- 2 How many member states does the Council of Europe have? > 47 ✕
- 3 Why was the Council of Europe set up? > To safeguard peace, defend **HUMAN RIGHTS**, democracy and the rule of law.
- 4 How does the annual budget of the Council of Europe compare to that of the European Union? > The European Union spends in less than one day what the Council of Europe spends in one year.
- 5 What text does the European **COURT OF HUMAN RIGHTS** of the Council of Europe base its decisions on? > The European Convention on Human Rights.
- 6 What is 'co-management' in the Council of Europe's youth sector? > Representatives of youth organisations and of **GOVERNMENTS** taking decisions together.
- 7 What can you get from the Council of Europe's youth sector? > **TRAINING**, publications, funding possibilities, information about youth policy and much more.
- 8 Where are the 2 Council of Europe buildings where young people get support for European youth activities? > The **EUROPEAN YOUTH CENTRES** are in Strasbourg and Budapest.
- 9 Name at least 3 **PUBLICATIONS** of the Council of Europe's youth sector. > "Have your say"; "Gender matters"; "Compass"; "T-kits"; "Cookbook"; "Educational Pack: all different – all equal".

- 11 What is the role of the European Youth Foundation? > To give financial and educational **SUPPORT** to youth activities in Europe.
- 12 Your project fits into a Council of Europe priority: is that enough to get EYF funding? > No, it's not enough. A project should answer real needs, be coherent and provide concrete results.

- 13 An ideal project for the EYF contains an active step-by-step learning process and... > ...it empowers **PARTICIPANTS** to become active citizens.
- 14 What kind of project does the EYF typically not finance? > Sports tournaments, language courses, sightseeing, school trips, scholarships, purchase of equipment or buildings, etc.
- 15 What are the basic questions to answer when developing a coherent youth project? > Why? Who? What? For Whom? How? What for?
- 16 Why must you present a clear and detailed financial report? > Because you are responsible for explaining how you spend **PUBLIC MONEY**.
- 17 Why does the EYF ask for a detailed activity report? > Because reporting is part of the **PROJECT** and the EYF needs to know exactly what happened.
- 18 What is the biggest mistake youth organisations can make when reporting on their activities? > Copy/paste, make no effort to be self-critical and to learn from experiences.
