



# Project on Ethics for the Prevention of Corruption in Turkey (TYEC)

## **Seventh Quarterly Progress Report**

## 1. BACKGROUND INFORMATION

TYEC – "Ethics for the Prevention of Corruption in Turkey" - started on 1 December 2007. This progress report provides an overview over the project activities that took place between 1<sup>st</sup> December 2008 and 28 February 2009.

## **1.1** Beneficiary Country and Institution(s)

The beneficiary country is Turkey.

The primary beneficiary institution of the project is the Council of Ethics for Public Service.

## 1.2 Contracting Authority

The Central Finance and Contracts Unit (CFCU).

## **1.3** Implementing Organization

The Council of Europe is responsible for the implementation of the project and the use of the project funds from the European Commission. Within the General Secretariat of the Council of Europe in Strasbourg, the Economic Crime Division (Directorate of Human Rights and Legal Affairs) is responsible for the overall administrative project management and supervision.

## 1.4 Project Objective

The overall objective of TYEC is to contribute to the prevention of corruption in Turkey in accordance with European and other international standards through the implementation and extension of the code of conduct, and the development of anti-corruption measures. The current Workplan is included in Annex 1 and progress is marked on the Calendar of Activities in Annex 2.

## 2. SEVEN QUARTER: PLANNED ACTIVITIES FOR PERIOD SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER 2009

Output 1:	The staff of the Council of Ethics are trained and have the necessary working tools and procedures to better exercise their mandate
Activity 1.4	Study visits of members and the staff of the Ethics Council to study the experience of similar bodies in other European Union countries

The second study visit will take place at the end of September. This will complete Output 1.

Output 3:	At least $110^*$ trainers have been trained and are able to deliver ethics training
Activity 3.2	Train the trainers in the application of the training package of the "Code of Ethics"

The final 25 ethics trainers will be trained in September and October 2009. This will complete Output 3.

Output 4:	The governors, deputy governors, district governors and members of Ethics Commissions of the 81 provinces have been trained in the application of the code of ethics for public officials
Activity 4.1	Organise up to 10 training events for governors, deputy governors, and district governors, on the application of the Code of Ethics and implementation aspects of complaining procedures.
Activity 4.2	Organise up to 15 training events for members of Ethics Commissions in <u>provinces</u> and <u>municipalities</u> on the application of the Code of Ethics and implementation aspects of complaining procedures

The proposed timetable is as follows:

Activity 4.1 and 4.2 will be delivered together (ie, 2x2-day training events in the same week) to maximise use of trainers, logistics, etc. They will take place in September and October 2009. This will complete Output 4.

## 3. SEVENTH QUARTER: ACTUAL ACTIVITIES FOR PERIOD SEPTEMBER-NOVEMBER 2009

Output 1:	The staff of the Council of Ethics are trained and have the necessary working tools and procedures to better exercise their mandate
	Study visits of members and the staff of the Ethics Council to study the experience of similar bodies in other European Union countries

Following the first study visit to Ireland to look at investigative approaches to ethics breaches, the purpose of the second study tour was to focus more on prevention, the ethical environment and the possible roles of Ethics Commissions within ministries and other public organisations. The Dutch National Integrity Office (NIO), an agency of the Ministry for the Interior and Kingdom Relations, which coordinates and promotes integrity for the public sector in the Netherlands, was identified as a relevant institution in this context. The NIO was set up to help government organisations improve integrity policies. The main aim of the NIO Office is to improve the learning skills of organisations so as to enable them to shape their own ethics and integrity policies. To do this, the NIO fulfils three tasks: the promotion and support of ethics and integrity policies; the collection, dissemination and exchange of knowledge; and the development of integrity instruments.

There were two specific initiatives of interest for the Council of Ethics for Public Service. First the NIO had developed the Integrity Infrastructure. The second was the development with the Ministry of the Interior and Kingdom Relations, the Integrity Office of the Municipality of Amsterdam, and the Netherlands Court of Audit, a new self-assessment instrument for integrity (SAINT). The NIO manages the instrument, which is intended for all public sector organisations in the Netherlands. Overall, the NIO offered a focus on prevention, and the development of an ethical environment, and; a focus on supervision and monitoring, supporting and developing the ethics work by other organisations through an organisation that works at national and local level and has developed appropriate means to do this.

