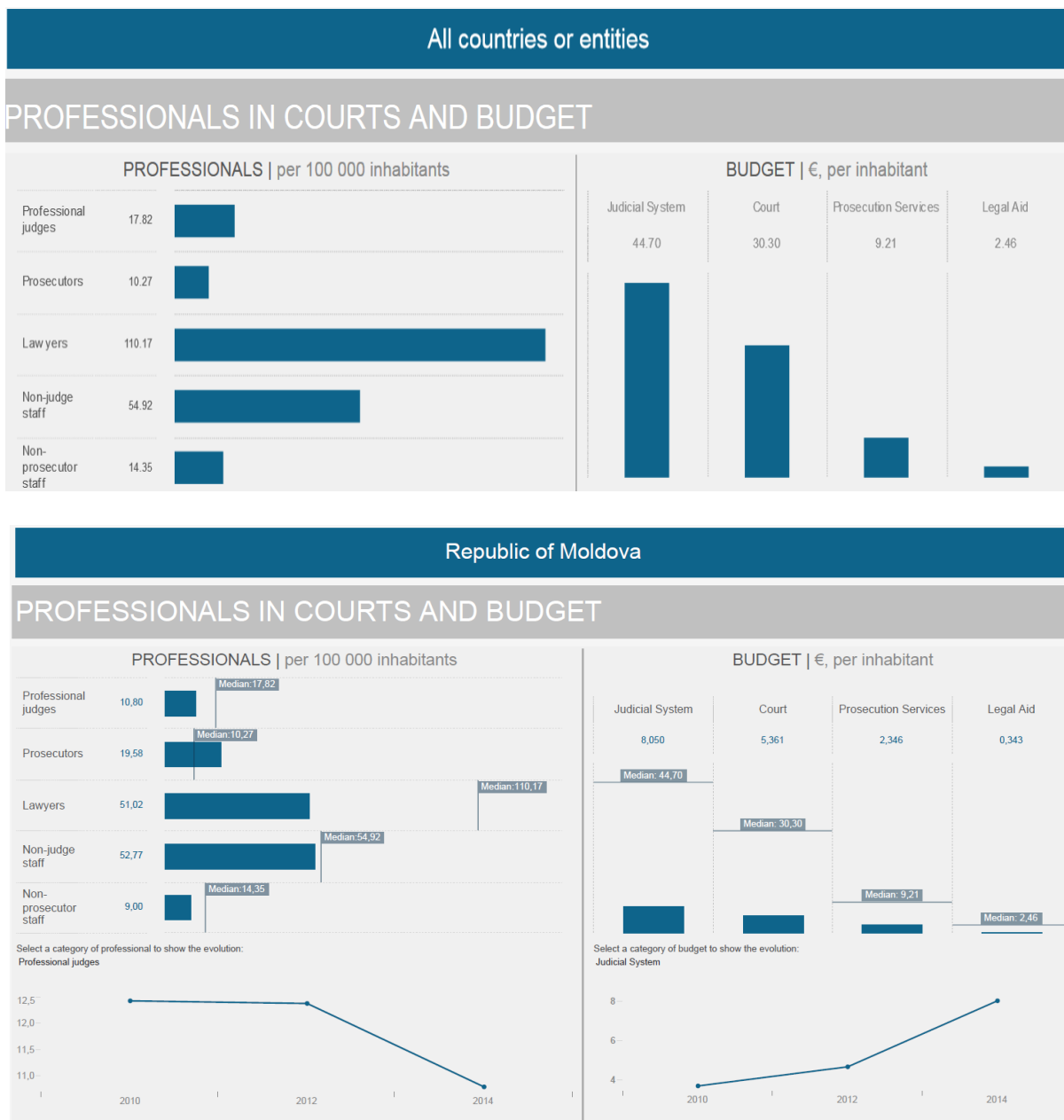


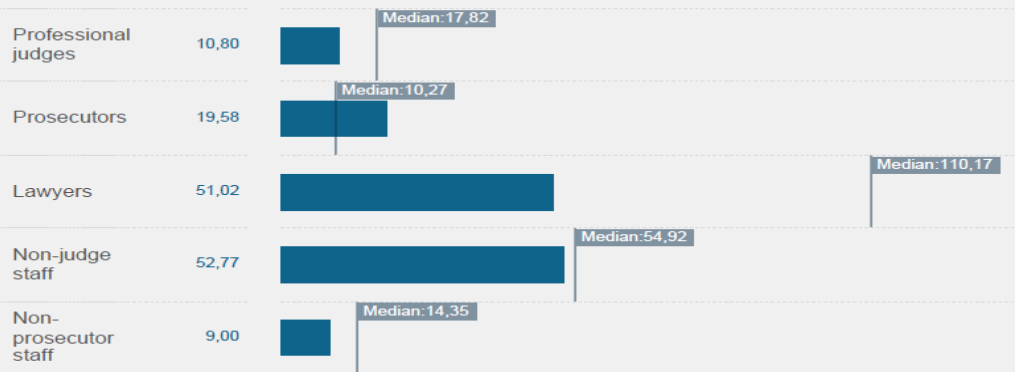
### Appendix no. 3. Examples of data provided through the CEPEJ-STAT database in regard to the Republic of Moldova.

