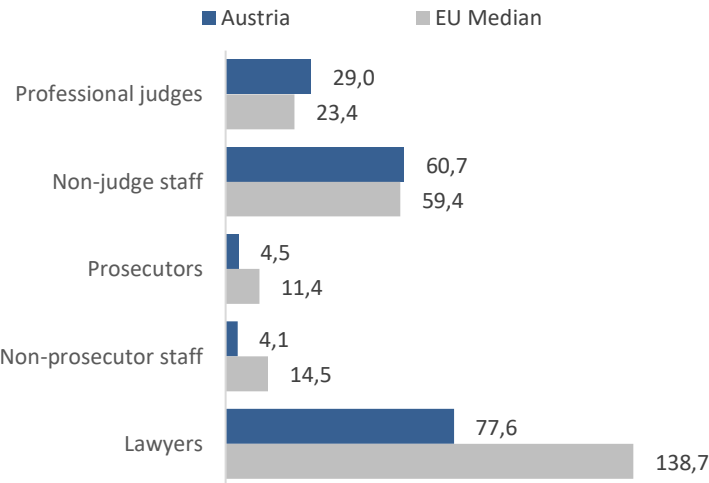

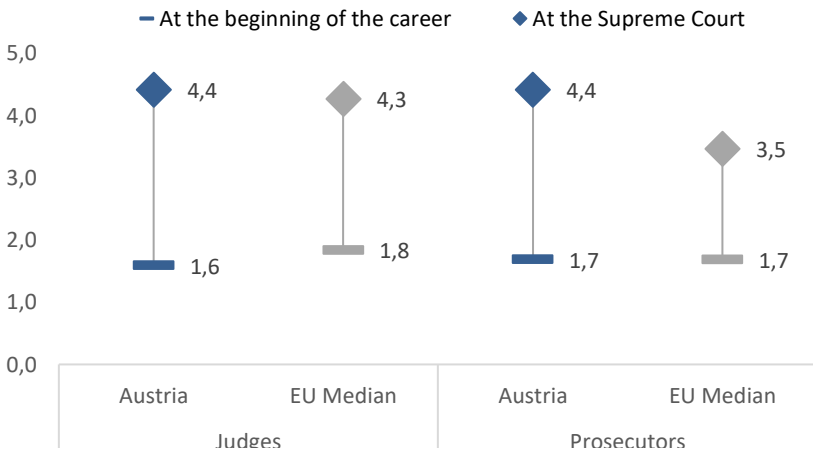

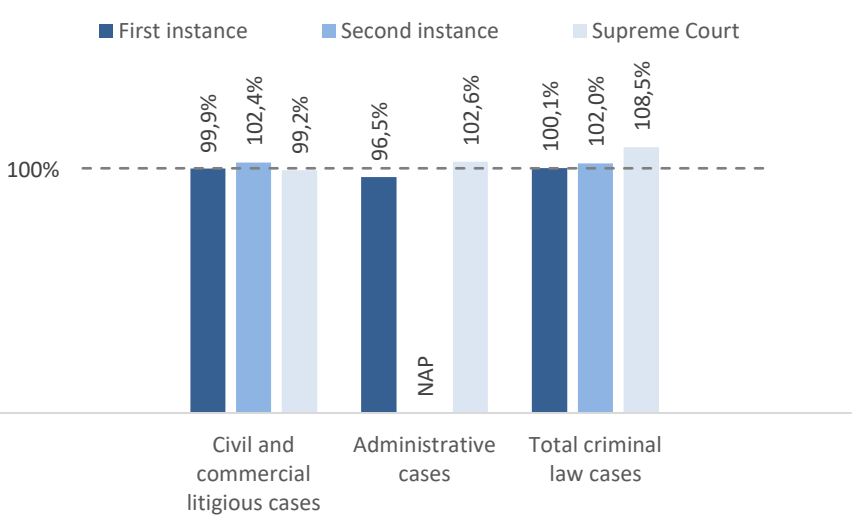


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2024

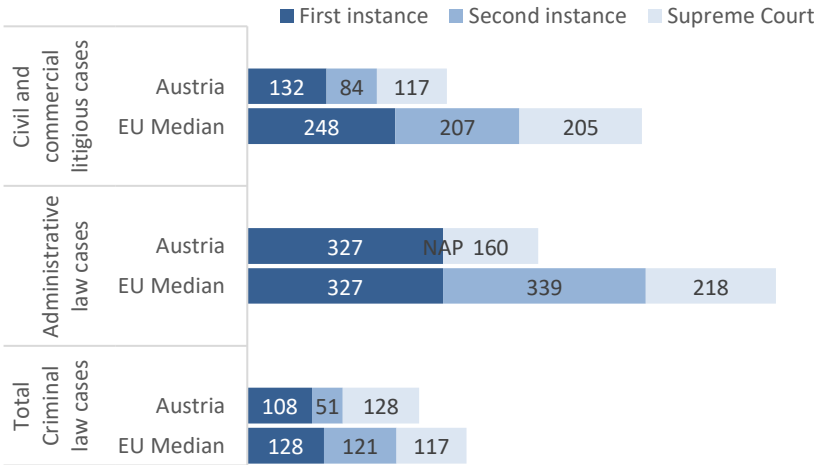

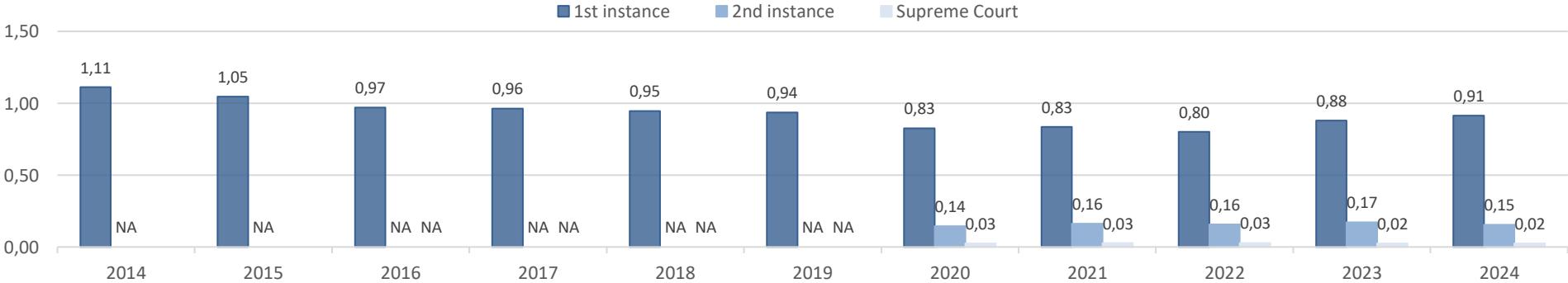


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2024 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Austria (2024 data)

In 2024 in Austria, the number of courts considered as legal entities is 150, comprising 131 courts of general jurisdiction and 19 specialised courts.

