## Background and key concepts

The HELP module on **Access to Justice in the Digital Environment** is a short course that provides a clear overview of the evolving digital landscape in legal proceedings. Technology is rapidly reshaping the way justice is delivered and accessed, making it essential for legal professionals to stay informed and prepared for these changes. This module is designed to **help participants reflect on key developments and challenges in the digital transformation of access to justice**, and to encourage thoughtful consideration of **how justice can remain accessible to everyone, including vulnerable groups**. Learners will gain a concise understanding of **relevant instruments** developed by both the Council of Europe and the European Union. The module also offers a **practical perspective** by examining recent case law from the European Court of Human Rights and other courts, as well as exploring national practices, including examples presented on the [European e-Justice Portal](#).

## About the HELP course

The course was developed in 2025 by the [Human Rights Education for Legal Professionals \(HELP\) Programme of the Council of Europe](#), in the framework of the [EU-CoE HELP in the EU IV Project](#). Developed using the [HELP methodology](#), the course is tailored to the learning needs of legal professionals.

## Target audience

This free short course is primarily to legal and justice professionals, including:

- judges
- prosecutors
- lawyers
- experts participating in judicial proceedings
- professionals such as court staff, bailiffs, notaries, mediators, court experts, legal interpreters and translators.

The course can also benefit staff of **national human rights institutions, equality bodies and civil society organisations**. Finally, it is open to **anyone interested in the topic**, such as student or other professionals seeking a concise exploration of access to justice in the digital environment.
