In previous years, as we did not have the direct capacity to test athletes residing or training outside of Spain, in some cases we performed tests through foreign ADOs as a compensation for services provided to that ADOs by us. Now that the legislation allows us to test athletes abroad, we have found a way and in the next year we will start working with service providers that are able do it.

Describe, upload documents or add the link to the relevant content The sanctioning decisions of the Spanish Commission for fighting doping in sports (CELAD) may be appealed to the Antidoping Sanctioning Committee. The period for this appeal is a month since the atlethe receives the sanctioning decision.

Afterwards, the decision of the Antidoping Sanctioning Committee can be appealed to the Contentious-administrative Jurisdiction within a period of two months since the notification of the decision.

The appeals system is described in articles 47, 48 and 49 of the Organic Law 11/2021 of 28 December on the fight against doping in sport.

The CELAD has mechanisms for collaboration, coordination, and cooperation at the international level. The agents with whom we have collaborated and exchanged information in recent years are the following: World Anti-Doping Agency (WADA) Anti-Doping Organisations of other countries (NADOs): e.g. USADA, UKAD. RILD Network of Medicines Authorities in Ibero-America (EAMI Network) International Federations: e.g. IAAF EUROPOL INTERPOL Law Enforcement Agencies of other countries: e.g. French Gendarmerie Medicines Regulatory Agencies of other countries: e.g. MHRA (UK)
(b) Law enforcement co-operation	Yes - AEPSAD had an agreement with the National Police and the Civil Guard, and an agent from each of them works in our Intelligence Division in our offices. In this way we have the possibility of using the agreements that the police forces have with INTERPOL, EUROPOL, etc.
(c) General co-operation	Yes – World Anti-Doping Code Code signatorie, RILD's Constitution and Regulation signatorie, Signatorie of the Anti-doping Convention of the Council of Europe Council of Europe (CAHAMA, T-DO), signatorie of the UNESCO International Convention against Doping in Sport, agreement with ITA.

(d) Other

Yes - Collaboration with International Sport Federations (IFs) and NADOs is usually carried out by the Doping Control Department and its Investigations and Intelligence Division. This collaboration is reflected in different areas of active interaction: Providing service in the sample collection request as a service provider. CELAD collaborates with IFs and NADOs in the sample collection of Spanish or foreign athletes who reside or train occasionally in our country. In this way, costs are reduced for these organisations, and these organisations also provide the same service to CELAD. The exchange of information through the ADAMS system relating to: test planning, locations, TUEs, and analytical results. This exchange of information and the signing of the relevant collaboration agreements has strengthened the Athlete Biological Passport (ABP) programme by accessing more than 800 passports. The exchange of intelligence information that facilitates targeted testing by coordinating CELAD's actions with IFs and NADOs, as well as providing information to support investigations of international nonanalytical anti-doping violations.