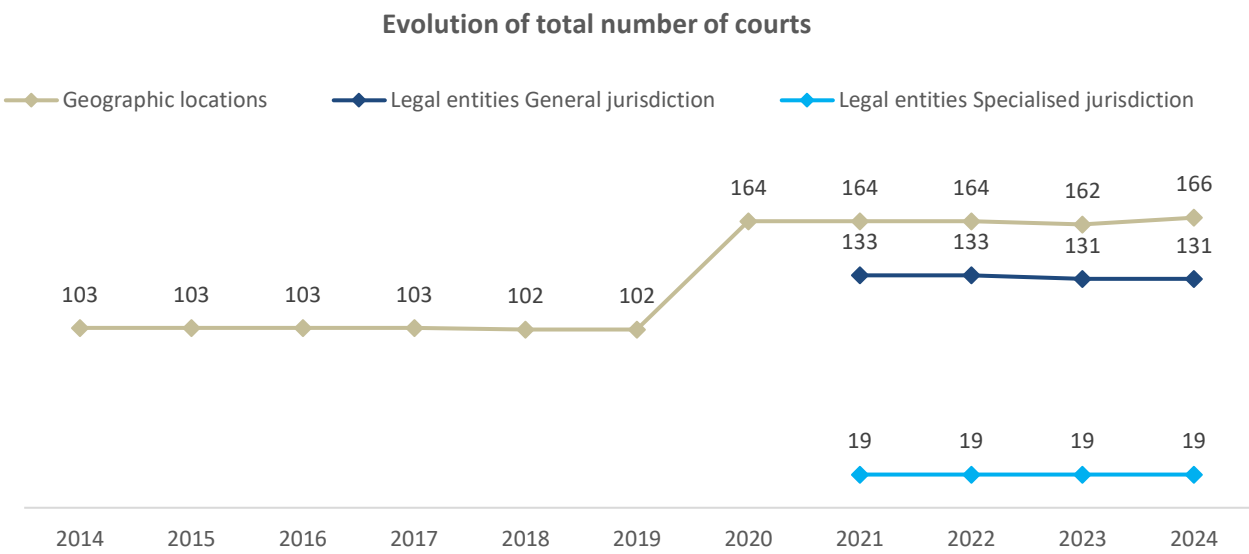
Among the 131 legal entities of general jurisdiction, 126 act at first instance, four at second instance and one at third instance. More precisely, 113 District Courts and 13 Regional Courts of general jurisdiction intervene as first-instance courts. It is noteworthy that the six other Regional Courts and one District Court with specialised jurisdiction are not included here, but are counted as specialised first-instance courts.

A particular feature of the 20 Austrian Regional Courts is that, although they are first-instance courts, some of them are also competent to hear appeals against District Courts’ decisions. The four Higher Regional Courts have appellate competence in all civil and criminal matters, and the Supreme Court is the highest instance in these fields. The discrepancy with previous reporting is due to a calculation error last year; these figures should already have appeared in the previous report.

The Lower Austria Regional Administrative Court has “external offices” in parts of Lower Austria, and the Federal Administrative Court, as well as the Federal Tax Court maintain regional buildings in the Federal States. These elements were taken into account in the 2022 data, where another mistake seems to have occurred—the correct numbers should have been 162 and 168. Since then, two district courts have been closed.

