What is restorative justice?

Restorative justice is an approach of addressing **harm** or the risk of harm through engaging **all those affected** in coming to a common understanding and agreement on how the harm or wrongdoing can be repaired and justice achieved.

Rather than keeping people apart or excluding those perceived as a threat, restorative processes restore safety and security through bringing people together to undo injustice, repair harm and alleviate suffering through dialogue and agreement.

After the trial, the conflict is over – or so it appears at a distance – but not for the victim or for the offender – the act, the crime, brought them into a relationship that is, as yet unresolved.

They each have questions – why me? What have I done? What actually happened? How did I react? Who am I in this case?

Paradoxically, they need each other's help to find the answers.

Victims

- Recognition: being heard
- Emotional restoration: feelings of respect and dignity
- Reparation of the harm, when possible
- Empowerment: feelings of control
- Fear reduction: feelings of safety
- Positive changes on oneself
- Perception of fairness in the process

Perpetrators

- Active role in repairing the harm
- Opportunity to tell one's story
- Opportunity to hear the other's story
- Disengagement from criminal activity
- Positive changes about view of oneself
- Contribution to safer societies

Victims of cybercrimes & restorative justice

- Anonymity & no contact
- Minimisation
- Not forgotten
- Wider public
- Mirroring real life issues
- Social inequalities and discrimination

- Prevention and education (restorative schools, organisations, families)
- Mediation, conferencing, circles
- Indirect dialogues/ surrogate parties

Case studies

Sexting in school (USA)

- Restorative group conference with 40 people (students, parents, school admin, teachers, investigators)
- After sexually explicit images were disseminated
- Signed agreement (unanimous consensus)
 - Written school paper
 - Promise of immediate reporting
 - Parents phone monitoring
 - Educational workshop for all

Online hate speech (Finland)


- Victim-offender mediation with 2 adult Finnish men
- After Turku attacks (2017), a journalist was threatened to death in an online forum
- Signed agreement
 - Joint article on hate speech and their mediation experience

What can be the added value of restorative justice in cases of cybercrimes?

- As preventive measures as well as concrete responses to harm
- A bridge between parties in conflict, breaking the anonymity, focusing on harm, stopping repetition
- Values and practice principles applicable to different target groups and in different cases
- Little research on potential for cybercrimes
- Possibility to facilitate restorative encounters in online settings (covid-19 experiences)
- No "best practice"
