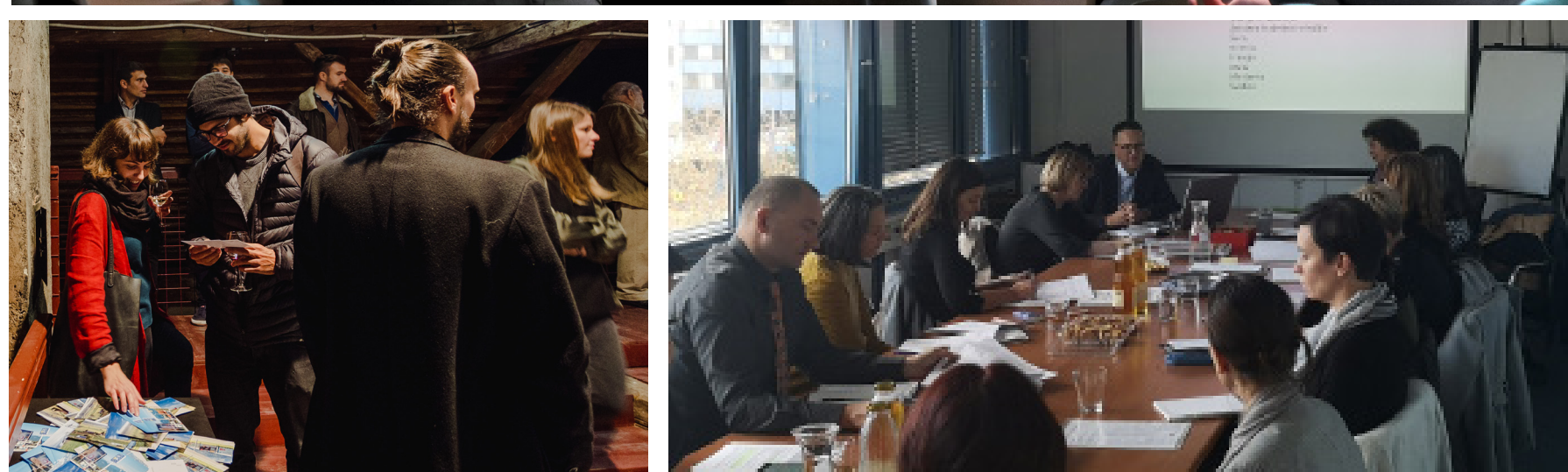

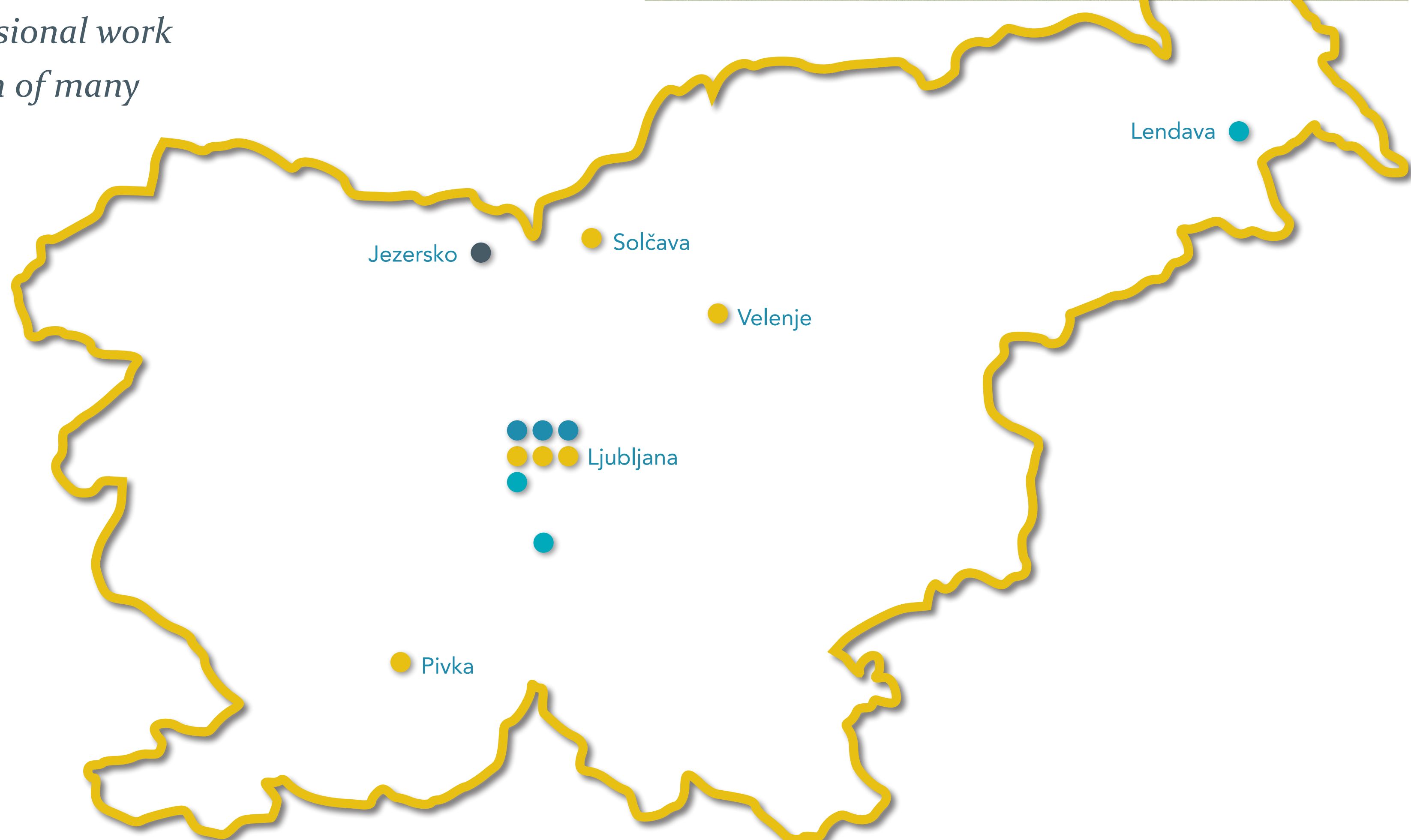
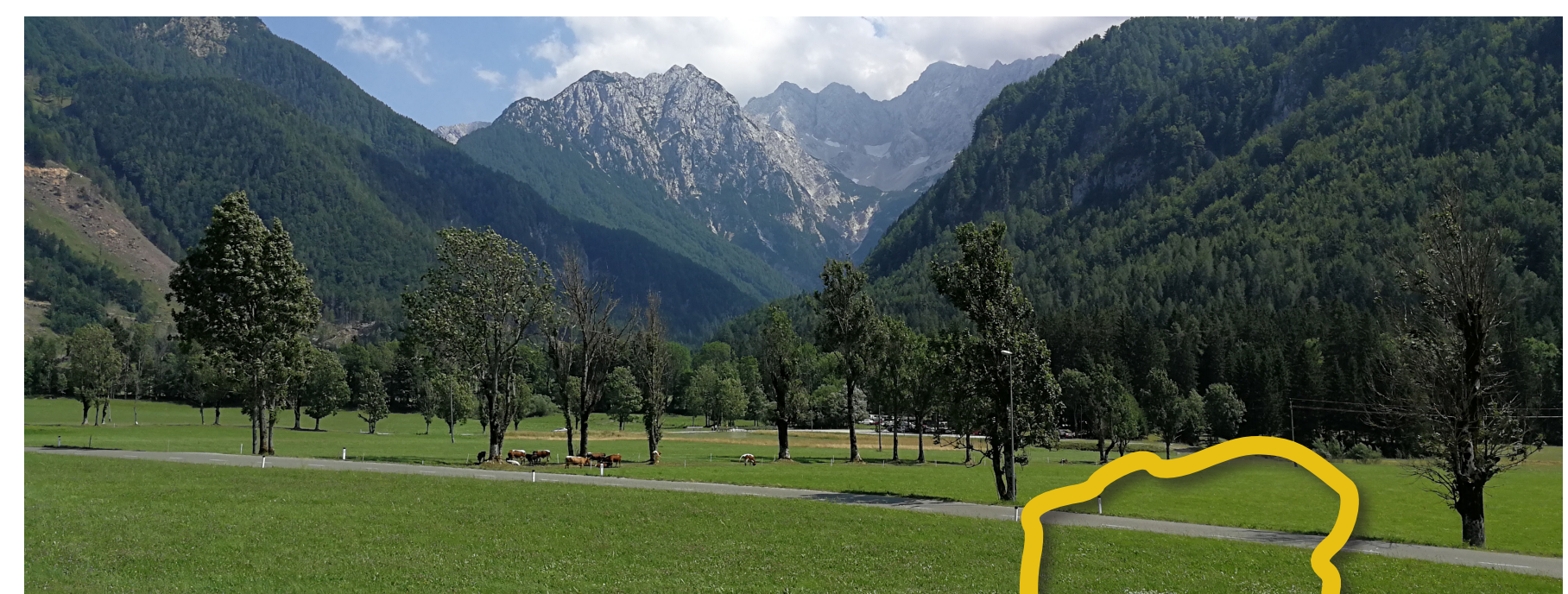

The concept of the Landscape Policy of Slovenia was created gradually, on the basis of analytical professional work in a broad working group and with the cooperation of many participants and the general public.*



*Landscape policy of Slovenia is a broad system framework for society's activities in the field of landscape, based on a social agreement on values, development goals, and approaches to landscape protection, planning and management.*



### PROFESSIONAL PUBLIC ●

The implementation of the project was followed by **interministerial focus group**, consisting of representatives of various ministries. **Expert meetings** and a **final international conference** were held.

### GENERAL PUBLIC ●

For the general public, a travelling exhibition on landscape changes, an educational film, and workshops called "»Let's talk about landscape - together«" were organized, aimed at discussing landscape issues and opinions outside expert circles.

### THEMATIC WORKSHOPS ●

Across Slovenia **four thematic workshops** were **organized** about planning and managing different landscape types for the interested public, professionals and representatives of the local communities.

### ANALYTICAL WORK

The **analysis of the existing system of landscape planning, protection and management in Slovenia** and a **case study of foreign examples of landscape policies** was the basis for the discussions and preparation of the Concept of Landscape Policy of Slovenia.
