Activity outline

Background

The European Union/Council of Europe Joint Project CyberCrime@IPA (Regional Cooperation in Criminal Justice: Strengthening capacities in the fight against cybercrime) is aimed at strengthening the capacities of criminal justice authorities of Western Balkans and Turkey to cooperate effectively against cybercrime.

The CyberCrime@IPA project started on 1 November 2010 and covers the following countries and areas: Albania, Bosnia and Herzegovina, Croatia, Montenegro, Serbia, "the former Yugoslav Republic of Macedonia", Turkey and Kosovo¹. The project comprises eight expected results.

Expected Result 5 is related to judicial training:

Judicial training on cybercrime and electronic evidence integrated into the curricula of training institutions for judges and prosecutors

Under this result the project will support the judicial training institutions in their efforts to provide appropriate initial and in-service training on cybercrime and electronic evidence for judges and prosecutors.

To date the project has provided a training of trainers (ToT) course and furthermore has organized eight in-country trainings for judges and prosecutors. These in-country training were used as a test for the capabilities of the local trainers (participants in the ToT) as well as for a pilot run of the basic module for judicial training. Following the in-country trainings it was decided that the basic module needs to be further enhanced.

Following the updates of the basic module the project is organizing a two day workshop to discuss the contents of the updated module and thus to finalise the basic module. Once finalised and adopted by the local trainers and the working group on judicial training, this module will be translated and provided to the judicial training institutions for inclusion in the initial and in-service training curricula of these institutions.

The representatives of the Judicial Training Institutions in this event will present on the modalities and the timeframes for the inclusion of the module in the curricula of the training institutions

Objective

The workshop is aimed at the following:

- Discuss the content of the basic training module
- Based on the input from the project area finalise the basic module on judicial training.
- Discuss the modalities for inclusion of the basic module for judicial training in the curricula of the training institutions

Participants

From each project area - with the exception of the host country four participants will be funded from the project budget:

- Two participants in the Training of Trainers event
- Members of the working group on training materials

The working languages of the Workshop will be English and Croatian.
