possible ADRV is sufficiently substantiated to charge an athlete. The athlete can accept the charge as the final decision within 20 days.

If the athlete does not accept the charge set out by ADNOs Independent Prosecution Committee, the athlete has to actively challenge the charge, in which case NIF's Hearing Panel will then decide in the case. This decision can be appealed to NIFs Independent Appeal Committee.

If the athlete fail to react to the charge, the charge will automatically become a decision. In this case, the decision may be appealed and the appeal shall be directed to NIFs Independent Appeal Committee.
