue any certificates of violation that may include
  recommendations addressing to the involved people or a fine proposal to the competent authorities. These
  certificates are subsequently forwarded to the prosecutor in charge of these cases, if needed
- A first training video conference involving the surveillance and scientific staff of NECCA took place on 25 May 2023 with the participation of representatives from several national authorities (e.g., the Hellenic Coastguard, Forest Service, Department for Environmental Inspection, the Police) introducing the main aspects of control in case of infringements to the trainees







### The staff of NECCA: extra authorities

Specific guidelines on drawing up on-the spot-appraisal reports, issuing certificates on violation and conducting environmental inspections within the jurisdiction of the Management Unit were sent to all members of the staff of NECCA by the Directorate-General of the latter in July 2023







### Laganas Bay: An update

- The number of rangers in Laganas Bay is quite satisfactory in terms of reducing the impact of visitors and recreational activities on the reproduction process of sea turtles through the dissemination of information on site and the whole public awareness infrastructure in place (e.g., cameras, panels, barriers, leaflets, information center, etc.)
- Illegal activities are recorded and official complaints are made to the local authorities (e.g., the Hellenic Coastguard, Public Estate Service)
- Any infringement having immediate impact on loggerhead sea turtles is addressed due to the close cooperation between the local Management Unit of NECCA/OFYPEKA in Zakynthos and the NGO 'ARCHELON'
- Therefore, under a specific research permit issued for the NGO 'ARCHELON', the staff must report any
  infringement to the local Management Unit immediately; the latter, in turn, is obliged to undertake all
  necessary measures dealing with any issue affecting sea turtles







### Laganas Bay: An update

- Light pollution, the occurrence of stray dogs and cats, night intrusion in protected beaches, boat intrusion in forbidden marine areas, marine speed issues, placing of illegal umbrellas are among the issues addressed through cooperation with the competent entities
- The same also applies for the **NGO 'WWF Hellas'**, especially when it comes to the strictly protected area of Sekania, since the everyday presence of their staff in the area aims to prevent fires in summertime. The close cooperation between this NGO and the local Management Unit is **crucial**, since the latter is called to act immediately in case of illegal entering the protected area, particularly the adjacent strictly protected marine area
- The use of camera-monitoring systems in significant nesting beaches for sea turtles, namely Sekania and Gerakas, has undoubtedly increased the quality of protection provided by the Management Unit







# Laganas Bay: An update

- It is also expected that **extra seasonal personnel will be hired** in the future, particularly during summertime, to strengthen the existent staff who are in charge of surveillance and public awareness
- When it comes to the number of people visiting the area, this is the average number within the specified limits
- In the cases of Gerakas and Daphni, **strict adaptive management measures** are implemented limiting considerably the interaction between visitors and the nesting areas (e.g., delineation of the nesting area with ropes, banning of umbrellas in some areas, dissemination of environmental information to tourists) in order to ensure the normal process of egg maturation during the day
- Although some peaks in marine traffic might also occur in summer, the local Division of the Hellenic Coastguard is in place to constantly monitor marine traffic and impose fines accordingly
- Finally, due to the close cooperation between the Coastguard and the Management Unit, the number of dead or injured turtles found in Laganas Bay was significantly low this year (one dead and one injured individual due to a collision with a boat; both cases were filed by the Coastguard)







## The conservation of C. caretta in Laganas Bay: An update

- In 2023 the number of nests (>2050 nests based on provisional data) reached a peak over a 39-year monitoring period, a fact that is also supported by a positive trend in the nesting activity recorded during the last decade
- The **conservation targets**, which were recently adopted by a recent **Ministerial Decision** for the protection of *C. caretta* in Greece, clearly set a target value of **940 nests/year** in the area of Laganas Bay, a Natura-2000 protected area with the code name 'GR2210002', (Government Gazette No. 1807/B/2023, see 'Table GR2210002\_2.1. *Caretta caretta* (1224)', p. 16909)
- This number can be used to evaluate the effectiveness of the management measures taken and provide concrete protection for the species







### Other developments

- The case of the illegal road: The offender was recently criminally condemned by the appeal court. A
  further appeal was made about 2 months ago to 'Areios Pagos', which is the Supreme court serving as
  the second-instance court. This appeal was eventually rejected
- Other alleged illegal developments in the area have been brought to justice and the national
  authorities will implement the rulings, when the latter order specific actions to be taken by the authorities
- In the same spirit, a number of other alleged illegal actions have been brought to justice. National
  Authorities are ready to intervene for ensuring implementation of future Court decisions
- Clarification is needed on whether claims made by the complainant concern the above cases or other
  cases. If the latter is true, the complaining NGO is kindly requested to provide specific geographic
  coordinates and precise relevant information regarding the alleged illegal developments to the
  National Authorities without further delay
