[X] OtherArticles 230.1 and 230.2 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation allow criminal liability to be imposed on the athlete's personnel for inducing the use, for the use of substances and methods prohibited in sport in relation to the athlete. Also, in Russia criminal liability is imposed under Articles 234 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation (illegal trafficking of potent substances)

and 226.1 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation (smuggling of potent substances). For the purposes of Articles 234 and 226.1 of the Criminal Code of the Russian Federation, the list of potent substances is used, which partially coincides with the WADA Prohibited List. Article 6.18 of the Code of Administrative Offenses of the Russian Federation. Intentional violation by an athlete of the requirements established by the legislation on physical culture and sport on the prevention and combating of doping in sport, expressed in the use or attempted use by the athlete of a prohibited substance and (or) a prohibited method.

A number of Federations have stipulated in their regulations that

certificates of completion of RUSADA online courses must be provided by athlete personnel, including athlete medical personnel.

Organizations engaged in sports training are obliged to familiarize persons undergoing sports training with the applicable anti-doping rules.

RUSADA implements specialized programs for all athletes in RUSADA's testing pools and for athletes returning after the end of their period of Ineligibility.