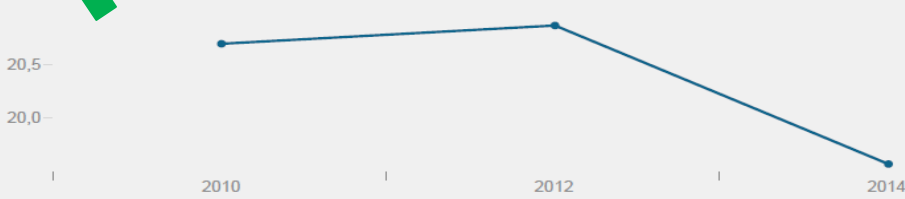

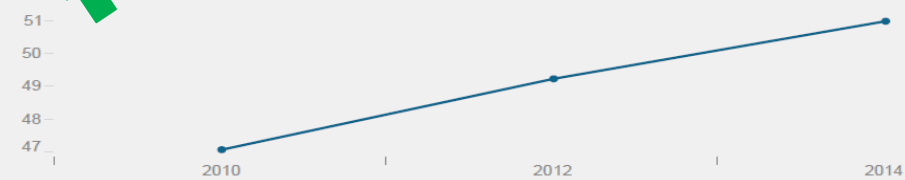

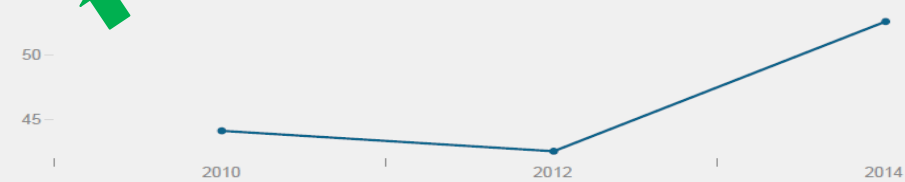

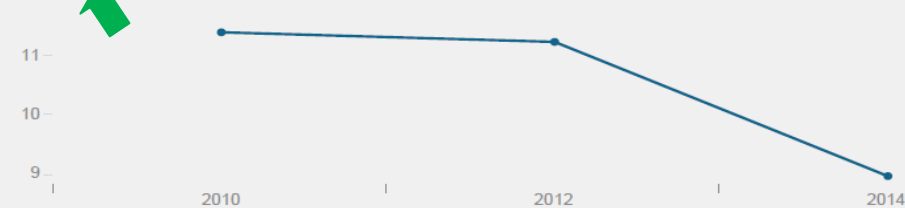

