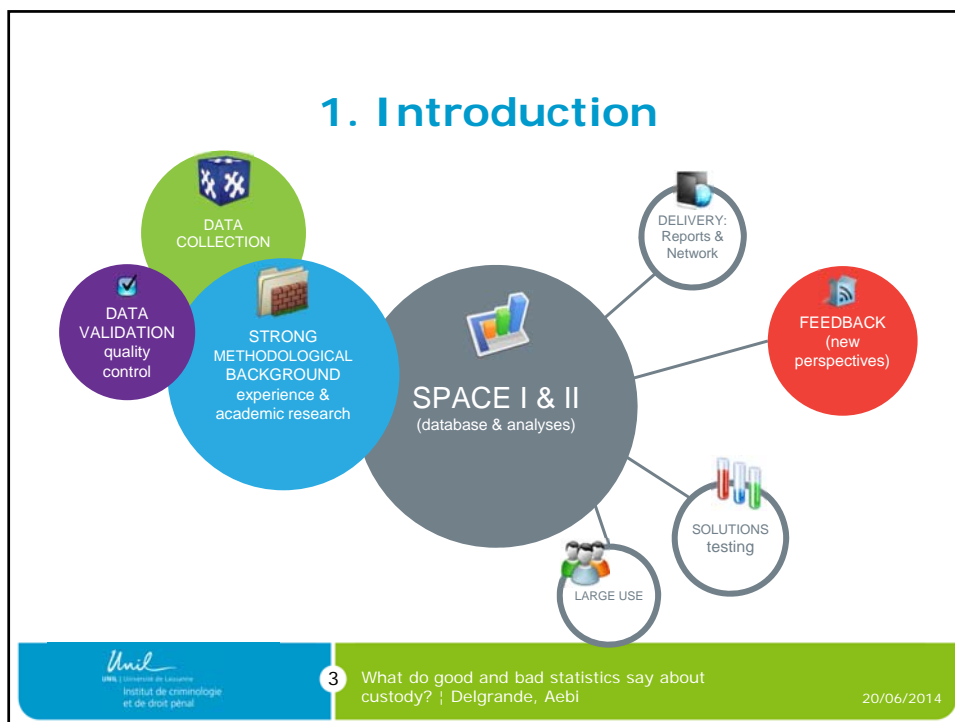

Pros & Cons unified definitions:

- **Yes:** You know exactly what to include
- **No:** You know... but if you do not have enough details to manage the inclusion or the exclusion of partial data?
- **Yes:** You may be sure to compare the comparable...
- **No:** ...It may happen that it is comparable today. But would it be in several years time?

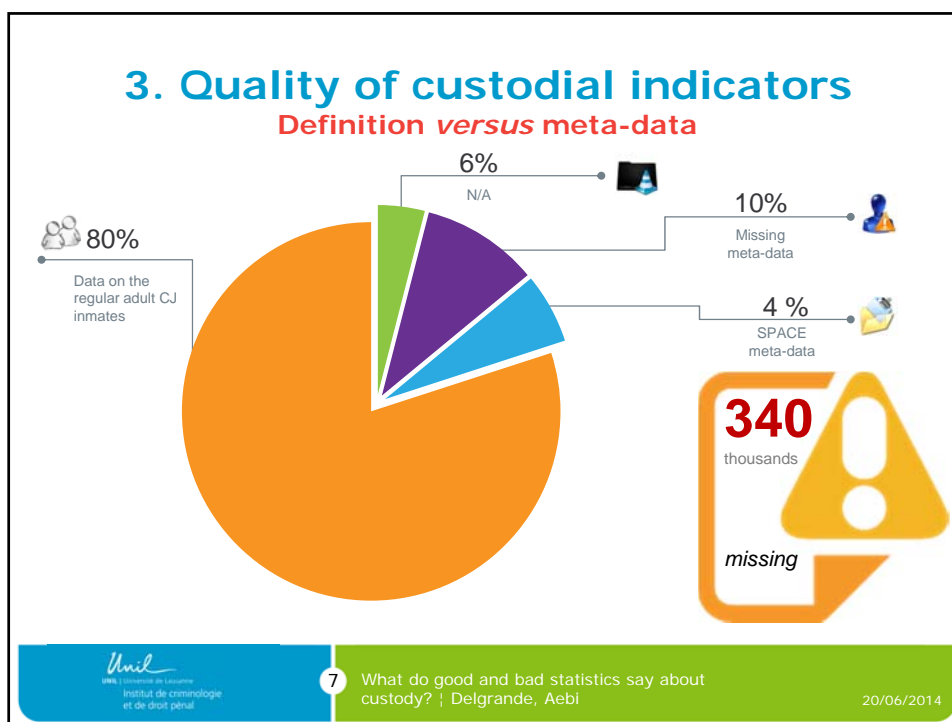
With or without definitions? (challenge for the comparisons)

The role of meta-data in the international surveys

Why to use meta-data in SPACE?