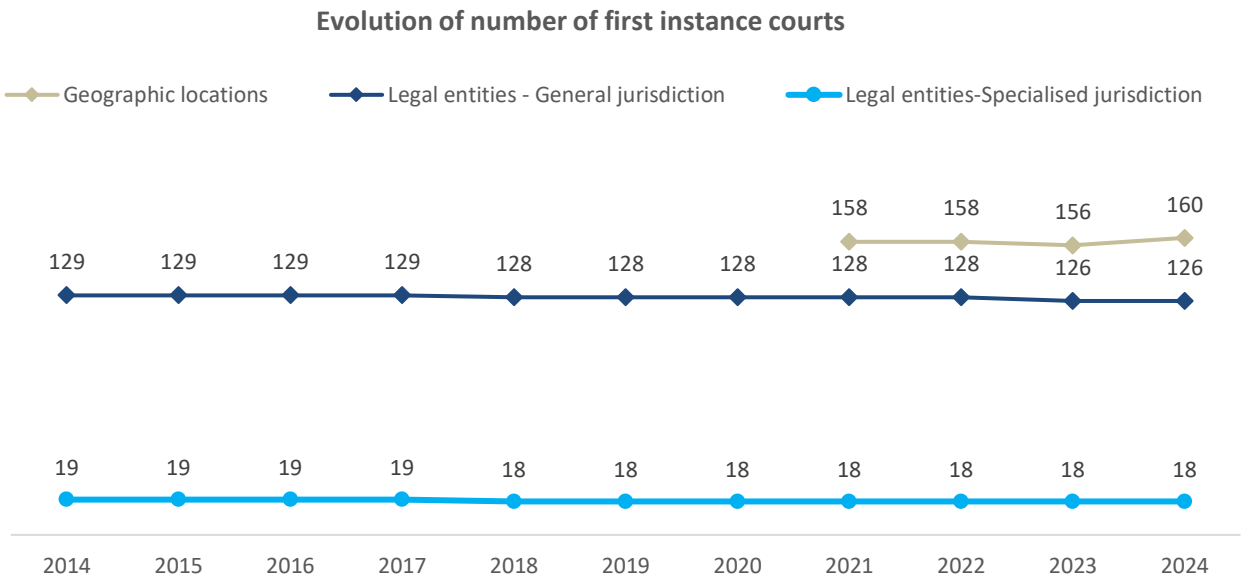

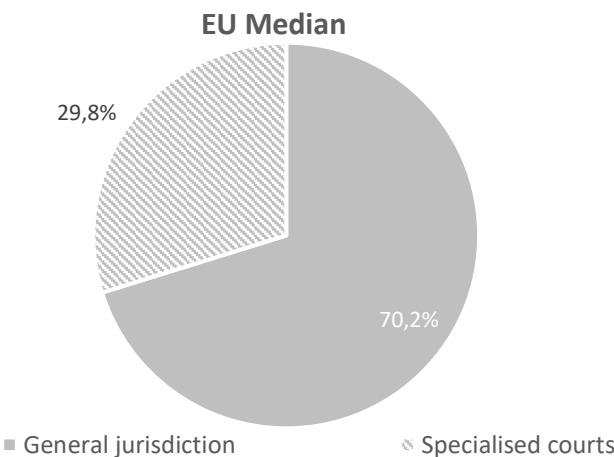
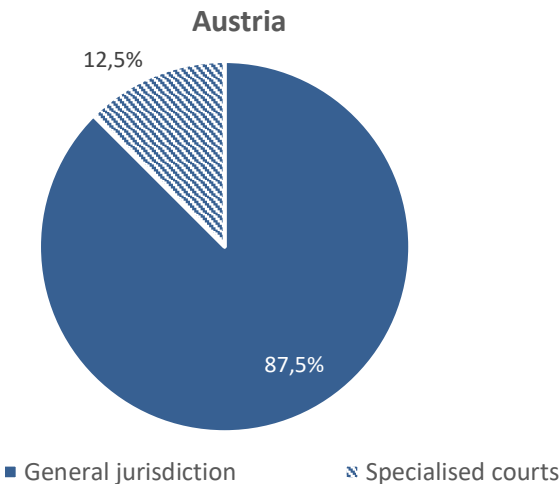

As a rule, every court handles all judicial issues; however, in the largest Austrian cities, certain courts are specialised. In Vienna, there are six specialised courts (civil cases, criminal cases, commercial cases, labour and social welfare cases, administrative cases), and in Graz, there are two (civil cases, criminal cases).

Since there are special courts for civil law cases in Vienna and Graz, which cannot be individually selected here, and because of the Court for Labour and Social Welfare cases in Vienna (Arbeits- und Sozialgericht Wien), which is competent for labour and some social welfare cases, the total number of individual courts does not correspond to the total number of specialised courts.

The two "other specialised first instance courts" are the two civil law courts (in Vienna and Graz), while the two specialised criminal courts, also located in Vienna and Graz, focus on the enforcement of criminal sanctions.

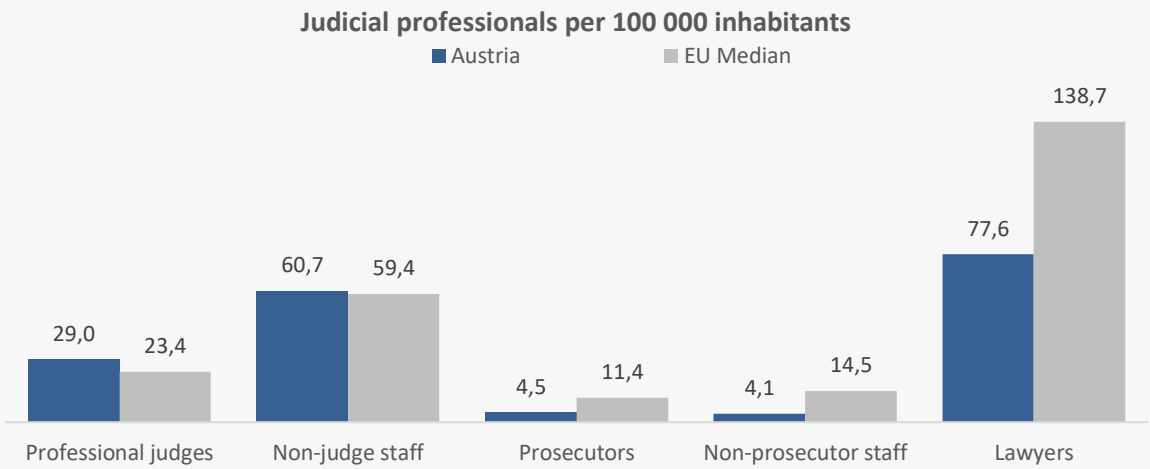
It is noteworthy that one commercial court in Vienna, both civil law courts in Vienna and Graz, and both courts specialised in the enforcement of criminal sanctions, also serve as second instance courts. Since January 1st, 2014, there have been 11 newly established courts for administrative law in Austria: 9 regional administrative courts, 1 Federal administrative court, and 1 Federal Tax Court.

