Objective:

In order to implement the requirements of Article 9 of the Anti-Doping Convention, the annual online questionnaire is ready for data-collection on anti-doping policies in 2022.

In addition to the standard questions, three new ones on doping in recreational sport have been added replacing those on whistleblower protection. Please note that the proposed definitions for these questions are included in the instructions for each question.

For example, Question 1 refers to "gyms/fitness centres users" as individuals with a membership to a gyms/fitness centres. Gyms/fitness centres users may include both men and women at all ages, who partake in any kind of exercise activity offered by the gyms/fitness centres, including, but not limited to, strength training, endurance training, and/or group training (aerobics, spinning, yoga etc). Gym/fitness centre: A health, recreational, and social facility where people go to exercise, for example by lifting weights or using other equipment. It is often a for-profit commercial facility but may also be a community-based or institutionally supported centre.

Describe, upload documents or add the link to the relevant content 13.2.2 Appeals by Other Athletes or Other Persons In cases where Article 13.2.1 of the Guidelines cannot be applied, it is possible to appeal to the national appeal body. The national appeal body is the National Court of Arbitration for Sport.

The appeal process will be conducted in accordance with the rules of the Directive, the rules of the International Standard Results Management, the Statute of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport and the Rules of Procedure of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport.

The National Court of Arbitration for Sport is the national anti-doping appeal body within the meaning of Article 13.2.2 of the Directive. Its statute and rules of procedure are issued by the National Sports Agency.

The National Court of Arbitration for Sport is independent and impartial in the performance of its function. The decision of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport is final at the national level. The decision of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport can be appealed exclusively to CAS according to Article 13.2.3.2. Proceedings before the National Court of Arbitration for Sport are governed by this Directive, the statute of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport and the rules of procedure of the National Court of Arbitration for Sport issued by the National Sports Agency in professional cooperation with the Czech Anti-Doping Committee.
