National policies and international co-operation for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

Introduction

[European Landscape Convention of the Council of Europe \(ETS 176\)](#)

Adopted in Strasbourg by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on 19 July 2000, the European Landscape Convention was opened for signature by the Organisation's Member States in Florence on 20 October of that year. As the first international treaty devoted exclusively to all aspects of landscape, it addresses the Council of Europe's key challenges in the areas of human rights, democracy and the rule of law.

The Council of Europe Member States signatories to the Convention have declared themselves "concerned to achieve sustainable development based on a balanced and harmonious relationship between social needs, economic activity and the environment". The Convention is therefore the first international treaty devoted to sustainable development, with the cultural dimension a particularly relevant factor. Although each citizen must, of course, contribute to preserving the quality of the landscape, it is the authorities that are responsible for establishing the general framework that enables that quality to be assured. The Convention accordingly lays down the general legal principles that must guide the adoption of national landscape policies and the establishment of international co-operation in this area.

The Convention provides that existing competent Committees of Experts of the Council of Europe, set up under its Statute, are designated by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe, to monitor its implementation. The Work Programme of the Convention adopted by the Council of Europe conferences on the European Landscape Convention and the Steering Committee for Culture, Heritage and Landscape (CDCPP) is implemented by the Secretariat General of the Council of Europe which transmits a report on the work carried out, and on the operation of the Convention, to the Committee of Ministers.

To date, 40 States have ratified the European Landscape Convention: Andorra, Armenia, Azerbaijan, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Bulgaria, Croatia, Cyprus, Czech Republic, Denmark, Estonia, Finland, France, Georgia, Greece, Hungary, Iceland, Ireland, Italy, Latvia, Lithuania, Luxembourg, Republic of Moldova, Montenegro, Netherlands, North Macedonia, Norway, Poland, Portugal, Romania, San Marino, Serbia, Slovak Republic, Slovenia, Spain, Sweden, Switzerland, Turkey, Ukraine and the United Kingdom. One further State has signed it: Malta.

[Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention](#)

The main objectives of the Work Programme of the Convention (Part 2 of this document) are to promote participatory democracy, maintaining and deepening dialogue and co-operation between public authorities and civil society for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention by:

1. Organising biennial Council of Europe Conferences on the European Landscape Convention, according to the terms of reference of Committees of Experts set up under Article 17 of the Statute of the Council of Europe designated by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe to be responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Convention (Article 10 of the Convention – Monitoring of the implementation of the Convention);
2. Organising annually one or several Council of Europe Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention;
3. Maintaining the Information System of the Council of Europe European Landscape Convention, and launching its Third Phase of activity, with the preparation of national and regional reports, and thematic reports on public policies of Parties to the Convention (according to Recommendation CM/Rec(2013)4 on the European Landscape Convention Information System of the Council of Europe and its glossary, adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 11 December 2013);
4. Continuing the organisation of the Sessions of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe in the framework of the Council of Europe Landscape Award Alliance

and of the Forums on the national selections of the Landscape Award (according to the Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe and to the Resolution CM/Res(2017)18 on the Landscape Award Alliance of the Council of Europe, adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 27 September 2017);

5. Continuing the preparation of thematic reports and draft recommendations of the Committee of Ministers on natural, rural, urban and peri-urban areas, considered as outstanding, everyday and degraded, inland and maritime waters being taken into consideration;
6. Establishing Working Groups supported by expertise, in order to prepare draft recommendations for the attention of the CDCPP and Committee of Ministers;
7. Promoting synergies on the themes of sustainable development (environment, society, economy and culture), democracy, human rights and rule of law;
8. Contributing to the global debates on sustainable development (United Nations 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development) and habitat.