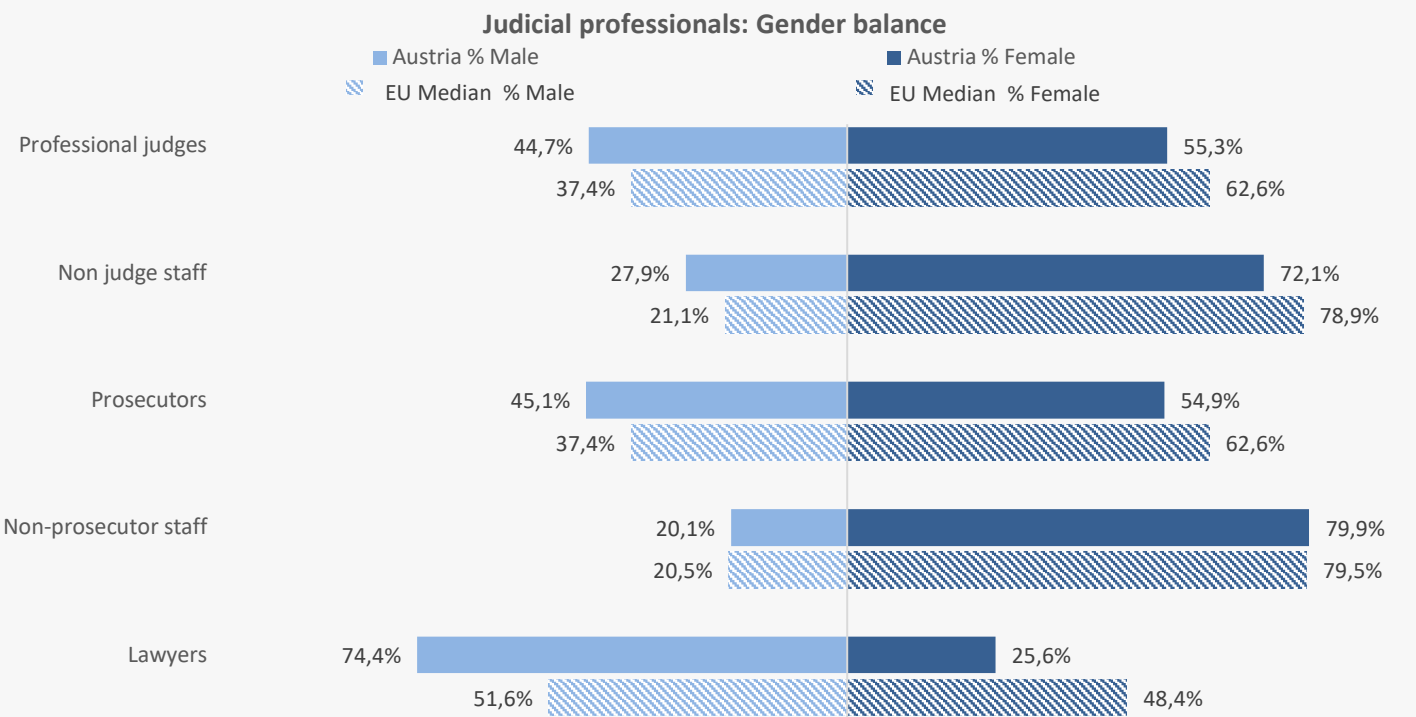

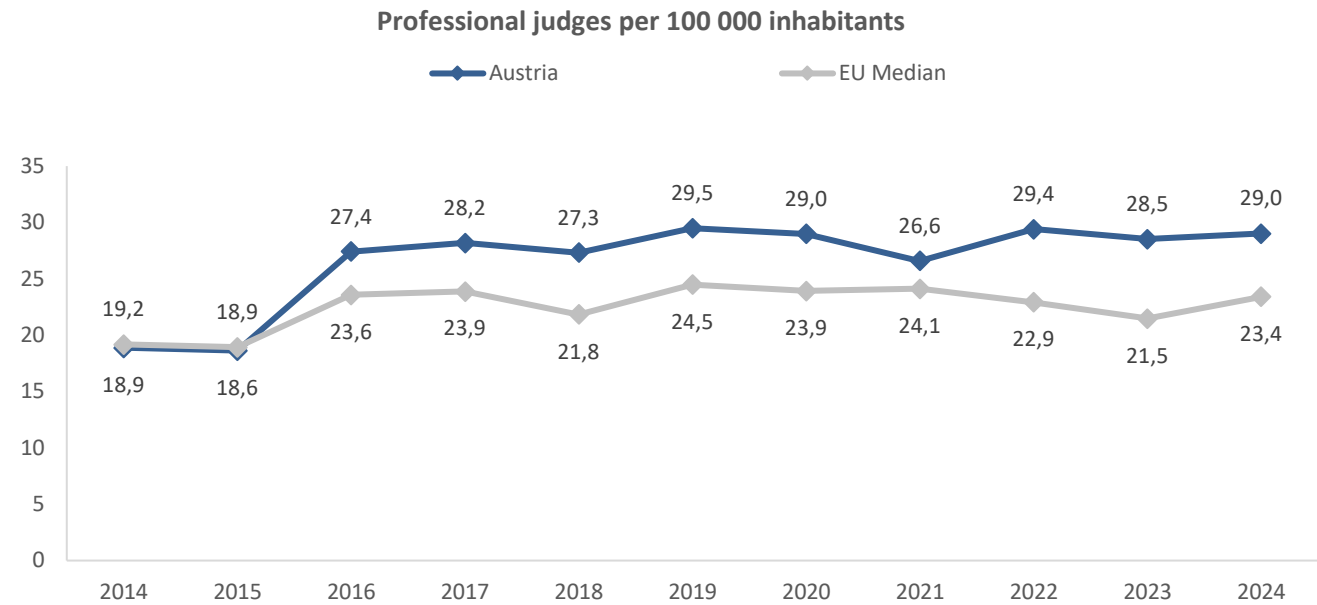

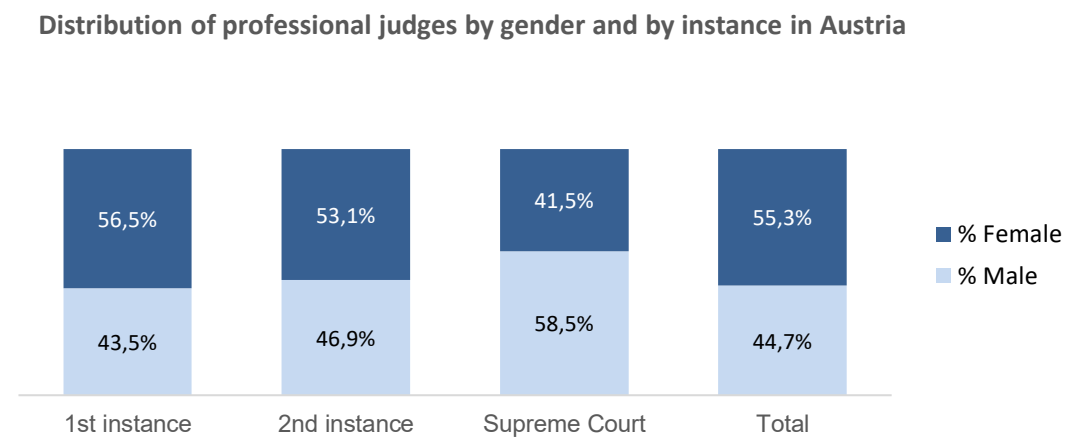
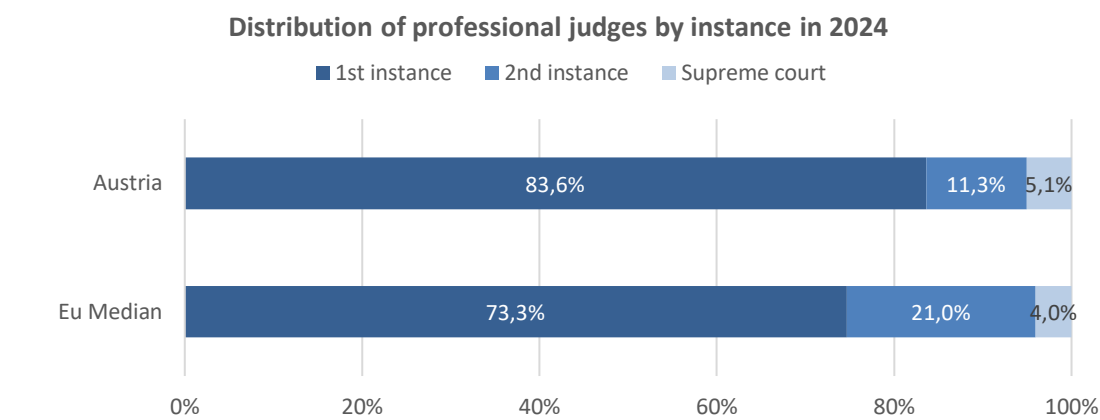


According to the 2024 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Austria is 2 670, which is 2,1% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Austria, there are 29,0 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants).

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 477, which represents 55,3% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 2 232 are sitting in the first instance courts (of whom 1 260 are female); 303 are sitting in the second instance courts (of whom 161 are female) and 135 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of whom 56 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, Austria has more first instace judges than the EU median, while the second instance judges are less numerous than the EU median.

In Austria, the way judges are assigned to different levels of the judiciary has some unique features. First-instance judges work in District Courts, some Regional Courts, and Administrative Courts. Second-instance judges work in some Regional Courts and Courts of Appeal. At the highest level, judges serve in the Supreme Court and the Supreme Administrative Court.

As regards the distribution Male/Female, it has to be specified that female judges constitute the majority at first and second instance, but not at the level of the Supreme court.

