According to Art. 32, par. 1 of the Penal Code, a minor under the age of 14 is not criminally responsible. Appropriate educational measures may be applied to minors who commit socially dangerous acts.

The provisions of the Act on Combating Juvenile Delinquency shall apply.

- Art. 13. (1) Regarding minors and minors who have committed anti-social acts, and minors who have committed crimes, exempted from criminal liability under Art. 61 of the Penal Code, the following educational measures are imposed:
- 1. warning;
- 2. obligation to apologize to the victim;
- 3. obligation to participate in consultations, trainings and programs to overcome behavioral deviations;
- 4. placement under the educational supervision of the parents or the persons who replace them, with an obligation to provide enhanced care;
- 5. placement under the educational supervision of a public educator;
- 6. banning the minor from visiting certain places and establishments;
- 7. banning the minor from meeting and establishing contacts with certain persons;
- 8. banning the minor from leaving his current address;
- 9. obliging the minor to remove the damage caused by his own labor, if this is within his capabilities;
- 10. obliging the minor to perform certain work for the benefit of society;
- 11. accommodation in a socio-pedagogical boarding school;
- 12. warning for placement in an educational boarding school with a probationary period of up to 6 months;
- 13. placement in an educational boarding school.
