

- Probation seen as the 'poor relation'
 - Viewed as soft, ineffective & irrelevant
- Probation budget within the Prisons vote

Insufficient regard to research evidence

Lack of Irish data and research

• Little 'joined-up' thinking or approach






THE PRESENT

- Joint research & studies






THE FUTURE




- Review of Penal Policy / White Paper on Crime
