**ABRIDGED REPORT** 

The Bureau of the Consultative Committee of the Convention for the Protection of Individuals with regard to Automatic Processing of Data ("Convention 108") held its 45<sup>th</sup> meeting in Paris from 24 to 26 September 2018 with Ms Alessandra Pierucci (Italy) in the chair. The agenda, as adopted by the Bureau and the list of participants are set out in Appendices I and II.

The Bureau of the Committee of Convention 108:

- 1. took note of the **communication by the Secretariat** regarding in particular the budgetary situation of the Organisation and its possible impact on the 2019 programme and the reinforcement of the staffing of the Data Protection Unit for the implementation of cooperation activities, also highlighting the latest cooperation activities carried out with the support of the Cybercrime Division (in Nigeria and Kenya);
- 2. took note of the information concerning the **modernisation of Convention 108**, notably the opening for signature of the Amending Protocol to be held in Strasbourg on 10 October 2018, with over fifteen Parties having already confirmed that they would sign the Amending Protocol to Convention 108;
- 3. took note of the information on the **state of play of ratifications and accessions**, in particular on the accession to Convention 108 by Cabo Verde and Mexico bringing to 53 the total number of Parties as of 1 October 2018. The Bureau examined and finalised the **draft opinion on Kazakhstan's request** to accede Convention 108 and decided that the Committee would be consulted by written procedure for the adoption of the opinion, with a two weeks deadline;
- 4. examined the **draft explanatory memorandum of the Recommendation on the protection of health-related data** presented by the expert, Ms Jeanne Bossi Malafosse, held an exchange of views and decided that the revised version of the draft will be sent for comments to all delegations with a view to finalisation and approval at the 37<sup>th</sup> plenary meeting of the Committee (22-24 November 2018);
- 5. took note of the information provided by the secretariat on the **evaluation and follow up mechanism** to be set up under Convention 108+ and held an exchange of views and instructed the Secretariat to provide for the CRIDS expert support on this file, in order to present updated version of the documents at the 37<sup>th</sup> plenary meeting of the Committee;
- 6. took note of the information provided by the Secretariat concerning the latest development on ICANN related privacy issues, the next ICANN public meeting to be held in Barcelona (22 25 October 2018) and the imminent term of the written consultation on the draft "Privacy and Data protection principles **guide for ICANN** related data processing";
- 7. took note of the information provided by the policy advisor on Artificial Intelligence of the Council of Europe, Mr Yannick Meneceur, on the latest developments within the organisation in relation to Artificial Intelligence and by the expert, Mr Alessandro Mantelero on the **report on Artificial Intelligence**, held an exchange of views and decided to circulate for comments of the Bureau participants the proposed guiding policies on the issue with a view to a finalisation of the report at the 37<sup>th</sup> Plenary meeting;
- 8. examined and finalised the draft **agenda of the 37**<sup>th</sup> **plenary meeting**, supporting the proposals made by the participants to add to the draft agenda an item on the consultation of delegations on the latest trends on the nomination of heads of data protection authorities and financing models, on the opportunity to invite a technical expert on AI and an expert to present the case-law of the European Court of Justice;
- 9. took note of the activities and major developments related to the work of the Committee, in particular the IX<sup>th</sup> Seminar on Privacy and Personal Data Protection (7-8 August 2018, São Paulo, Brazil), the AGESIC national event on personal data protection (16-19 October 2018, Montevideo, Uruguay), the 40<sup>th</sup> International Conference of Data Protection and Privacy Commissioners (ICDPPC) (22-26 October 2018), the Forum "Mexico and Convention 108" (Mexico, 7-8 November 2018), the 13<sup>th</sup> Annual meeting of the Internet Governance Forum (IGF) (Paris, 12-14 November 2018), the International Conference on Cyberlaw, Cybercrime & Cybersecurity 2018 (14-16 November 2018, New Delhi, India);

- 10. took note of the information provided by the expert, Mr Gert Vermeulen on **transborder access to data by law enforcement**, held an exchange of views on the issues at stake and stressed the importance of continuing providing guidance to the Cybercrime Committee on privacy and data protection matters with relation to the drafting of the second additional protocol to the Budapest Convention;
- 11. took note of the information on the **co-operation with other Council of Europe bodies** presented by the Secretariat, in particular regarding the work of the Cybercrime Committee (T-CY) on the second additional protocol to the Budapest Convention, on the outcome of the last Octopus conference held in Strasbourg on 11 13 July 2018, on the draft European Ethical Charter on the Use of Artificial Intelligence in Judicial Systems and correlated study prepared by the Working Group on the quality of justice of the Commission on the Efficiency of Justice (CEPEJ). It finally took note of the work of the Committee of experts on Human Rights Dimensions of automated data processing and different forms of artificial intelligence (MSI-AUT), and of the request for comments regarding the draft revised European Prison rules prepared by the Council for Penological Co-operation (PC-CP) that will be finalised by written consultation of the Bureau participants;
- 12. took note of the latest requests for observer status, by Brazil and the Gabonese Data Protection Authority and decided that the Committee would be consulted by written procedure, also holding an exchange of views on the issue of applicable criteria to be considered to future requests for observer status. The Bureau also took note of the information presented by the delegation of the Philippines regarding the ACE programme (Awareness Compliance and Enforcement) and the privacy awareness week (to be held every year the last week of May and targeting DPOs) and implementation of controls. The representative of the EDPS recalled the forthcoming organisation of the 40th International Conference of Data Protection and Privacy Commissioners (Brussels, 22-26 October 2018). The ICRC delegation recalled the outcomes of the workshop on data protection in international organisations (Copenhagen, 13-14 July 2018) and referred to a study on "humanitarian metadata surveillance" commissioned to Privacy International to be made available in autumn, and the forthcoming launch of a new working series of workshops to update the Handbook on data protection and humanitarian action together with the Brussels Privacy Hub in order to address new topics such as blockchain, IA, digital identity and virtual reality. The Chair of the AFAPDP informed the Bureau of the date of the next General Assembly (18 October 2018 in Paris) which will examine a draft Resolution on the ownership of personal data, and of the annual Conference to be held on 19 October in Paris (addressing the themes of election and fake news and the GDPR). The representative of the European Commission drew attention of the Bureau on the draft adequacy decision regarding Japan and the fact that the opinion of the EDPB is expected for November, with a decision possibly adopted by the end of the year;
- 13. confirmed the **dates** of the forthcoming Plenary meeting to be held in Strasbourg from 20 to 22 November 2018 and of the next Bureau meeting, to be held from 17 to 19 December 2018 in Strasbourg. Dates for the meetings to be held in 2019 were also announced and are the following: Plenary meetings in Strasbourg from 12 to 14 June 2019 and from 19 to 21 November 2019, and Bureau meetings from 20 to 22 March 2019 (Paris), 25 to 27 September 2019 (Paris) and 11 to 13 December 2019 (Strasbourg).
