

Mr Ryszard Piotrowicz is a British Citizen. He has been Professor of Law at Aberystwyth University in Wales since 1999; he previously taught at the Universities of Glasgow, Durham and Tasmania. He studied international law in Scotland, Poland, Germany and Greece and holds a Ph.D in international law. He is an Alexander-von-Humboldt Fellow.

Mr Piotrowicz specialises in migration law and humanitarian law, in particular trafficking in human beings, and has published extensively on the legal aspects of trafficking in human beings. He was a member of the European Commission's Group of Experts on Trafficking in Human Beings from 2008-15 and has worked as a consultant on legal aspects of trafficking for the Council of Europe, European Commission, European Parliament, the Organization for Security and Cooperation in Europe, IOM and UNHCR, as well as national governments.

Mr Piotrowicz has run training programmes on human trafficking for legal and other professionals in many countries, and has taught courses on migration law, including human trafficking, throughout Europe and Australia. Mr Piotrowicz took part in the UNHCR's Global Consultations on the Refugees Convention, as a nominee of the Australian Government. He is the Book Reviews Editor for the *International Journal of Refugee Law* and a member of the Editorial Board of the *Journal of Trafficking and Human Exploitation*, as well as Co-Editor and Co-Author of the *Routledge Handbook of Trafficking in Human Beings* (2018). He was elected second Vice-President of GRETA in 2017.
