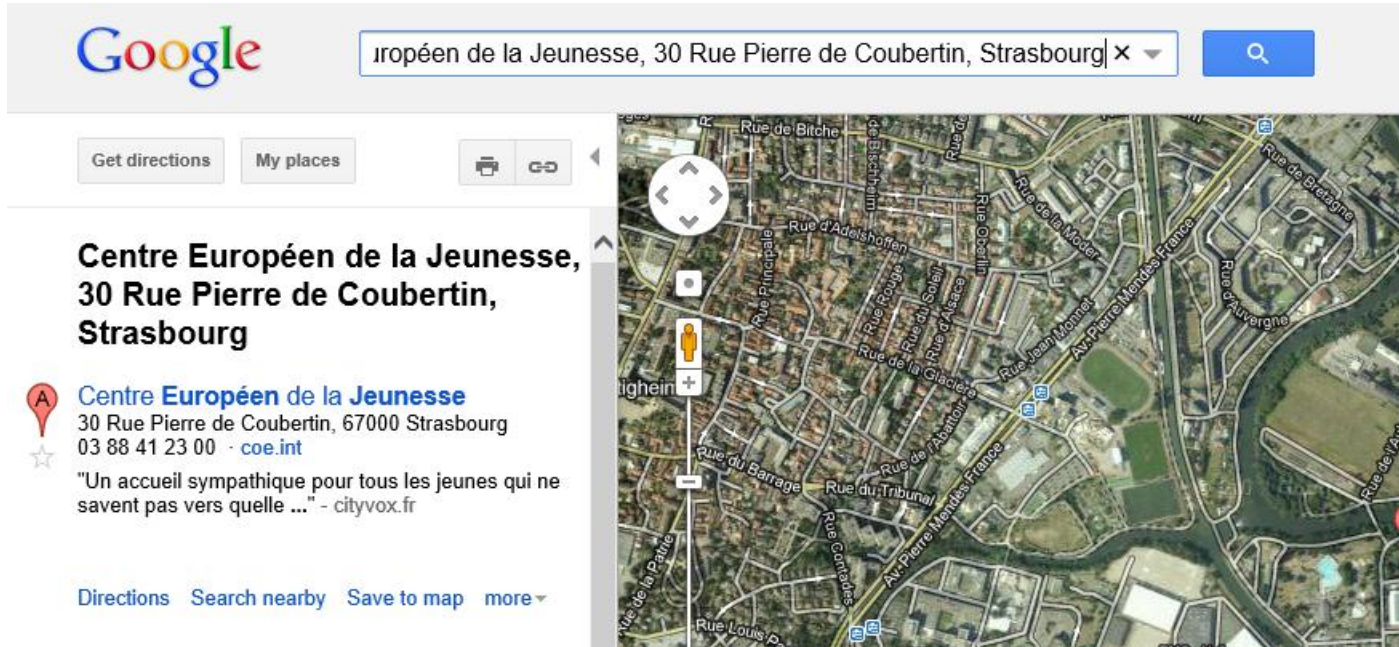
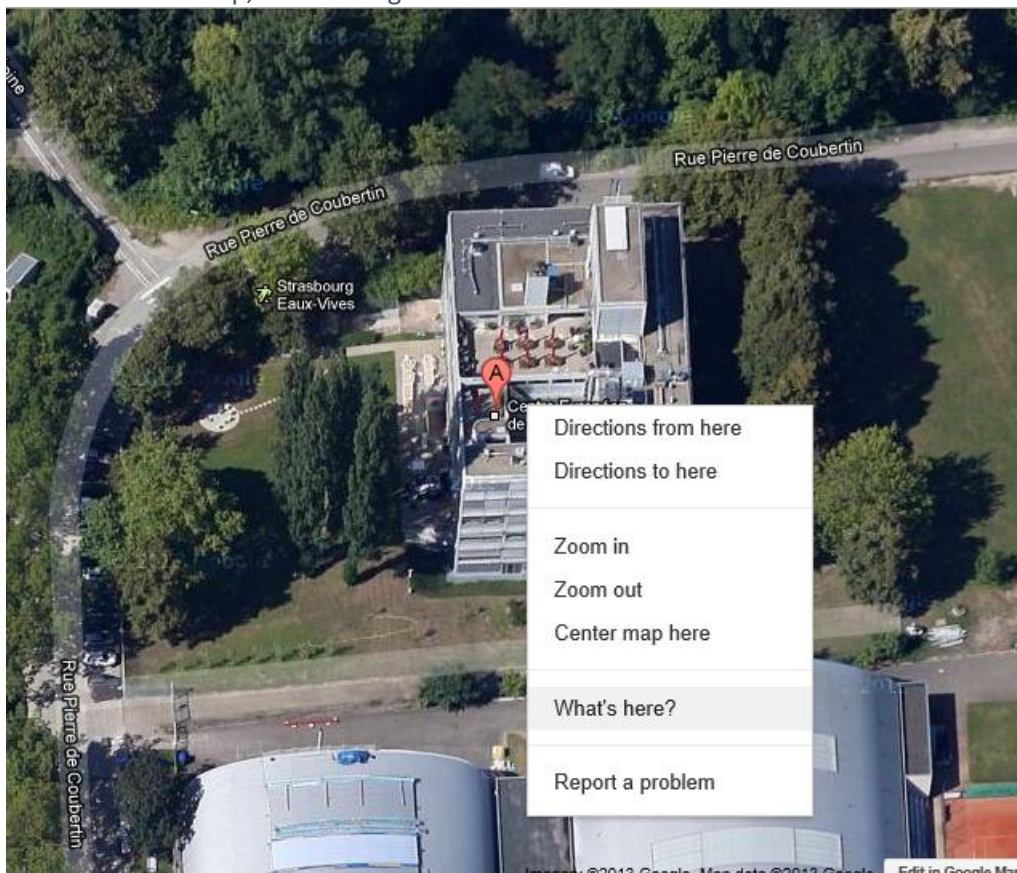


How to find your GPS location

- Go to Google Maps
 - <http://maps.google.fr> (for example)
- Indicate the name and address of the NGO



- Zoom in on the map, and do a right click where the NGO is situated



- Click on What's here?
- In the Google search bar, the GPS co-ordinates will appear.