1. Council of Europe Conferences on the European Landscape Convention

Summary

The Council of Europe Conferences on the European Landscape Convention aim to present the progress made in the implementation of the Convention, and to deal with the practical questions relating to its implementation. They allow the Council of Europe to ensure the implementation of the Convention, in accordance with its Article 10. The Committee of Experts mentioned in this Article is the Steering Committee for Culture, Heritage and Landscape (CDCPP), according to the Committee of Ministers' decision. The conclusions of the Conference are brought to the attention of the CDCPP, which then reports to the Committee of Ministers.

The 10th Council of Europe Conference on the implementation of the Landscape Convention, was organised under the auspices of the Finnish Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers, at the Palais de l'Europe, Strasbourg, 6-7 May 2019 ([CEP-CDCPP \(2019\) 20E](#)).

The 11th Council of Europe Conference on the implementation of the Landscape Convention, will be held under the auspices of the Hungarian Chairmanship of the Committee of Ministers, at the Palais de l'Europe, Strasbourg, on [26-27 May 2021](#).

Action required

The CDCPP is invited to:

2. Council of Europe Meetings for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

2.1. Council of Europe Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the Convention

Summary

Regularly organised by the Council of Europe in the framework of the Work Programme of the European Landscape Convention, the Meetings of the Workshops for the implementation of the Convention aim to present new concepts and achievements in support of the implementation of the Convention. They represent a real forum for exchanging practices and ideas. Special emphasis is given to the experiences of the State hosting the meeting.

22nd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "Water, landscape and citizenship, in the face of global change", Seville, Spain, 14-16 March 2019

The Meeting was organised by the Council of Europe, in co-operation with the Ministry of Education, Culture and Sport of Spain, in partnership with the Council of Andalusia and the Municipality of Seville. The Meeting aimed to present experiences of public policies adopted, or being developed, concerning *water and marine areas*, considering Article 2 of the Convention (Scope).

23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention and Celebration at High Level of the Twentieth Anniversary of the European Landscape Convention on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies", Lausanne, Switzerland, initially scheduled for 19-20 October 2020

The Meeting was prepared by the Council of Europe, in co-operation with the Swiss Federal Office for the Environment (FOEN) and the collaboration of the Canton of Vaud and the City of Lausanne. However, it could not be held due to the evolution of the pandemic and health regulations. The purpose of the Meeting was to present experiences of public policies adopted, or being developed, concerning the implementation of Article 5 d. of the European Landscape Convention on "General measures", according to which each Party undertakes "to integrate landscape into its regional and town planning policies and in its cultural, environmental, agricultural, social and economic policies, as well as in any other policies with possible direct or indirect impact on landscape".

The Lausanne Declaration on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies", however, was symbolically adopted on 20 October 2020, by the representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention invited to participate in the Meeting, following a written consultation procedure (Appendix 1 to this document).

The contributions prepared for the Meeting will be the subject of a thematic publication by the Council of Europe in the European Spatial Planning and Landscape Series. The theme will be dealt with during the 11th Council of Europe Conference on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention, Strasbourg, 26-27 May 2021.

2.2. Council of Europe National Symposiums on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention

Summary

Intended for States which have or have not yet ratified the European Landscape Convention, the national, and regional, Symposiums on the Convention are organised by the Council of Europe, Secretariat of the European Landscape Convention, in co-operation with the hosting State, in the framework of the Work Programme of the Convention. They generate debate on the subject of landscape, and policies relating to the landscape.

National Days on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention in France: "*Landscapes from here and elsewhere: cross-views on some landscape approaches at different scales, on both sides of the border*", Council of Europe, Strasbourg and Northern Vosges, 26-27 November 2019

The Days were organised by the Council of Europe and the Ministry of Ecological and Solidary Transition of France.

National Symposium on the implementation of the European Landscape Convention in Greece, Larissa, Greece, initially scheduled for 22-24 September 2020, and postponed to 2021, due to the pandemic

The Symposium will be organised by the Council of Europe and the Ministry of the Environment and Energy of Greece.

2.3. International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe

Summary

The International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe is celebrated each year on 20 October, the day of the opening of the Convention for signature.

