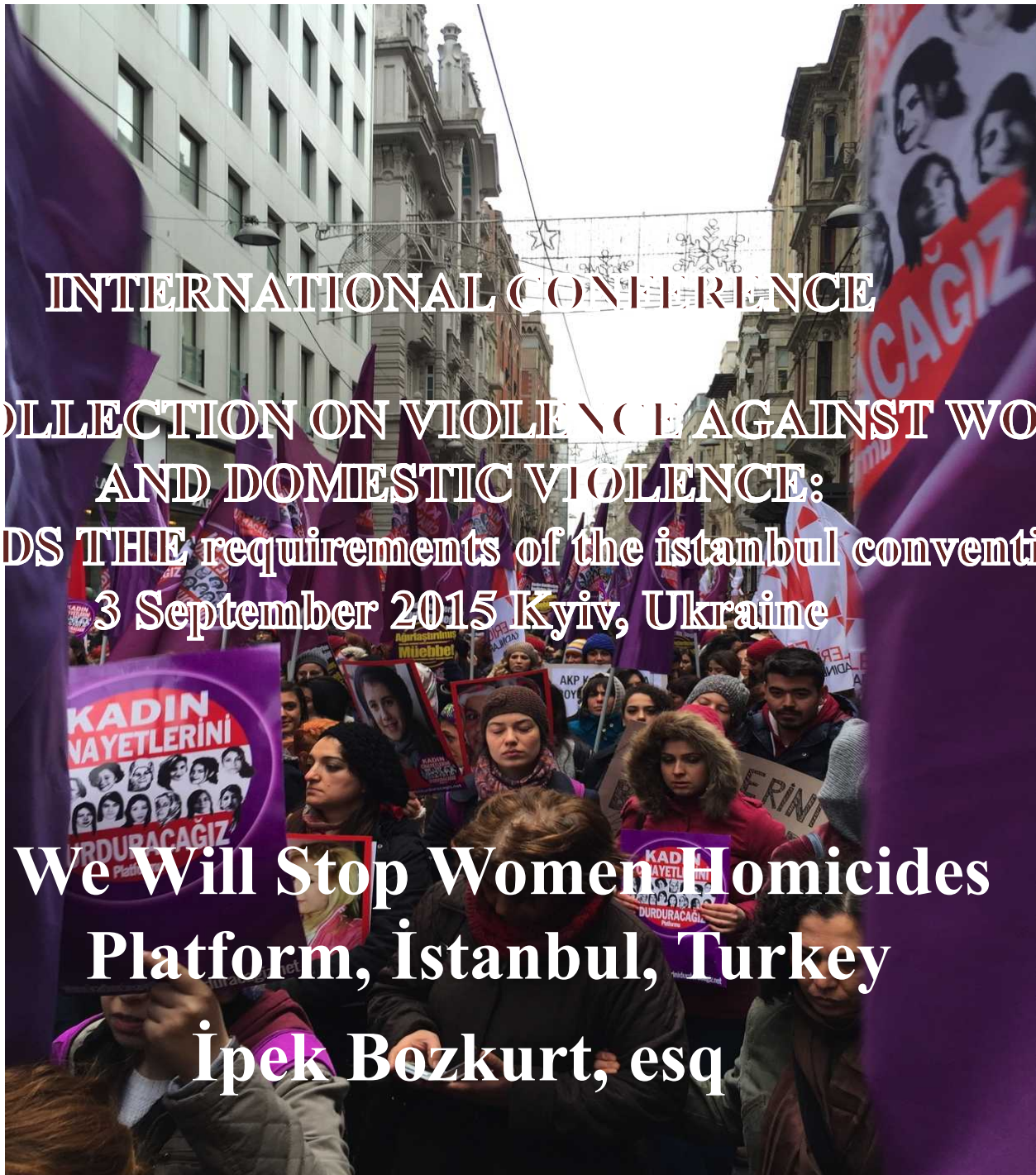

Raison d'etre of the Platform

- In 2010, Ministry of Justice officially announced that women homicides increased by 1400 % from 2002 to 2009
- Monstrous murder of Münevver KARABULUT by her boyfriend the same year
- “Right to life”

Raison d'être of the Platform

- Co-operates/supports with the families of women who have been murdered or subject to gender-based or domestic violence
- Organizes country wide street rallies and protests
- Lobbying activities at the Parliament for the rectification of Criminal Law parallel to the standards of Istanbul Convention
- Ensures immediate access to legal remedies
- Provides legal counselling at gender-based homicide cases (*pending 35 cases in different cities*)
- Collects data and prepares periodical reports on findings