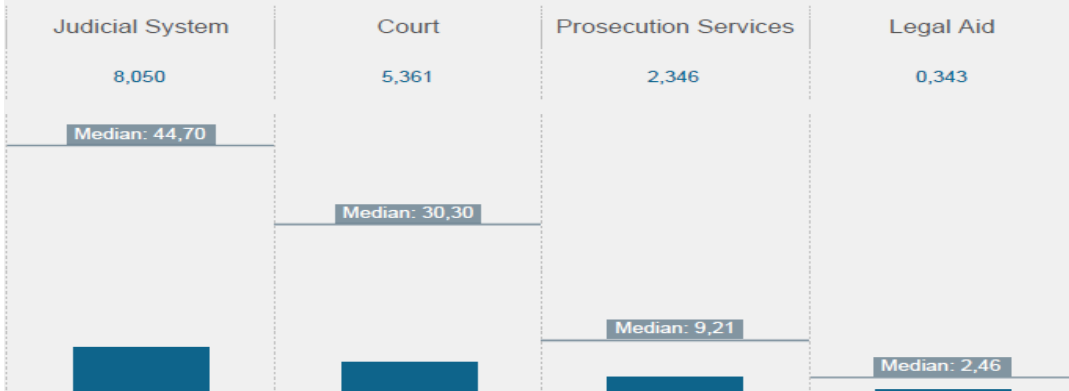

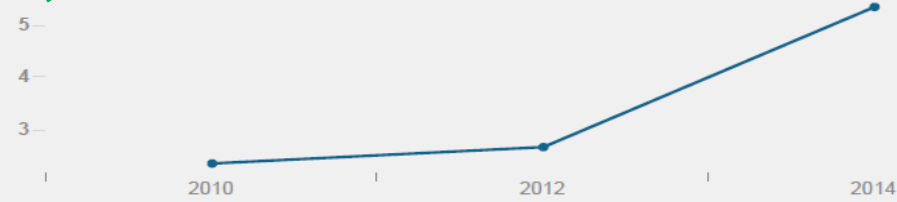

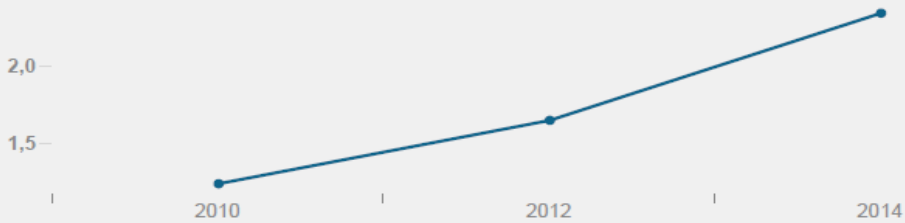

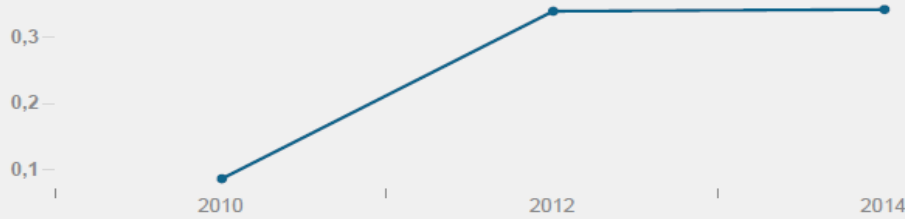

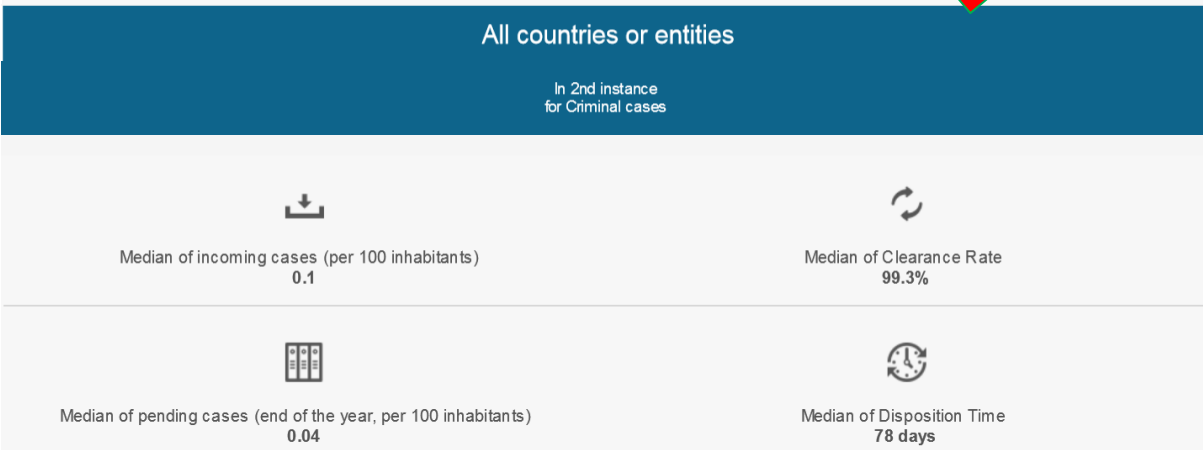

