ADNO supports and oversees the implementation through the "Clean Sport Federation" program, in which all 55 Federations take part. The level of participation in the education program varies between the Federations: at a minimum the members of the national teams and all the medical support personnel. In addition some Federations have made it a requirement for the participation in competitions from the age of 15.