- Compare what is meant to be comparable
- Reliable **raw-data** and knowledge of the national rules
 1. Categories included/excluded in the prison population
 2. Age of criminal majority and the qualification of young adults
 3. Categories of costs included in the calculation of the expenses
 4. Breakdown of categories of staff working in penal institutions
 5. Categories of inmates per each judicial status
 6. ... 7. ...

Risk of Errors (1)

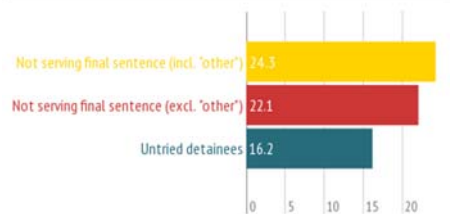
- ✓ When you make an *academic study*, you may impose the respect of the unified definitions...
- ✓ ... When you make an *international survey*, you ask for meta-data!
 - It is never enough!
 - Until where the meta-data should be enlarged?
 - Meta-data remain a raw-figure.
 - What exactly is understood by the respondents?



Risk of Errors (Example I)

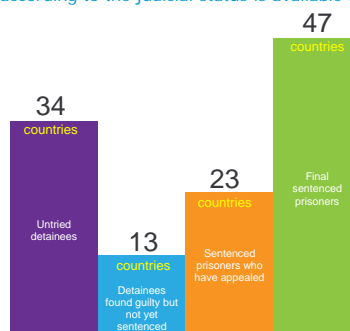
Example of the use and... of the misuse of custodial indicators...

*Median values on the basis of the calculated indicators for 47 PA

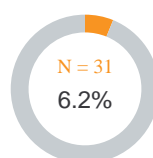
Accurate breakdown by each category in inmates according to the judicial status is available in...



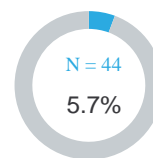
Risk of Errors (Example II)

Example of a misreading of the results:

(based on a retrieved political discourse of an official in a country with the overrepresentation of females in custody)



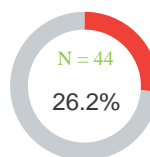
Basis: untried inmates



Basis: inmates without final sentence

% of pre-trial females:

1. Calculated on the basis of the **total number of pre-trial detainees?** ... or...
2. ... on the basis of the **total number of detainees without a final sentence?**
3. ... on the basis of the number of **female inmates?**



Basis: only female inmates

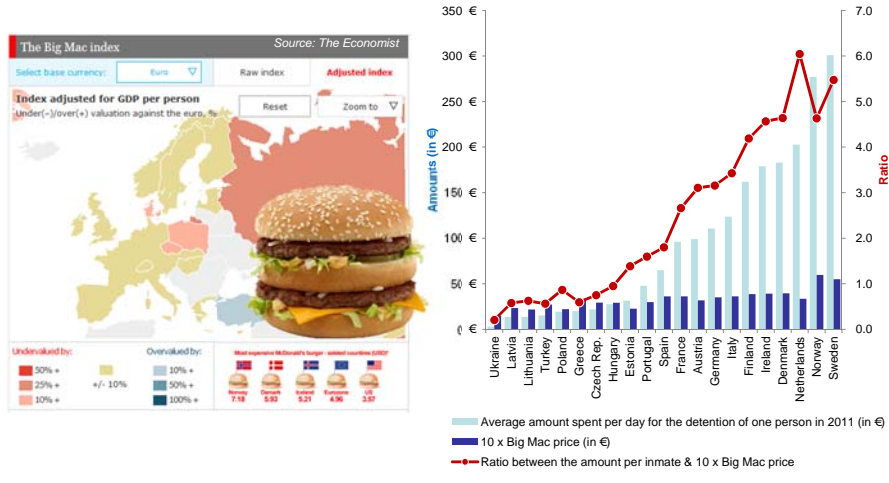

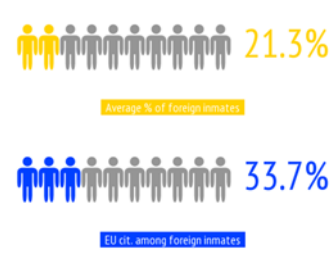

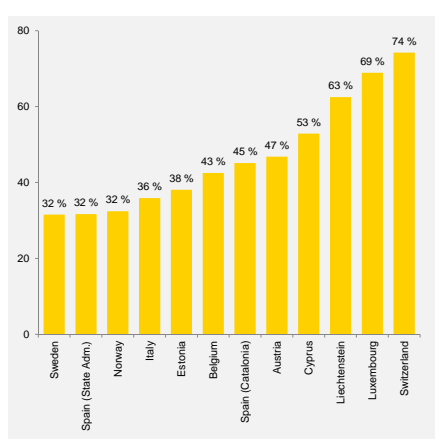
Rigour and comparability...