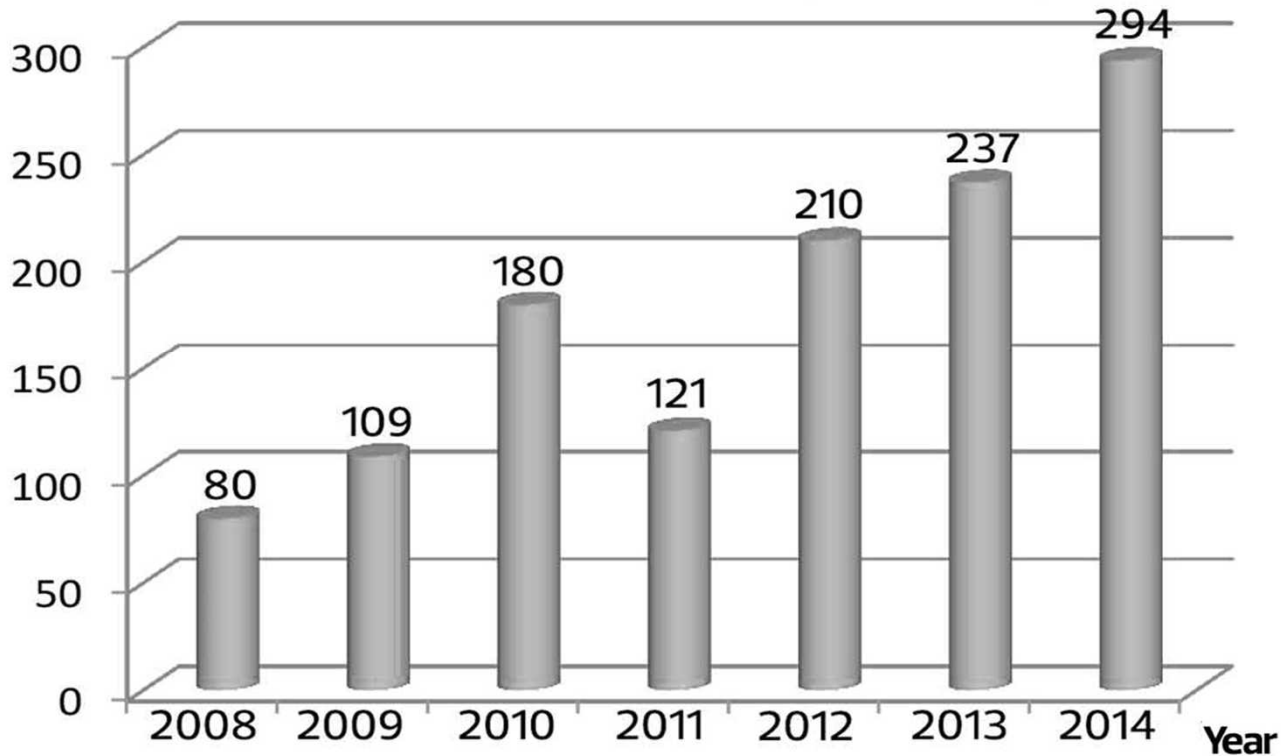
Turkish Legal Framework on Preventing and Combatting Violence Against Women and Domestic Violence

- Turkey is the first country to sign the Istanbul Convention but the Convention only entered into force in August 2014
- Law No 6284 on Protection of Family and Prevention of Violence Against Women
- Implementation Regulation of Law No 6284
- Criminal Law No 5237 (*standard homicide provisions, no reference to gender based violence*)
- European Convention on Human Rights and European Court of Human Rights case-law
- Ministry of Family and Social Works (*before its amendment in 2011, Ministry was formerly named as Ministry Responsible for Women and Family*)
- Advisory Committee on Evaluating Reasons for Violence Against Women that will provide Report on Measures to be taken



