Item 1

Opening of the meeting / Statement by the Chair and the Secretariat

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Chair and the secretariat.

Item 2 Adoption of the agenda

The Bureau adopted the agenda.

Item 3 Convention 108+ state of play

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the signatures and ratifications of the Protocol amending Convention 108 (CETS No. 223, hereafter Convention 108+): 46 signatures out of which, 33 ratifications. Since the November 2024 plenary, Greece deposited on 5 March 2025 and Monaco on 6 March 2025 the instruments of ratification of the Amending Protocol CETS No. 223.

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat and held an exchange of views with regard to the preparation for the entry into force of Convention 108+, encouraged all Parties to finalise their ratification procedures as soon as possible and invited the Secretariat to organise a tour de table on the state of play of the ratification at the next plenary meeting in June.

As regards Costa Rica, the Bureau took note of the information provided by the Bureau members and the secretariat on the latest developments regarding the internal legislative process.

Item 4 Transborder data flows of personal data (MCCs, other possible tools)

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat held an exchange of views with regard to the importance of the approval of CoE MCC at domestic level, it agreed to improve the webpage on MCC on the CoE website, including introducing a list of countries where the CoE MCC have been approved. The Bureau congratulated the Swiss DPA in this respect being the first authority allowing for the use of the CoE MCC domestically. The Bureau invited the Secretariat to organise a tour de table on the state of play of approval of the CoE MCC at domestic level at the next plenary meeting in June.

The Bureau took also note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the roundtable discussion on data transfers to be held on 21 March 2025 in Paris and invited the Secretariat to inform the Bureau after the meeting and the plenary in June of the outcome and make proposals if relevant on the necessary follow up.

Item 5 Interpretation of Article 11 of modernised Convention 108

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the rapporteur, Mr Gonzalo Sosa (in writing) and the Secretariat, held an exchange of views on the revised document, agreed on sending written comments by 4 April 2025 to facilitate the discussion and possible adoption of the document at next Plenary meeting in June. The Bureau also took note that the next Working Group on article 11 will be convened online after the new version of the document is available based on the written comments received.

Item 6 Privacy Enhancing Technologies (synthetic data, LLMs)

The Bureau took note of the presentation by Isabel Barberá (Rhite) and Murielle Popa-Fabre on the concept of an expert report to be drafted by the experts with the contribution of Prof Chris Russell from Oxford Internet Institute, University of Oxford on data protection in Large Language Models, held an exchange of views, and invited the Secretariat to work with the experts on the finalisation of the expert report to be presented during the next plenary meeting in June.

Item 7 Future Work Programme (follow up)

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat, held an exchange of views on the state of play of the current Work Programme (2022-2025), held a discussion on the possible topics to be included in the upcoming Work Programme and decided to have an exchange of views on the same

topic at the next plenary meeting in June with specific focus on the necessary steps to be taken following the entry into force of Convention 108+ and the standard setting activity.

Item 8 Draft Guidelines on Data Protection in the context of neurosciences

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the rapporteur, Ms Alessandra Pierucci, the expert Dr Marcello lenca and the Secretariat on the first version of the Draft Guidelines on Data Protection in the context of neurosciences, held an exchange of views, invited delegations to send comments on the draft document by 4 April, agreed on further amending the text based on comments received in view of its first possibly full reading at the June plenary meeting.

Item 9 Cooperation with other Council of Europe bodies and entities

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the ongoing work within CAI, CDBIO, CDDH, Committee on Macolin Convention, etc.

Item 10 Developments and activities in the field of data protection

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the participants and Secretariat, notably on the Working Seminar on "Artificial Intelligence and Data Protection: complementarity and an integrated approach" (29 November 2025, Strasbourg), CPDP Data Protection Day (28 January 2025, Brussels).

Item 11 Cooperation

The Bureau also took note of the various cooperation programmes relevant to data protection, in particular on the on-going institutional support to beneficiaries of the Southern Mediterranean region (South V Programme) and the renewal of the programme under South Programme VI, initiative to prepare a global cooperation programme by the Council of Europe on digital matters as well as on-going and possible future cooperation with data protection authorities under several Council of Europe Action Plans, notably in the Republic of Moldova, Armenia, Azerbaijan and Ukraine.

Item 12 Data Protection Commissioner

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Data Protection Commissioner's activities since the last plenary. The Secretariat informed that the call for candidacy for the position of the CoE Data Protection Commissioner will be published soon with a view of election of the new commissioner during the June plenary.

Item 13 Observers

The Bureau took note of the information on the observer status requests received by the Chair, and the memorandum prepared by the Secretariat, notably on the request by the Network of African Data Protection Authorities, Ecuador and Colombia, held an exchange of views and invited the Secretariat to communicate the outcome of the discussion to the applicants and prepare the final memorandum for the next plenary.

The Bureau also took note of the information provided by the observers and participants to the meeting, notably by the representative of Brazil with regard the latest developments at the supervisory authority.

Item 14 Next meetings

The Bureau took note of the dates of the next plenary meeting to be held on 17-19 June 2025 (48th) in Strasbourg, as well as of the next Bureau meetings on 29-30 September 2025 (64th) in Paris.

Item 15 Stefano Rodotà Award

The Bureau took note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the process for amending the internal competition rules and tasked the Secretariat to prepare a new version in view of its adoption.
