Background

The overall objective of the joint European Union/Council of Europe Project on Cybercrime in Georgia is to contribute to the security and confidence in information and communication technologies in Georgia by helping the authorities develop a consistent policy on cybercrime.

Within the 9 months since the Project started several activities have been carried out focusing on the reviewing of the legislation on cybercrime and data protection in view of implementing the Convention on Cybercrime (ETS 185) and other international standards and establishing a high tech crime unit at the police level.

Benefiting from the strong commitment of the Ministry of Justice and the Ministry of Internal Affairs representatives, the implementation of the Project was excellent and all the objectives proposed for this period were achieved.

As a result draft amendments on cybercrime legislation and data protection were prepared in order to fill the existent gaps and harmonise the legislation with the international standards and a high tech crime unit is in the process of being established to investigate cybercrime and deal with digital evidence.

Objective

The aim of the conference is to present the progress made by Georgia in fighting cybercrime and further steps to be taken in view of implementing international standards on cybercrime and data protection as well as increasing the capability of Georgia to investigate cybercrime, collect and secure digital evidence.
