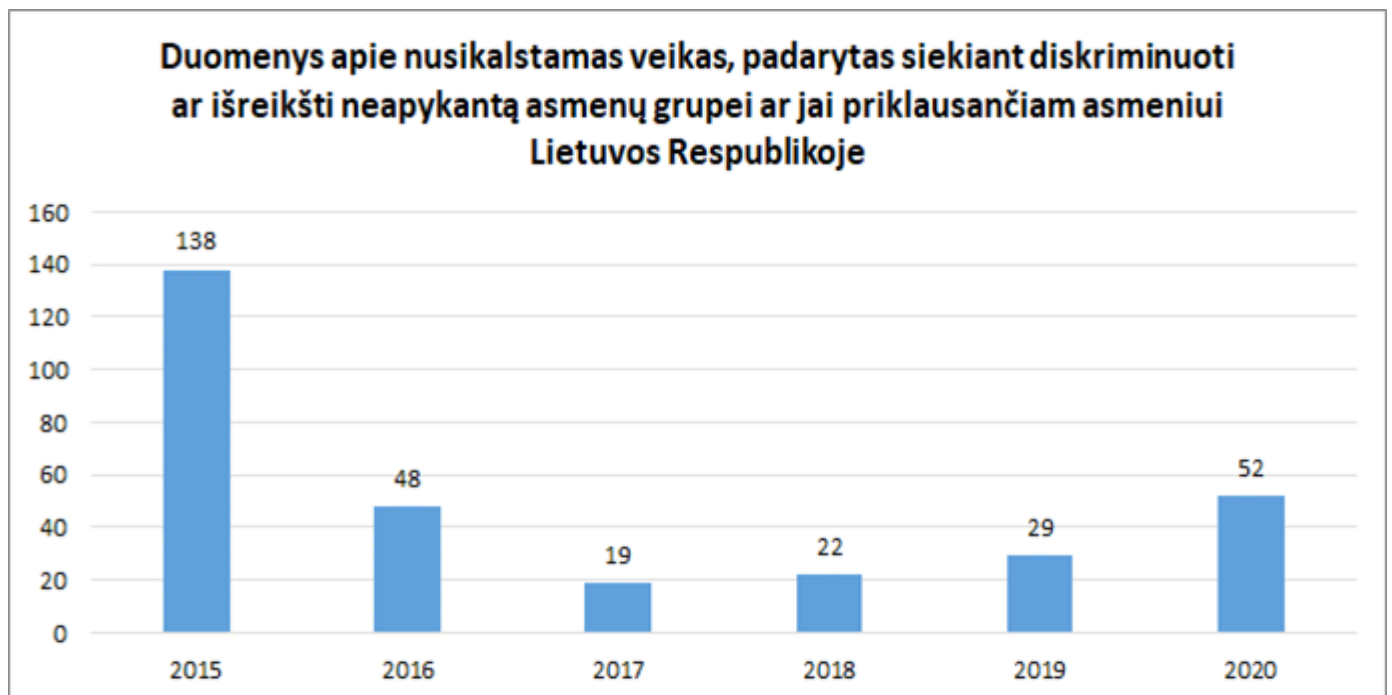

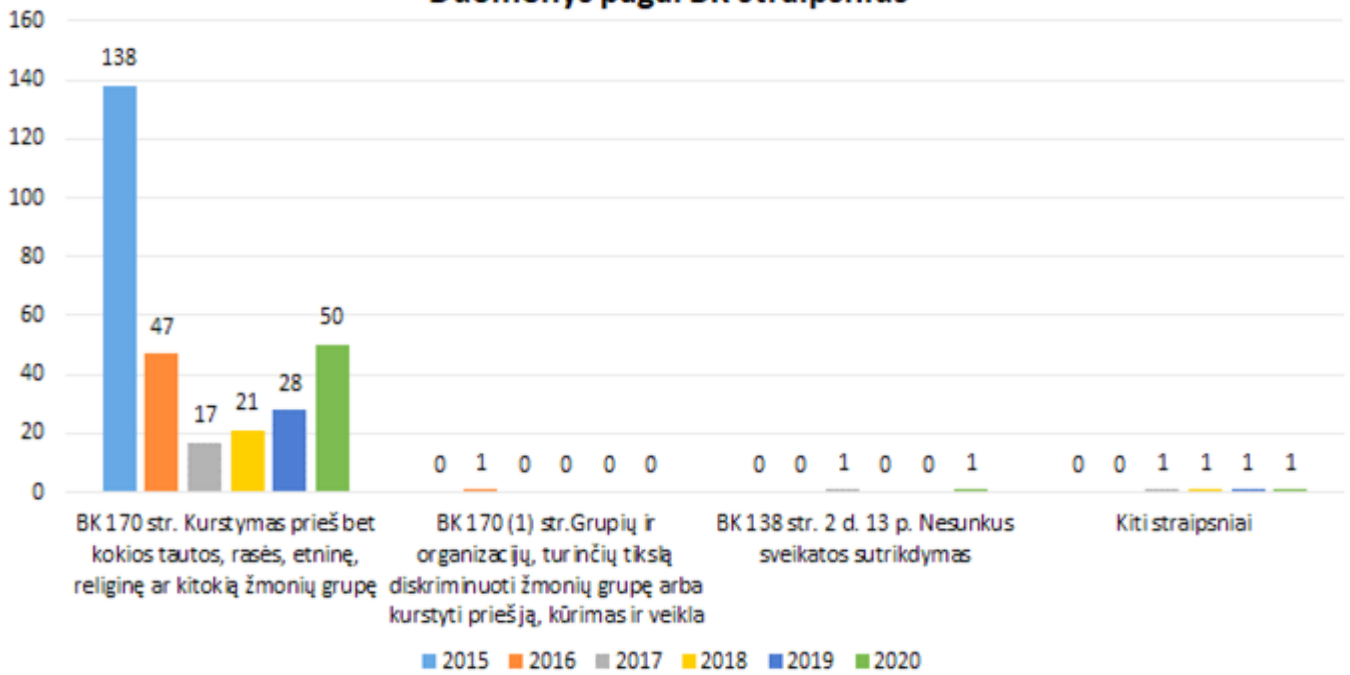

