## **Cybercrime Convention Committee (T-CY)**

**10th Plenary**

**Strasbourg, 2-3 December 2013**

**Abridged meeting report**

## 1 Introduction

The T-CY Committee, meeting in Strasbourg on 2 and 3 December 2013, was chaired by Markko Künnapu (Estonia). Some 90 representatives of State Parties and Observers participated.

The meeting was addressed by Jan Kleijssen, Director of Information Society and Action against Crime. It was followed by the Octopus Conference on Cooperation against Cybercrime (4 – 6 December 2013).

## 2 Decisions

The T-CY decided:

### **Agenda item 2: Status of signatures, ratifications, accessions to the Budapest Convention and its Protocol**

- To note with appreciation the accession by Mauritius to the Convention on Cybercrime;
- To take note of steps underway in view of ratification or accession to the Convention or its Protocol in Andorra, Argentina, Colombia, Czech Republic, Luxembourg, Mexico, Monaco, Morocco, Panama, Philippines, Senegal, Slovakia, Spain, South Africa, Sweden and Turkey;
- To encourage States that have signed or been invited to accede to become Parties as soon as possible;

### **Agenda item 3: Information provided by parties and observers – Tour de table**

- To note with interest information provided on legislative developments, training or major cases by Armenia, Belgium, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Czech Republic, Croatia, the Dominican Republic, Finland, Georgia, Japan, Malaysia, Moldova, Montenegro, Russian Federation, Serbia, Singapore, Slovakia, Slovenia, Spain, “The former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia”, Turkey, USA;
- To invite States to share laws, training and other materials with the Secretariat in view of sharing these with parties and observers;

### **Agenda item 4: Dialogue with international organisations (T-CY observers)**

- To welcome the information shared by the African Union Commission, the European Union, the International Telecommunication Union, the Organisation of American States and ENISA;
- To invite international organisation to continue their efforts to coordinate their activities with each other;

- To present the consolidated draft report for consideration and adoption at the 11<sup>th</sup> Plenary;

  - to continue the dialogue with relevant stakeholders;
  - to take into account the results of the current round of T-CY assessments;
  - on this basis to submit a report with proposals to the 12<sup>th</sup> Plenary for consideration;
- pending consideration of this report to put on hold the decision taken at the 9<sup>th</sup> Plenary regarding the preparation of a Protocol to the Convention;

- To take note of the progress made in the preparation of the Guidance Note on Subscriber Information for an IP address in a Specific Communication (document T-CY (2013) 26);
- To invite Parties and Observers to provide additional information on the concept of IP addresses as subscriber information as opposed to traffic data in their domestic law and practice, and to request the T-CY Bureau to prepare a brief questionnaire to this effect;
- To request the Bureau to submit an updated version of the Guidance Note for consideration to the 11<sup>th</sup> Plenary;