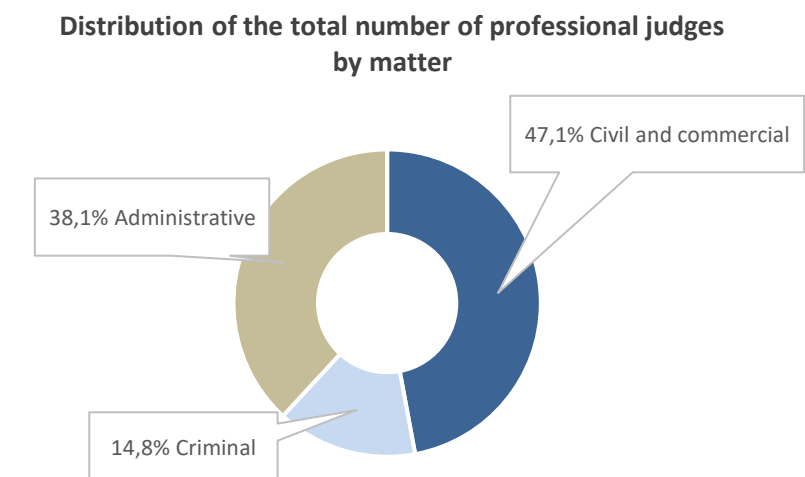

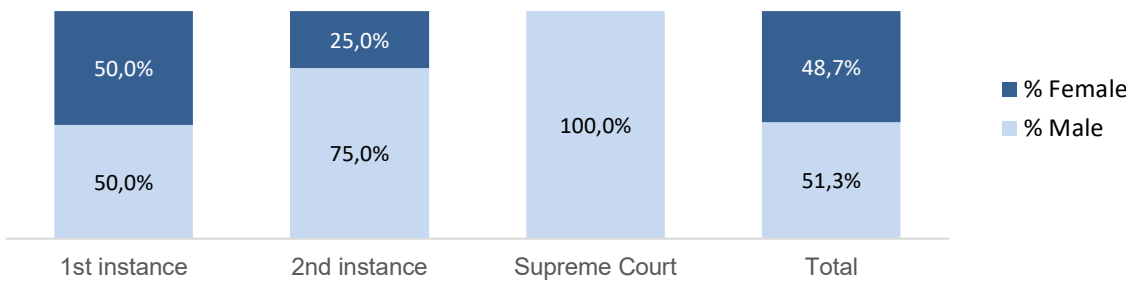

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Austria

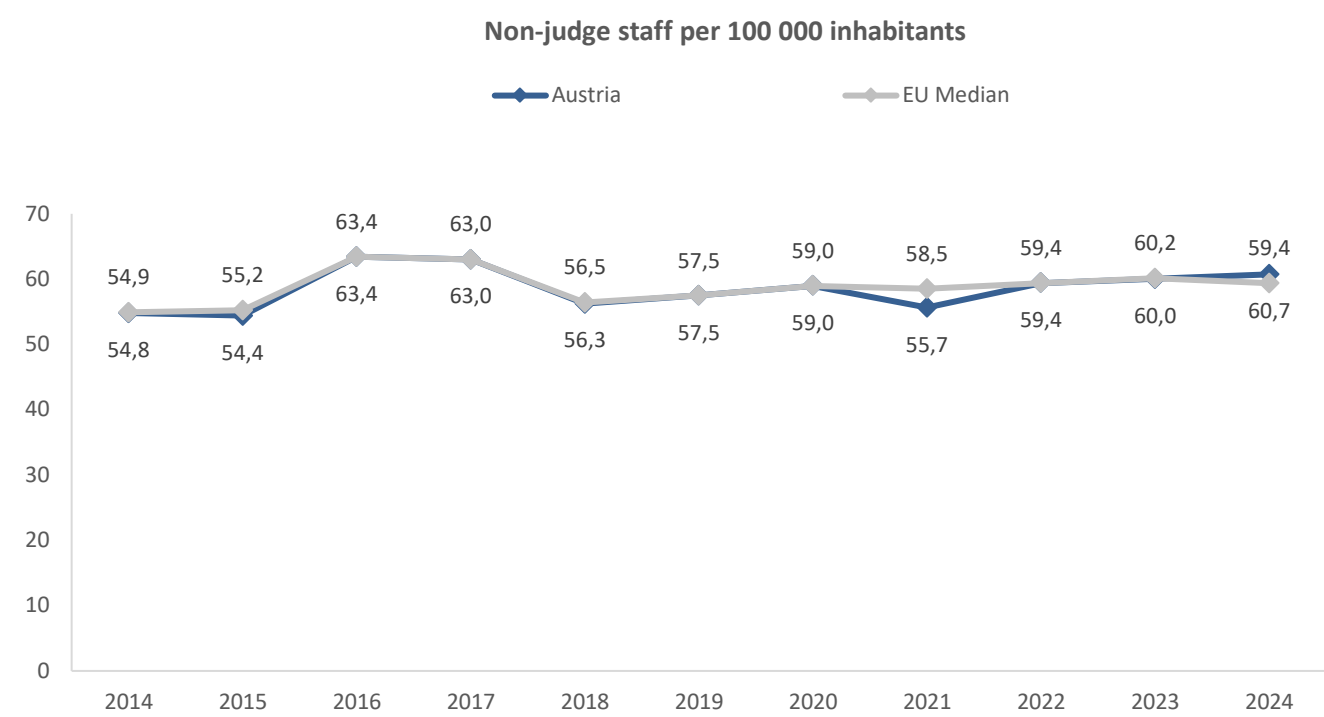


In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 73, which represents 48,7% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 144 are sitting in first instance courts (of whom 72 are female); 4 are sitting in second instance courts (of whom 1 is female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of whom none are female).

In 2024, Austria has 5 585 non-judge staff (of whom 4 024 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 1,6%.

In 2024, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 60,0 in 2023 to 60,7 in 2024).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 28,5 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2023 to 29,0 in 2024.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

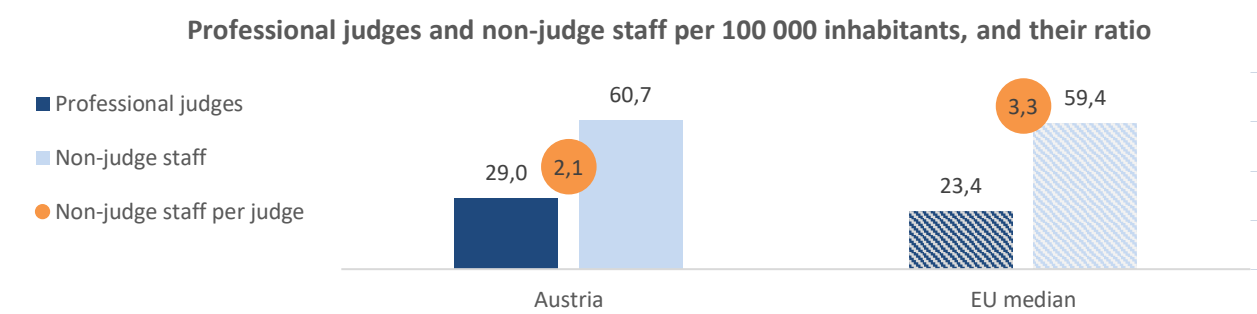
- 698 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among whom 460 are female);
- 771 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of whom 533 are female);
- 3 534 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of whom 2 637 are female);
- 107 technical staff (of whom 38 are female);
- 475 other (of whom 356 are female);

Starting from 2021, the “Kanzlei” who are responsible for handling of case files are no more counted as “other staff” but as “staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the management of the courts”. Moreover, starting from 2021, “technical staff” also includes staff working at the courts’ IT departments. “Other staff” only includes trainees (including trainees for Rechtspfleger) and staff representation. The trainees concerned are nearly all trained for the handling of case files. A small number of trainees is trained for IT-support. Generally speaking, in the last years, efforts were made to enhance the methodology of presentation of data for Q52 and ensure better compliance with the CEPEJ categorisation.

Non-judge (judicial) staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (case preparation, assistance during the hearing, helping to draft the decisions) - since last year, case managers are counted within this category by the competent department.