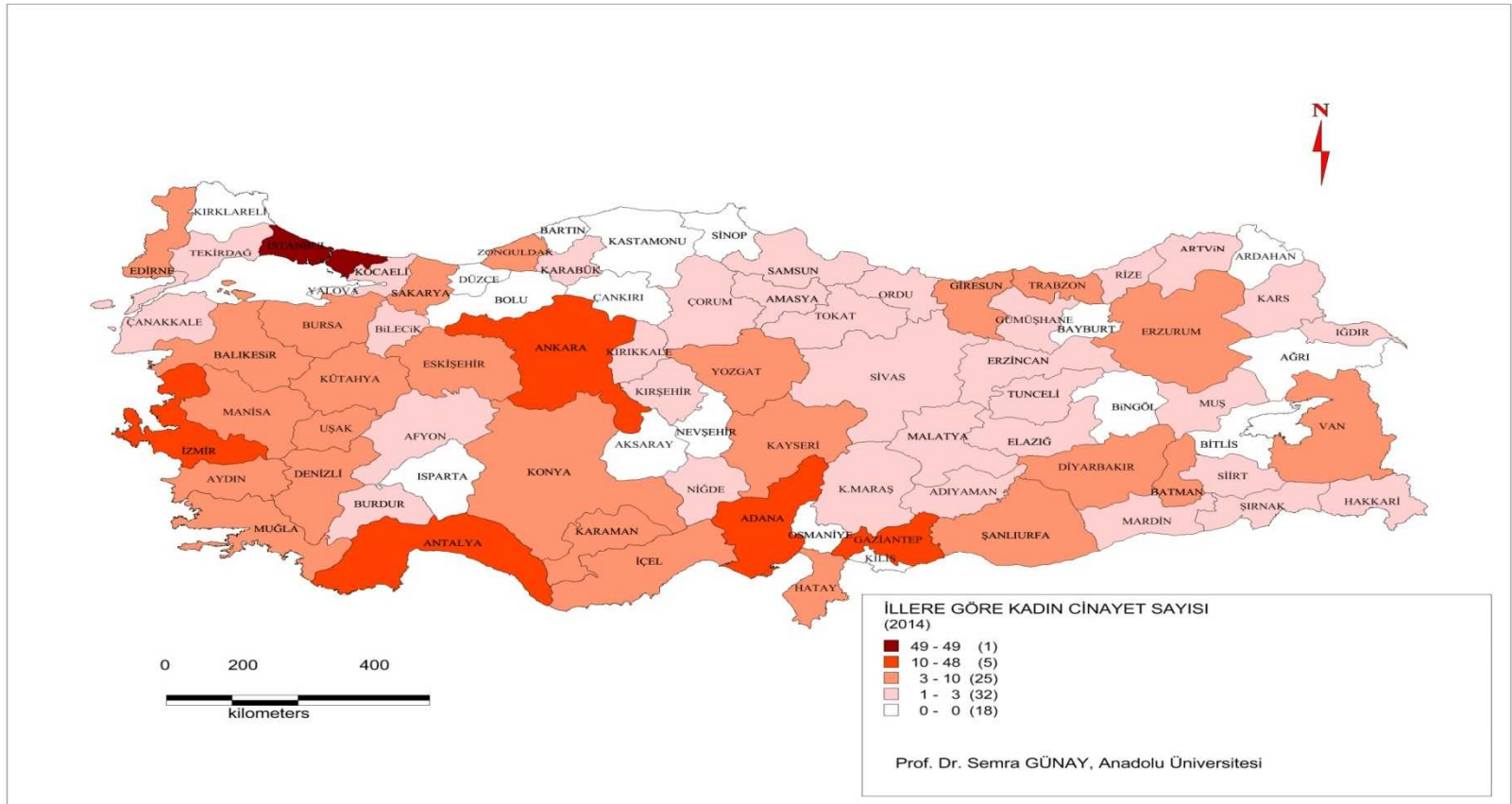
Gender-Based Women Homicide Figures (2008-2014)