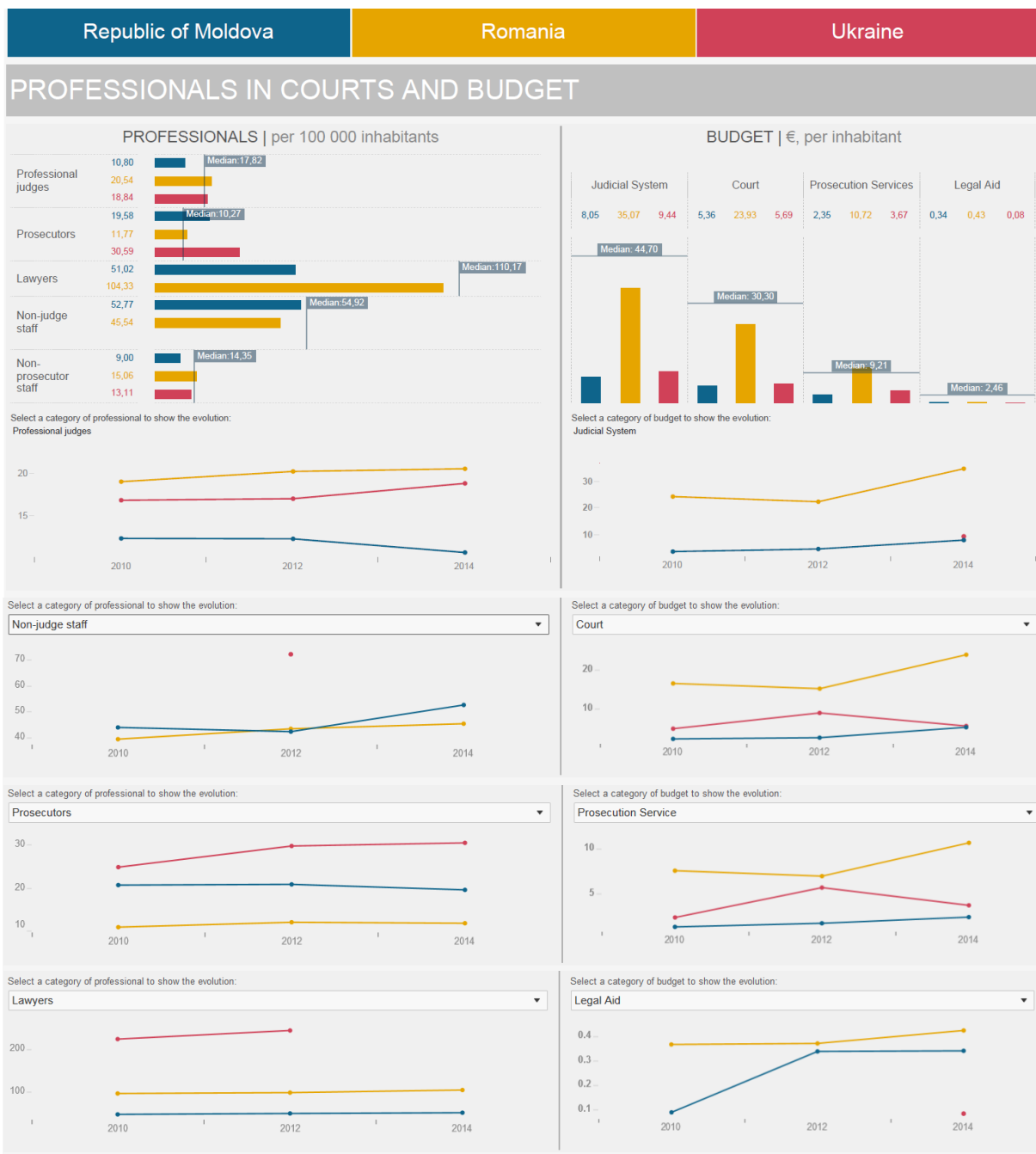

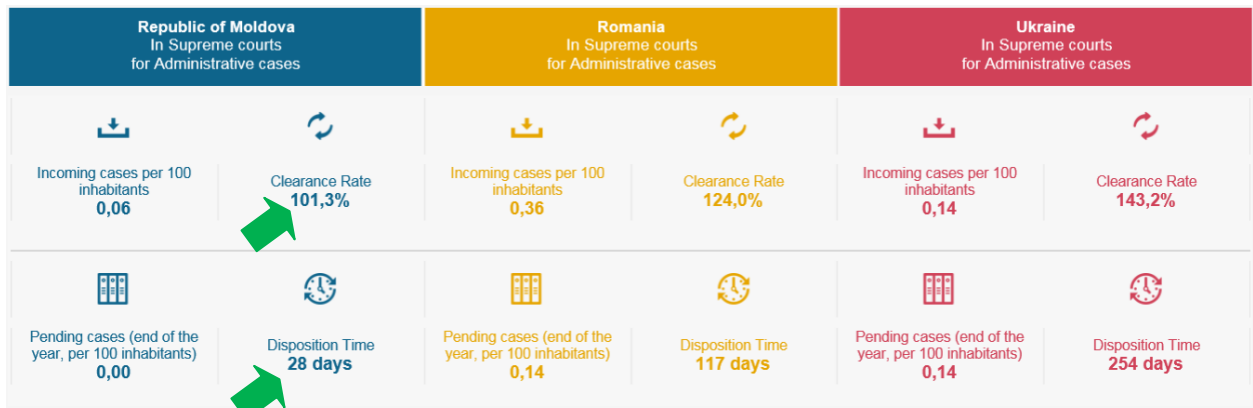

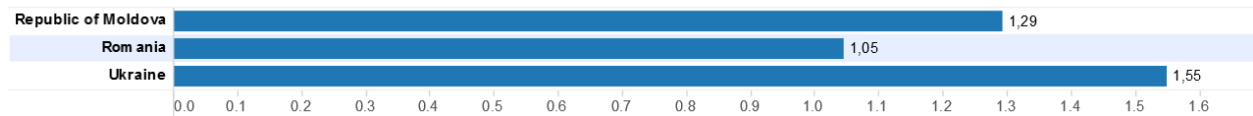

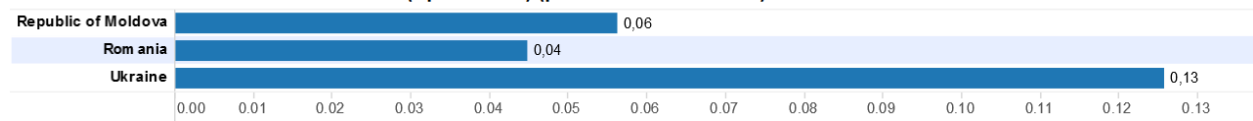
Question selected: 42.1.3. All the courts (Geographic locations) (per 100 000 inhabitant)



Question selected: 42.1.1. First instance (General) (per 100 000 inhabitant)

