**MEETING REPORT** 

## **Item 1:** Opening of the meeting, adoption of the agenda and order of business

1. Drafting Group E on the reform of the Court (GT-GDR-E) held its 2<sup>nd</sup> meeting in Strasbourg from 17-19 September 2013 with Mr Morten RUUD (Norway) in the chair. The list of participants appears at <u>Appendix I</u>. The agenda, as adopted, appears at <u>Appendix II</u>.

# **Item 2:** Whether more effective measures are needed in respect of States that fail to implement Court judgments in a timely manner

- 2. Ms Denise RENGER (Germany), rapporteur, presented the draft report on whether more effective measures are needed in respect of States that fail to implement Court judgments in a timely manner. The Group examined and adopted the CDDH draft report as it appears at Addendum I, with a view to its transmission to the DH-GDR for examination at its next meeting (29-31 October 2013). The Group thanked Ms Renger for her contribution to its work.
- 3. In the course of its discussions, the Group decided to record the following points in the Meeting Report:
  - It would be useful to have statistics on the average time taken to close the different types of case, as distinguished since the introduction of new Committee of Ministers working methods in 2011, namely those under 'enhanced' and 'standard' supervision.
  - It was noted that not all pending cases involved delay in execution, and that some may even have had all necessary measures implemented.
  - Concerning the 'origins of the problem', one expert proposed an additional cause of failure to execute judgments in a timely manner, namely "objective impossibility for the State Party to implement a particular judgment"; this proposal did not receive support.
  - In relation to the proposal that the Committee of Ministers work in smaller groups, it was noted that this may increase the workload of the Department for the Execution of Judgments, whose capacity may as a consequence need to be strengthened.
  - It was important that the participants in Committee of Ministers' meetings devoted to supervision of execution of judgments have the necessary legal and/ or technical competence. This would be reinforced were a member State's Government Agent before the Court or other relevant expert to be part of the national delegation.

# Item 3: Review of the functioning of the Advisory Panel of experts on candidates for election as judge to the European Court of Human Rights

- 4. Mr Martin KUIJER (The Netherlands), rapporteur, presented the draft report on review of the functioning of the Advisory Panel of experts on candidates for election as judge to the Court. The Group examined and adopted the CDDH draft report as it appears at Addendum II, with a view to its transmission to the DH-GDR for examination at its next meeting (29-31 October 2013). The Group thanked Mr Kuijer for his contribution to its work.
- 5. In the course of its discussions, the Group decided to record the following points in the Meeting Report:

- As regards the two possible responses to perceived difficulties due to the confidentiality rules, of those experts who expressed a preference, eleven favoured an approach based on keeping the current confidentiality rules and none an approach whereby the Advisory Panel would not be bound by strict confidentiality rules.
- As regards those instances in which a State Party had transmitted its list of candidates to the Parliamentary Assembly without having received the views of the Advisory Panel, the Group expressed its interest in knowing how the Assembly had proceeded.

# **Item 4:** Whether or not to proceed to amend the Convention to enable the appointment of additional judges to the Court

6. Mr Vit SCHORM (Czech Republic), rapporteur, presented the draft report on whether or not to proceed to amend the Convention to enable the appointment of additional judges to the Court. The Group examined and adopted the CDDH draft report as it appears at Addendum III, with a view to its transmission to the DH-GDR for examination at its next meeting (29-31 October 2013). The Group thanked Mr Schorm for his contribution to its work.