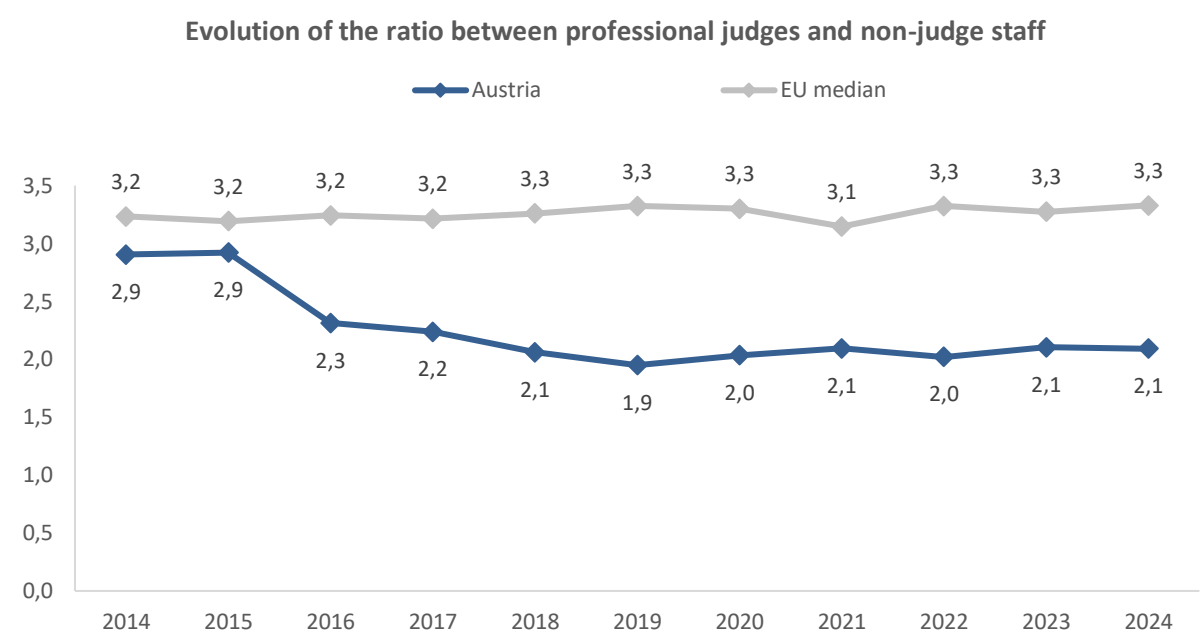

In Austria, there are 29,0 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 23,4 judges per 100 000 inhabitants) and about 2,1 non-judge staff per judge. There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 2,1 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

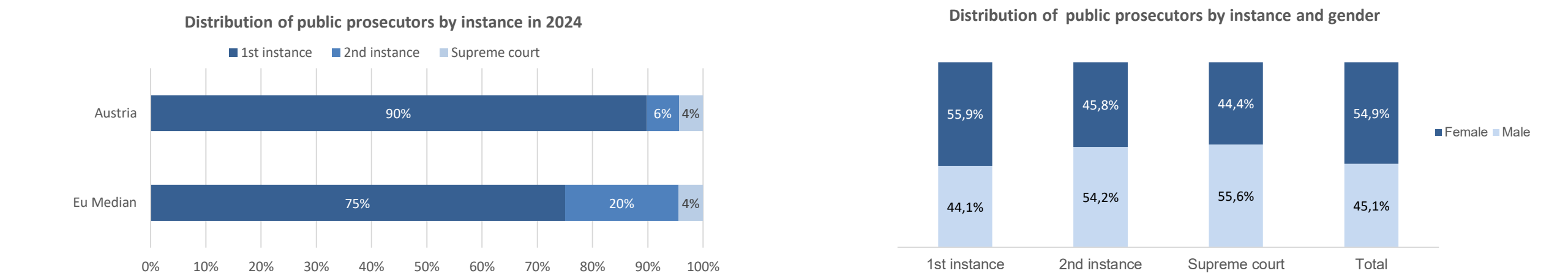

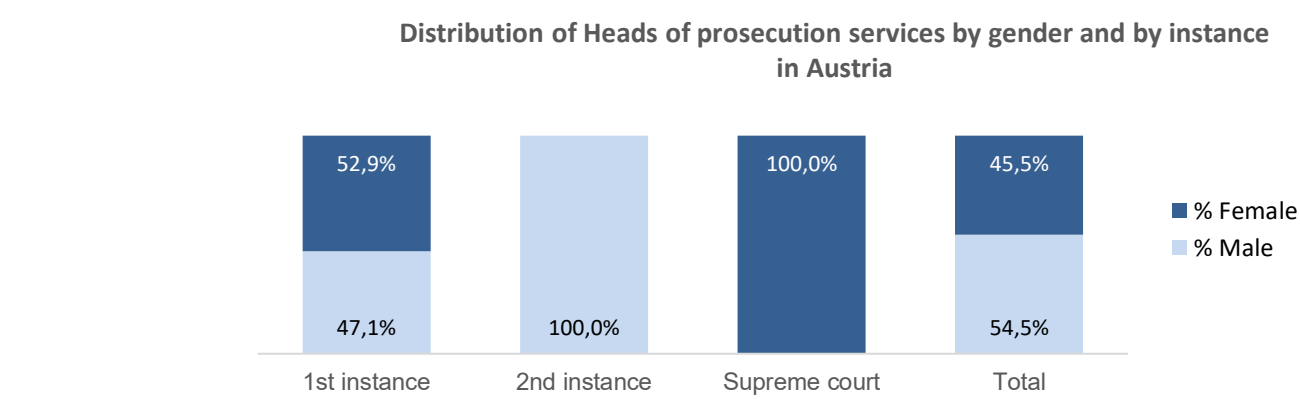
In this cycle, the total number of Female prosecutors (all instances) is 226, which represents 54,9% of the total number of prosecutors. The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 370 in first instance (of whom 207 are female); 24 are in second instance (of whom 11 are female) and 18 in final instance (of whom 8 are female).

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors constitute the majority only at first instance.

