Expected results:

- 1.1 A collection of computer data:
 - on good practices in formal and non-formal intercultural educational;
 - on present difficulties experienced by young people from ethnic minorities, mainly Roma.

From this data, analysis and innovative proposals for the forthcoming years.

2.1 A vade mecum / handbook common to the different working groups of the Education and Culture Committee will be drawn up for political decision makers, those in charge in the world of education and culture, the INGOs, educationists and educators.

With regard to working group "educate to intercultural dialogue/living together in Europe", the vade mecum will present:

- a set of recommendations /advice and references for innovating actions dealing with:
 - * intercultural, formal and non-formal education
 - * the development of an inclusive pedagogy for young people in Europe
- 2.2 An event will be organized on the basis of the results of the working groups of the Education and Culture Committee.

Dissemination of the results:

The results will be circulated:

- to the INGOs of the Conference via the computer platform and the different media created by the Education and Culture Committee. Each INGO will be responsible for circulating the results among its own network:
- to the Ministres of Education of the 47 member states of the Council of Europe;
- to universities and colleges training teachers and educational officials.

The results will be presented to delegates of the Committee of Ministers, of the Parliamentary Assembly, of the Congress of Local and Regional Authorities, of the European Court, then put forward for circulation on their respective websites.

Likewise, they will be submitted with the results of the other committees to the general secretariat of the Council of Europe. Authorities such as UNESCO, United Nations (Geneva), will also be informed.

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
