Import model:


- Services delivered by local providers

Foreign nationals in Norwegian prisons per June 1
in percentage of total prison population





Scope

Around 1/3 of all inmates

New admissions per year doubled from 2006 (1,436) to 2011 (2,730)

53 % of preliminary custody admissions

Peak at 2,810 in 2009

From 114 different countries in 2011

Lithuania, Poland, Romania, Iraq

Different groups


- Foreign nationals to be expelled
 - transferred during sentence
 - expelled after sentence
 - non-returnable
- Foreign nationals with residence permit / work permit

Transfer during sentences

- European Convention
- Bilateral agreements
 - Latvia
 - Romania
 - Lithuania
- Not signed FD 909 (yet)




Special prison for sentenced foreign nationals