The number of femicide





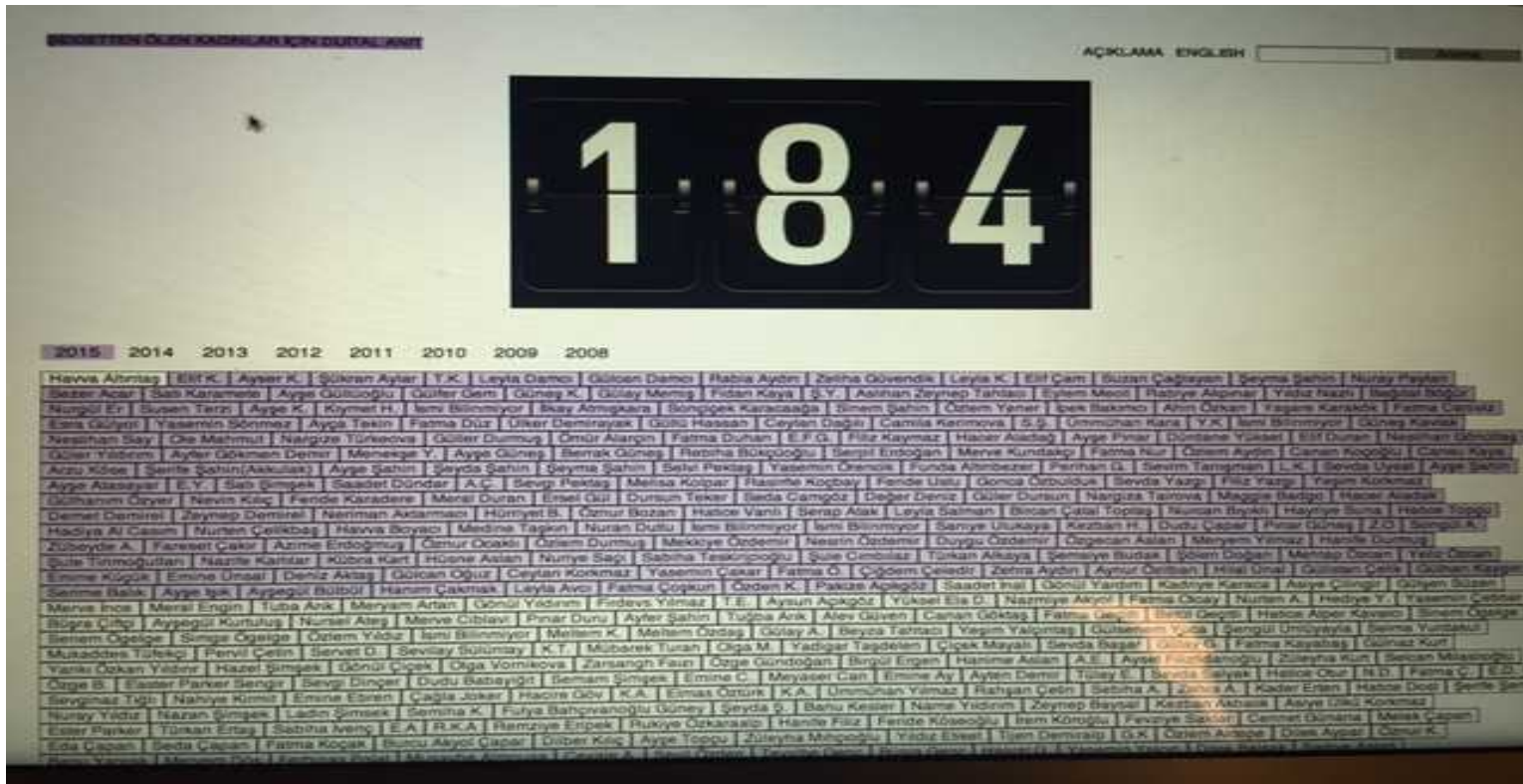
Overview of Dispersal of Gender-Based Women Homicides in 2014

Platform's Assessment of Gender-Based and Domestic Violence

PREVENTION

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PROTECTION

- Insufficient implementation of Law No 6284 and Regulation
- Limited awareness of Istanbul Convention
- Reluctance of police officers' to carry out protection measures
- Delays in the legal system to issue necessary protection orders



Platform's Assessment of Gender-Based and Domestic Violence

PROSECUTION

- Lack of accountability: No policy to find responsible officials who fail to carry out their protection duty
- Attrition throughout investigation and litigation phases: Discrimination against women during criminal cases
- Legal system protects perpetrators through insufficient investigation process and sentence reductions (*ECHR case-law Opuz v. Turkey and Durmaz v. Turkey*)
- Sentence reductions pave way to prospective gender based violence



Platform's Assessment of Gender-Based and Domestic Violence

POLICY

- The Government prefers to ignore existence of gender-based violence
- Requests for data (as per applicable law enabling such requests) about gender-based violence is futile. The answer: *“There is no such concept under our laws to prepare such data”*
- Reminders to Ministry regarding Article 11 of Istanbul Convention
- Resistance to NGO involvement despite Articles 7, 9 and 13 of Istanbul Convention



Platform's Assessment of Gender-Based and Domestic Violence

POLICY

/Data

Collection

- Alternative methods of data collection:
 - (i) Nationwide network of volunteers,
 - (ii) Co-operation with local press,
 - (iii) Uninterrupted contact with families,
 - (iv) Periodical update on collected data and interpretation of data