Goals and consistency...

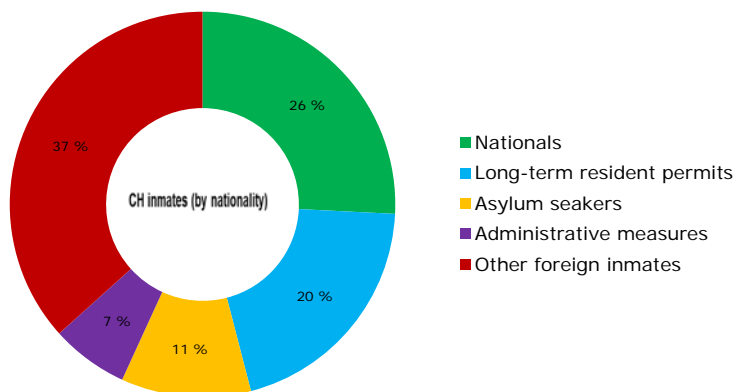


Foreigners:

Highest % of foreign inmates in the total prison population on 1st Sept. 2012

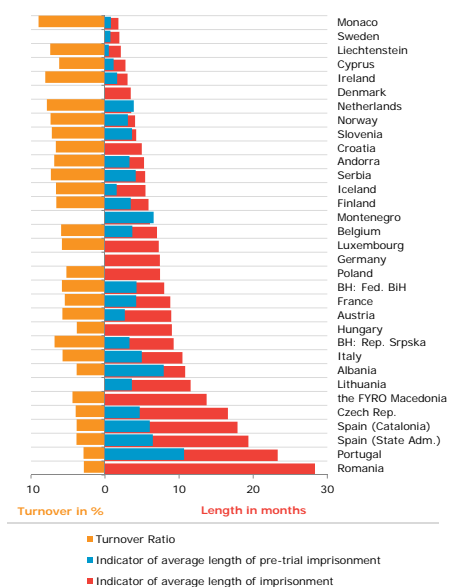
Swiss case study: Foreign inmates

- At the end, there was no need to pick up any data from other services and to adjust what is not supposed to be adjusted!

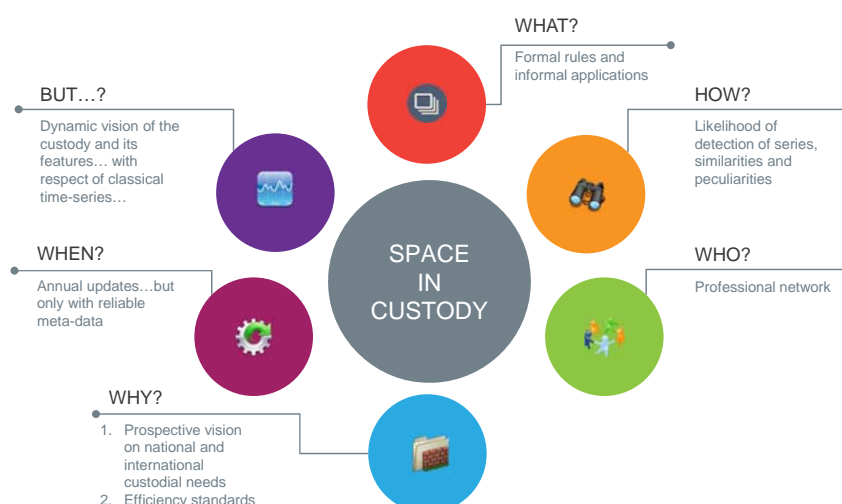
- We can do our best today, have the most adventurous and innovative ideas... yet... tomorrow these acts will be just old-fashioned tips.

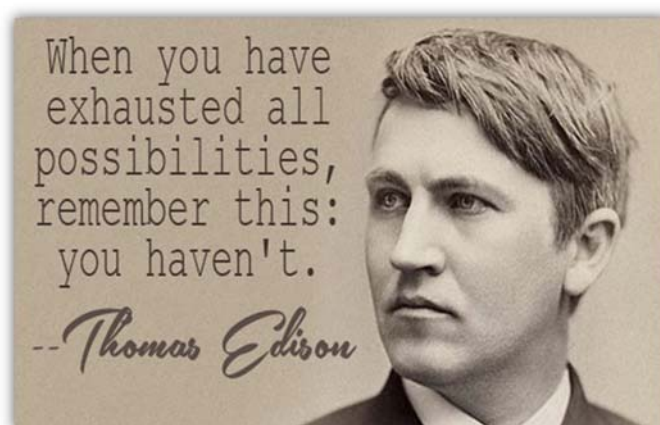