Fourth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe, 20 October 2020

The Fourth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe was celebrated on 20 October 2020. The "Message from Lausanne", on the theme of the 23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies" (initially planned in Lausanne, Switzerland, 19-20 October 2020), invites the actors of the territory to "integrate landscape into its regional and town planning policies and in its cultural, environmental, agricultural, social and economic policies, as well as in any other policies with possible direct or indirect impact on landscape." (Article 5 d. of the European Landscape Convention). On the occasion of this Day, political declarations were adopted and events organised in Finland (Press releases in English, Finnish and Swedish), Serbia, and in other States.

Fifth Council of Europe International Landscape Day, 20 October 2021

The Fifth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe will be celebrated on 20 October 2021. The "Message from Mallorca", on the theme of the 25th Council of Europe Meeting of Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "*Landscape Strategies, Action plans and Policy documents for landscape quality*", Mallorca, Spain, 6-8 October 2021, will invite the actors of the territory to "establish and implement landscape policies aimed at landscape protection, management and planning." (Article 5 b. of the European Landscape Convention).

Action required

The CDCPP is invited to take note of:

– the celebration of the Fourth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe on 20 October 2020. The "Message from Lausanne", on the theme of the 23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "Landscape integration in sectoral policies" (initially planned in Lausanne, Switzerland, 19-20 October 2020), the actors of the territory to "integrate landscape into ... regional and town planning policies and in ... cultural, environmental, agricultural, social and economic policies, as well as in any other policies with possible direct or indirect impact on landscape" (Article 5 d. of the European Landscape Convention);

– the preparation of the Fifth International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe will be celebrated on 20 October 2021. The "Message from Mallorca", on the theme of the 25th Council of Europe Meeting of Workshops for the implementation of the European Convention on the landscape on "*Landscape Strategies, Action plans and Policy documents for landscape quality*" (Mallorca, Spain, 6-8 October 2021), will invite the actors of the territory to "establish and implement landscape policies aimed at landscape protection, management and planning." (Article 5 b. of the European Landscape Convention).

3. International Landscape Observatory of the Council of Europe

3.1. Information System of the European Landscape Convention: National (and Regional) Landscape Policies

Summary

Since the adoption of the European Landscape Convention, major progress has been made towards the establishment of landscape policies at national, regional and local levels.

To ensure exchanges of information between the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention and its follow-up, a document setting out the landscape policies pursued in the Member States was produced on a regular basis by the Secretariat and presented on the occasion of the Council of Europe Conferences on the Convention.¹ The use of the European Landscape Convention Information System and its glossary, set up pursuant to Recommendation CM/Rec(2013)4 of the Committee of Ministers to Member States, permit online access to information concerning national and regional policies that have been

developed.² Addressed to authorities, organisations or citizens seeking useful information on landscape policies, a glossary has been produced in order to explain certain terms employed. The Glossary of the Information System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention, has been published by the Council of Europe publishing (*European Spatial Planning and Landscape* Series, 2018, No. 106).³ It was translated into Polish and Spanish.

The States Parties to the Convention are invited to make use of this Information System and its glossary in the context of their co-operation, to work together on developing it further and to continue to exchange information on all the matters covered by the provisions of the Convention, in order to promote an awareness of landscapes and the policies relating to them. A password to access the online questionnaire has been sent to the national Representative correspondents of the Information System (Appendix 2 to this document). These Representatives have been invited to complete or update the questionnaire, with a view to preparing the National Reports on the implementation of the Convention. A "User Manual", available to national and regional representatives of the Information System (in paragraph 5 of the Manual), invites them if they wish to create passwords for "Delegates" responsible for completing the questionnaire. The Representatives also have the possibility to give passwords to regional representatives. National (and Regional) Reports are already available for several States.

Action required

The CDCPP is invited to:

- invite the National Representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention to complete, or update, the Council of Europe Information System on the European Landscape Convention by 15 December 2020, in accordance with Recommendation CM/Rec(2013)4 of the Committee of Ministers to Member States;
- invite the Representatives of States who so wish to translate the Glossary of the Information System of the Council of Europe Landscape Convention (Council of Europe, *European Spatial Planning and Landscape*, 2018, No. 106) into languages of their choice.

