## Preface

Welcome to this High Level Global Conference “Towards childhoods free from corporal punishment!”, hosted in Vienna by the Government of Austria.

This year marks the 10<sup>th</sup> anniversary of the presentation of the report of the UN Study on Violence against Children to the General Assembly in 2006. At that time only 16 states had laws clearly prohibiting all corporal punishment of children. Today, this number has tripled: now 48 states – many of them represented at this High Level Global Conference – have reformed their laws to protect children from being hit and hurt by parents and others entrusted with their upbringing. We have much to celebrate!

But the purpose of this gathering is not solely celebration – it is also to build momentum for further reform. The journey to universal prohibition of corporal punishment – to ensuring that all children, no matter where they live, fully enjoy their fundamental right to respect for their physical integrity and human dignity – has in many ways barely begun.

Still only 10 % of the children globally live in states where the law says it is wrong for them to be violently punished in the guise of discipline; 150 states have yet to meet their obligations under the Convention on the Rights of the Child and other international human rights treaties to prohibit corporal punishment, including in the family home. The number of

states where governments are openly committed to prohibiting corporal punishment is growing rapidly – now at least 53 have done so and representatives from many of these are participating in Vienna.

This High Level Global Conference – following on from the inaugural conference hosted by the Government of Sweden in 2014 – aims to inspire all of us to work together to build a world where respect for children’s human dignity is the norm rather than the exception.