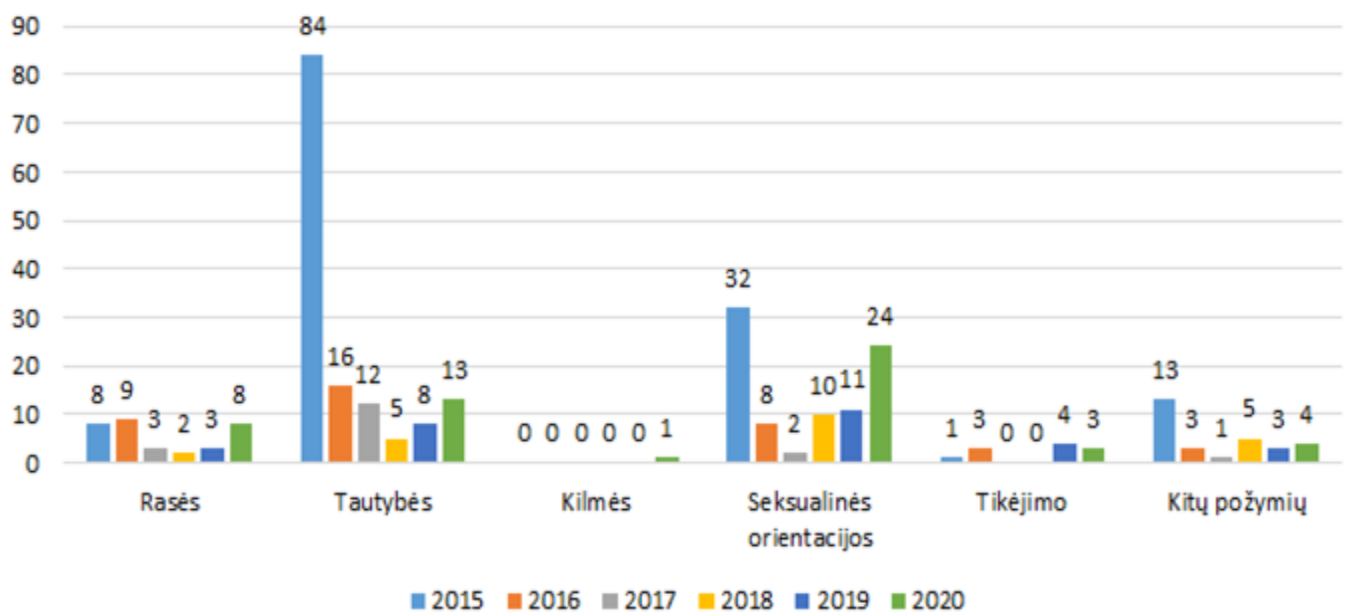
2015-2020 data summary
