Evolution of priorities

- Before 1990: Foundations, multilateral standard setting: Conventions and Recommendations
- Since 1990: Enlargement, assistance activities, sectorial conventions and monitoring committees
- Since 2010: Globalisation, multi-disciplinary and multi-agency approach