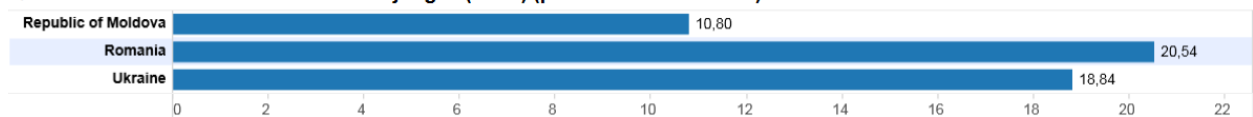


Question selected: 42.1.2. First instance (Specialised) (per 100 000 inhabitant)

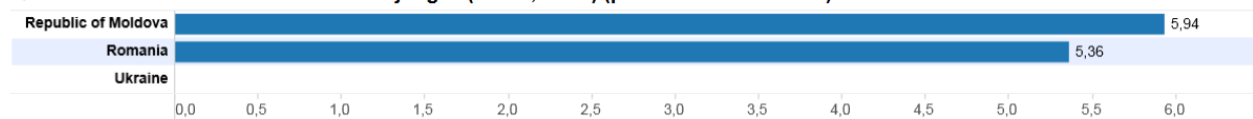

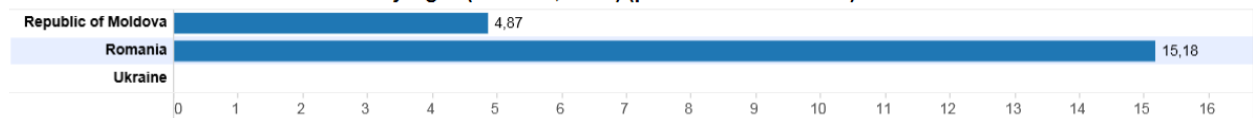
Question selected: 46.1.1. Professional judges (Total) (per 100 000 inhabitant)



Question selected: 46.2.1. Professional judges (Males, Total) (per 100 000 inhabitant)

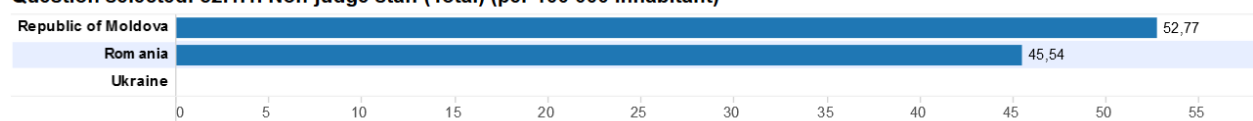


Question selected: 46.3.1. Professional judges (Females, Total) (per 100 000 inhabitant)



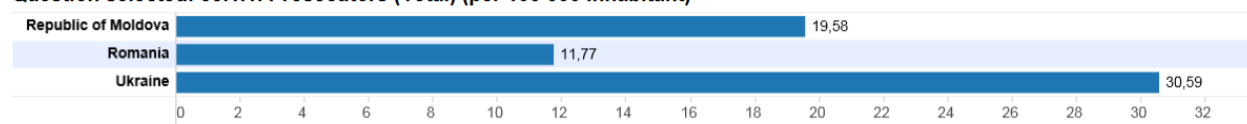

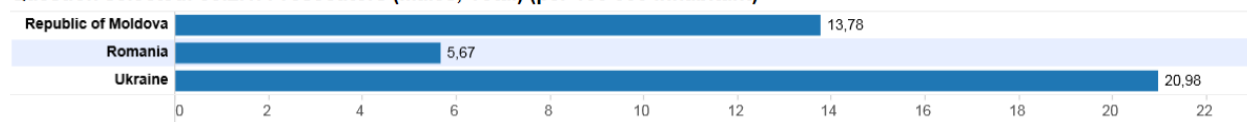

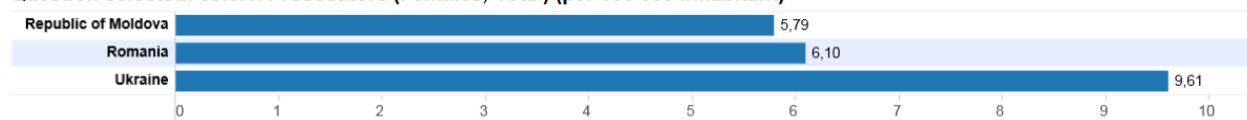