4. Council of Europe’s Landscape Award

4.1. Sessions of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe

Summary

The European Landscape Convention provides for a “Landscape Award of the Council of Europe” which recognises policy or measures which local or regional authorities or non-governmental organisations have adopted: to protect, manage and plan their landscape; which have proved to be lastingly effective; and which can thus serve as an example to other territorial authorities in Europe. According to Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 of the Committee of Ministers on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe, the Award is given by the Committee of Ministers based on proposals from the Committees of Experts of the Council of Europe in charge of monitoring the implementation of the Convention.

6th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe (2018-2019)

Twenty three Applications were presented by the States’ Parties to the European Landscape Convention to the Secretary General of the Council of Europe. On 16 October 2019, the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe adopted the Decisions of the CM on the Award, Special Mentions and Recognitions, in accordance with Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe, and on the recommendation of the International Jury and the Council of Europe Steering Committee responsible for monitoring the implementation of the Convention.⁴

24th Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention “Council of Europe Landscape Award Forum of National Selections – 6th Session 2018-2019”, Geneva, Switzerland, 10-11 June 2021 (initially planned for 10-11 June 2020, then to 21-22 October 2020, and postponed due to the pandemic)

The projects of high value achieved in the Member States of the Organisation on the occasion of the 6th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe – 2018-2019 – will be presented, showing that it is possible to promote the territorial dimension of human rights and democracy by improving the landscape features of people's surroundings. The Ceremony of the 6th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe will take place on this occasion.

7th Session of the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe (2020-2021)

By e-mail of 8 October 2019, addressed to the Permanent Representations with a copy to the members of the CDCPP and national representatives for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention, the Parties to the Convention were invited to submit, by 30 January 2021, applications to the Secretariat of the Council of Europe, according to Resolution CM/Res(2008)3 on the rules governing the Landscape Award of the Council of Europe. A reminder was sent on 21 April 2020.

At its meeting on 30 June 2020 ([CDCPP\(2020\)6](#)), the CDCPP appointed Mrs Isabelle Leroy (Belgium) to represent it in the framework of the International Jury of the 7th Session of the Award which will meet in March 2021.

The Secretariat commissioned a consultant expert from the Council of Europe to prepare a conceptual report on "*Landscape and responsibility of the actors*". The Working Group will be invited to consider a draft recommendation for the attention of the CDCPP and the Committee of Ministers.

Action required

The CDCPP is invited to note:

- further work with a view to preparing draft recommendations for the attention of the CDCPP and the Committee of Ministers.

7. Promoting synergies on the themes of sustainable development (environment, society, economy and culture), democracy, human rights and rule of law

Summary

The Recommendation CM/Rec(2017)7 of the Committee of Ministers to Member States on the contribution of the European Landscape Convention to the exercise of human rights and democracy with a view to sustainable development, adopted by the Committee of Ministers on 27 September 2017 recommends that the governments of States Parties to the European Landscape Convention:

- “– consider the importance that quality and diversity of landscapes has for the minds and bodies of human beings, as well as for societies, in the reflections and work devoted to human rights and democracy, with a view to sustainable development;
- frame landscape policies in the long term, so that they take into account the common surroundings for present and future generations;
- develop landscape policies throughout the entire territory, so that people can enjoy their surroundings in dignity and without discrimination;
- ensure that landscape policies respond to the ideal of living together, especially in culturally diverse societies;
- take into account the landscape issue in the actions taken to promote good governance and democratic citizenship, notably through awareness-raising, training and education;
- apply the principles of human rights and democracy in landscape policies;
- guarantee the right to participation by the general public, local and regional authorities, and other relevant parties including non-governmental organisations, with an interest in the definition, implementation and monitoring of landscape policies;
- include the ‘landscape’, as defined by the Convention, in indicators of sustainable development relating to environmental, social, cultural and economic issues;
- implement the principle of non-regression in order to ensure that landscape policies can only be subject to continuous improvement.”

