### Definition, scope and sources

#### **Broad educational concept:**

Refers to the aspects of school education intended to prepare students to **become active citizens**, by ensuring that they have the necessary **knowledge**, **skills** and **attitudes** to contribute to the development and well-being of the society in which they live.

### Scope:

- Reference year of 2010/11
- Primary and secondary levels of education

- Eurydice questionnaire on national policies and initiatives
- ICCS 2009 data

## 1. Approaches to delivering citizenship education


- Feature in all countries curricula
- Three main curricular approaches, often combined:

**Separate subjects** 

**Integrated in other subjects** 

**Cross-curricular** 








## Student participation to school governance: Official regulations

- <u>All</u> European countries have introduced regulations establishing the right for **students** to participate in school life and decision-making
- Three main arrangements for student participation in school life: the election of class representatives; the election of students councils; and student participation in school governing bodies.
- More often consultative than informative or decisionmaking roles
- National training programmes in a dozen countries








## To sum up

- Need for further reflecting reforms to central level curricula into teacher education
- Student participation in school governance is widely promoted through regulations, less often through training programmes
- Assessment in citizenship still poses challenges
