Persons and organizations with a right to appeal are specified in Article 13.2.3 of the Anti-Doping Rules and the Code.
Appeals against the decision must be brought within the time limits specified in the Code

and Article 13 of the Anti-Doping Rules and the International Standard for Results Management.


