No changes other than that of natural succession after a forest fire in 2006.

The vegetation in Muttos Nationalpark is still affected by the 2006 forest fire and the understory regrowth in that area is slow due to climate factors. The suspected establishment of lodgepole pine (*Pinus contorta*) in the southeast part of the National Park from 2012 has not been verified in 2013.

Golden eagle (*Aquila chrysaetos*): No observed successful breedings (compared to none in 2012 and 2 in 2011)

In January 1, 2013, was the responsibility for managing the Laponia World Heritage (including Sarek, Padjelanta/Badjelánnda, Stora Sjöfallet/Stuor Muorrke and Muttos National Parks) overtaken by the organization Laponiatjuottjudus. Laponiatjuottjudus consists of representatives from SEPA, Norrbotten County Administrative Board, the municipalities of Gällivare and Jokkmokk and nine Sami reindeer herding districts. The organization manage the national trail system and facilities, as well as the Visitor Centre and habitat management. It will also create venues for meeting and learning for citizens and organizations.