LAUSANNE DECLARATION

“Landscape integration in sectoral policies”

Symbolically adopted on 20 October 2020,

date of the Celebration of the 20th anniversary of the European Landscape Convention and the 4th International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe,

by the representatives of the States Parties to the European Landscape Convention invited to participate in the 23rd Council of Europe Meeting of the Workshops for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention on "The integration of the landscape into sectoral policies", Lausanne, Switzerland, 19-20 October 2020, following a written consultation procedure.

Due to the pandemic and health regulations at this time, the meeting could not be held as planned and the contributions prepared for the Meeting will be the subject of a thematic publication by the Council of Europe.

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Considering that the aim of the Council of Europe is to achieve greater unity between its members for the purpose of safeguarding and realising the ideals and principles which are their common heritage;

Having regard to:

- the European Landscape Convention, adopted by the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe on 19 July 2000 and opened to Member States for signature in Florence on 20 October 2000 [ETS No. 176];
- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 6 February 2008 on the guidelines for the implementation of the European Landscape Convention, and in particular its Appendix 2 – Suggested text for the practical implementation of the European Landscape Convention at national level [CM/Rec(2008)3];

- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 27 September 2017 on the contribution of the European Landscape Convention to the exercise of human rights and democracy with a view to sustainable development [[CM/Rec\(2017\)7](#)];
- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 14 November 2018 on the creation of public funds for landscape [[CM/Rec\(2018\)9](#)];
- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 16 October 2019 on Landscape integration in policies relating to rural territories in agricultural and forestry, energy and demographic transition [[CM/Rec\(2019\)7](#)];
- the Recommendation of the Committee of Ministers of the Council of Europe of 16 October 2019 on Landscape and democracy: public participation [[CM/Rec\(2019\)8](#)];

Reaffirming that the landscape:

- has an important public interest role in the cultural, ecological, environmental and social fields, and constitutes a resource favourable to economic activity whose protection, management and planning can contribute to job creation;
- is an important part of the quality of life for people everywhere: both in urban areas and in the countryside, in degraded areas and in areas of high quality, in areas recognised as being of outstanding beauty and in everyday areas;
- contributes to the formation of local cultures and that it is a basic component of the natural and cultural heritage, contributing to human well-being;
- is a key element of individual and social well-being and that its protection, management and planning entail rights and responsibilities for everyone;

Considering:

- the powerful symbolic significance of the landscape, which feeds on the sources of the social imagination;
- its structural role as a lever for sustainable development based on a harmonious balance between the environmental, social, cultural, and economic dimensions;
- the importance of the landscape with regard to the challenges of health, food and energy, as well as addressing the challenges resulting from climate change, the disappearance of living species, pollution of the water and air, degradation of agricultural and forest soils, and artificialisation of land;

Noting that the pandemic period has only reinforced this social demand for landscape;

The participants urge the Parties to the European Landscape Convention, and other States which so wish:

1. To systematically integrate the landscape dimension into policies which may have a direct or indirect impact on the quality of the landscape, in accordance with the provisions of the Convention;
2. To ensure thus that the policies of spatial and town planning, policies concerning infrastructure, water management, energy, the economy and employment, as well as environmental, agricultural, social, health, cultural and tourism policies, take into consideration the values and functions of the landscape;
3. To consider that integration concerns both the administrative bodies and departments on the same level (horizontal integration) and those belonging to different levels (vertical integration), in accordance with the provisions of the Recommendation No R (2008) 3.

The participants express the wish that, on the occasion of the 4th International Landscape Day of the Council of Europe, the Lausanne Declaration on "*The integration of landscape in sectoral policies*" be brought to the attention of the stakeholders of the landscape, as a contribution to the implementation of the United Nations General Assembly's 2030 Agenda for Sustainable Development.
