14.30 Systemic design session on strengthening the ICC network

The Intercultural Cities network has grown from 11 to 136 members over 11 years, encompassing a broader range of countries and national integration models. Since the beginning, it has also expanded the set of issues it covers. Systemic design is an emerging methodology for assessing the role of different elements and processes in complex systems, their interaction, weak and strong points. The methodology will be used to explore new modes of communication and exchange, and better modalities of networked learning and policy advocacy, on which ultimately depend the sustainability and effectiveness of the network.