In this second study visit, the development of the public ethics in the Netherlands is evaluated in terms of the focus on the public official and the role of the range of agencies with responsibility for ethics issues. In addition the role of the Audit and the Ombudsman, the coordinating role of the NIO, as a small institution, with the Ministries and other public institutions, the use of dilemma training and how ministries and municipalities received the formation of the ethical environment in practice have been evaluated. Overall, the study visit especially highlighted how to develop the relations between Council of Ethics for Public Service and Commissions of Ethics.

The study visit was carried out between 28 September and 2 October 2009 (Annex 3 - study visit agenda).

This completed Output 1.

Following requests from ministries, the proposal that the original 25 trainers be trained in training trainers was replaced by one further training programme with 25 new trainers and was carried out as follows:

The second six research studies were submitted, reviewed, edited and resubmitted between July and October 2009 as follows:

Public Bidding and Ethic- Assoc. Prof. Arif Köktaş Ethics and Customs Services- Assoc. Prof. Dr. Hamza Ateş The Ethical Approaches, Codes of Conduct, Implementations and Internalization Level of the Public Professional Associations in Turkey - Assoc. Prof. Dr. Refika Bakoğlu Deliorman

The Shadow Economy - Prof. Dr. Coşkun Can Aktan Ethical Conduct in Health Services - Prof. Dr. Haydar Sur Ethics, Culture and Society - Prof. Dr. Kemal Görmez

On 8 October 2009 a second seminar/workshop was held to discuss the findings from the second 6 research studies. (Annex 4 - seminar/workshop agenda) Again, the practitioner findings of the research were discussed in detail, with a number making relevant proposals for reform, including the role of the Council of Ethics for Public service, and with a number of studies noting the importance of ensuring ethics is addressed from an early age, with family and education playing a significant role in setting the standards.

This completed Output 6.

Drawing on the results of the report on system studies submitted under Activity 8.1, under Activity 8. 2 and 8.3 new proposals for the development of further anti-corruption measures and strategies and the coordination of measures to promote ethics with other anti-corruption measures have been elaborated.

In November 2009, a Background Review and a Corruption report were completed. The Background Review was produced to provide the context for the Corruption report by considering various academic, practitioner and media sources, including work for this project, on corruption in Turkey before assessing past and current initiatives to address corruption. The Background Review was structured as follows:

- Corruption: Perceptions and Surveys
- Civil Society
- Academic Reviews
- External Reviews
- Turkey Anti-Corruption Initiatives

The Corruption report was intended to provide an overall picture of corruption in Turkey and make relevant proposals for the management, coordination and monitoring of anti-corruption strategies. Since the Prime Ministry Inspection Board had prepared a national strategy, the Corruption report sought to comment on and also facilitate its progress and implementation. The Corruption report covered:

- Corruption: Findings From The Background Review
- Previous And Current Anti-Corruption Initiatives: Contents And Assessment
- Setting The Context For Anti-Corruption Strategies
- Developing The Ethical Environment For Anti-Corruption Strategies
- Recommendations For Future Prevention Strategies And Improved Management, Coordination And Monitoring Of Anti-Corruption Strategies

Under Activity 8.4, the findings and recommendations of these reports were presented to the public during the closing conference of the project on 25 November 2009.

This completed Output 8.

## 5. SUMMARY and CONCLUSION

The project implementation continued to proceed toward its conclusion.

The main focus of the project – training – has been completed beyond the original proposal, with over 100 ethics trainers trained. The only slight concern has been in, in response to the regions for their own ethics trainers, the Council of Ethics for Public Service took the strategic decision to satisfy immediate demand rather than stay with the decision to train experienced ethics trainers in training others and thus support the cascade principle that was a key component of the Implementation Guide. This is a core element of the follow-up project whose main themes were outlined in the last previous quarterly reports and should be initiated as one of the first outputs of the follow-up project, so that momentum is not lost and that the expertise of the first set of trainers is further developed to facilitate the cascade work that will:

- Embed and consolidate the work from this project
- Extend the cascade training and prevention of corruption awareness
- Focus on key ministries and areas to develop ethics work.

In doing so, the pioneering work delivered as part of this project will be sustained, expanded and developed as a potentially lasting contribution to public sector ethics in Turkey.

The other key result of the project that leads into a follow-up project has been the Research Studies. A majority of these research studies provide useful and in some cases significant insights into the development of ethical cultures, both among the public and also among public officials.

Finally, as the Prime Ministry Inspection Board is shaping its national anticorruption strategy, the Systems Studies, the Background Review and the Corruption Report provide an important context within which the final Corruption report evaluates the strategy and offers the project's contribution to addressing ethics and corruption in the Turkish context.
