Mr. Jan Van Dijk, is a Dutch national. He has a doctorate in law/criminology. He acted as director of research at the Dutch Ministry of Justice for many years. He is currently professor of victimology and human security at INTERVICT, University of Tilburg, The Netherlands, where holds the Pieter van Vollenhoven chair.

Mr. Van Dijk is an expert on international criminal justice with a focus on victims' rights. He served as director of the international centre of crime prevention at the United Nations Office on Drugs and Crime in Vienna (1998-2001). In this capacity he was closely involved in the drafting of the UN protocol against human trafficking and the collection of the first global statistics on human trafficking. He has acted as consultant for the European Commission on the development of EU wide statistics on human trafficking and on the preparation of the EU Safety Survey (SASU). His latest books include *The World of Crime: breaking the silence on problems of security, justice and development across the world* (SAGE, 2008), and *New Faces of Victimhood: globalization, transnational crime and victims' rights* (Global Justice Series, Springer, 2011).