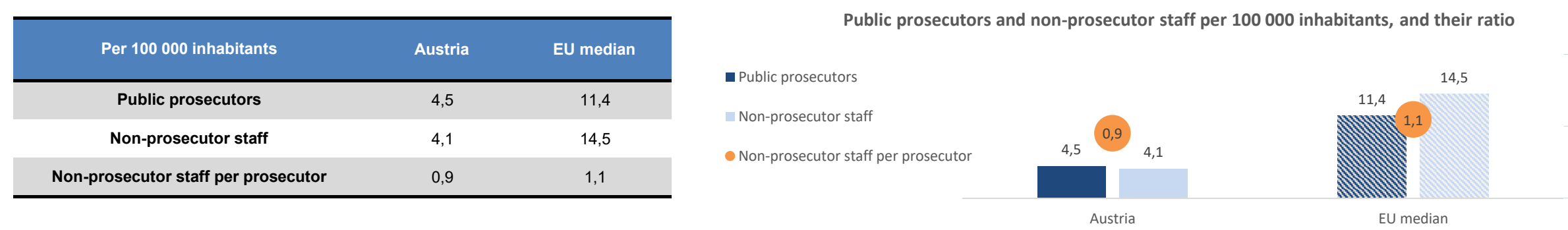

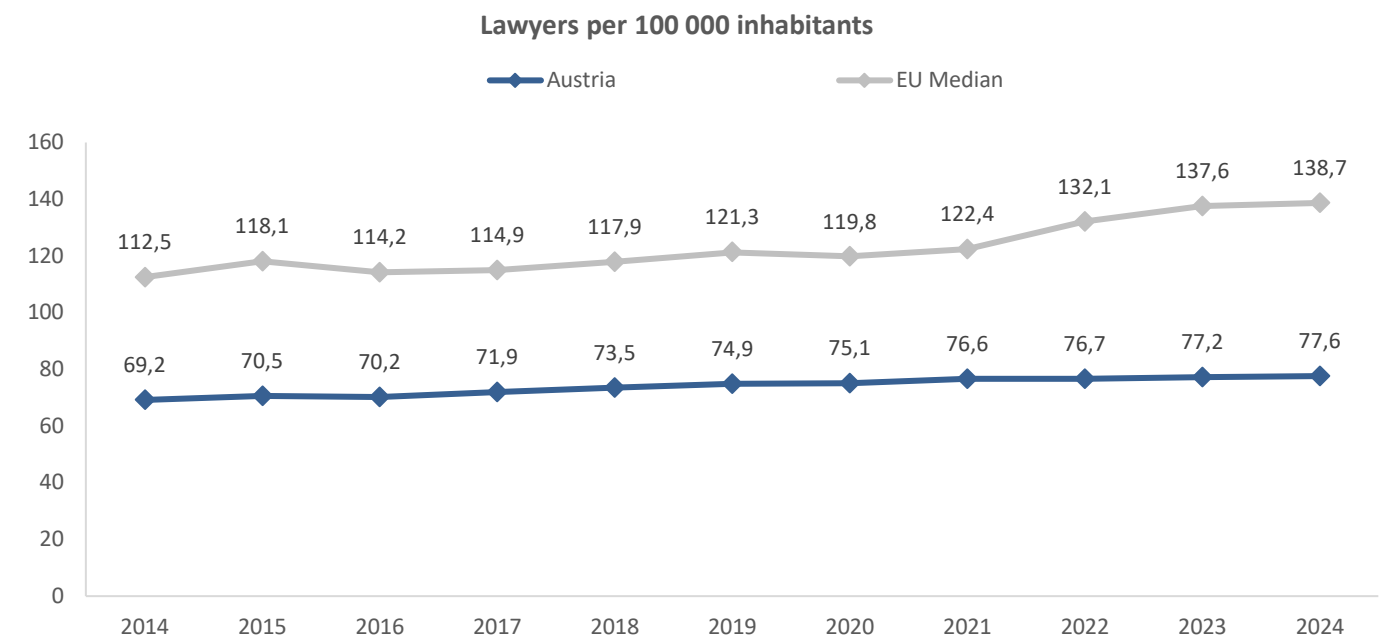
Ratio between non-prosecutor staff and public prosecutors

In 2024, there are 7 138 lawyers, which is 0,9% more than in 2023.

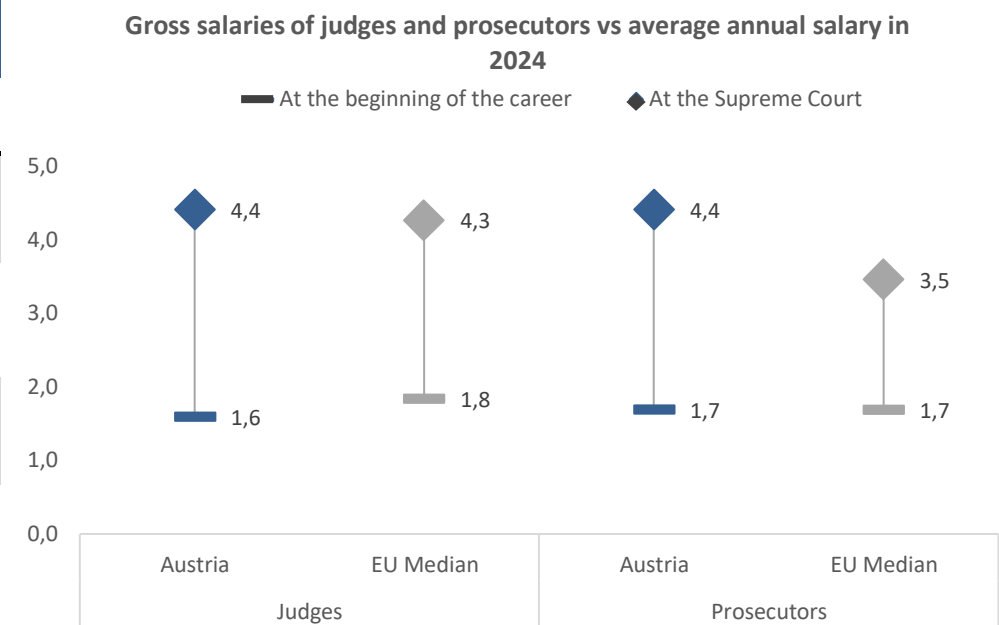
There are 1 828 female lawyers which is 26% of the total.

Austria has 77,6 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 138,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 153 676€.

According to the 2024 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Austria is 69 222€, which is rather above the EU median of 61 347€ (13% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,6 times higher (the EU median is 1,8).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 54 719€ to 298 911€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 58% above the EU median of 121 591€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 043€ to a maximum of 106 135€.

In 2024, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Austria of 73 426€ is quite above the EU median of 52 969€ (39% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 51 013€ and the maximum is 254 088€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 103% above the EU median of 94 385€.

Judges and prosecutors are assigned to specific pay grades based on their position within the judicial system (e.g., regional courts, supreme court, administrative courts) and receive a corresponding base salary as stipulated in § 66 RStDG and § 190 RStDG, with salaries increasing every four years by a fixed amount up to a maximum.

Senior roles, such as heads of district courts, vice presidents or presidents of courts of first instance, and heads of senior or regular public prosecutor's offices, are entitled to a service allowance ranging from EUR 171.90 to EUR 1,332.30 (as of December 31, 2022), which is included in the monthly salary.

In principle, the salary covers all additional work performed by judges and prosecutors in terms of both volume and time.

For administrative courts, a first-instance professional judge at the start of his/her career earns a gross annual salary of EUR 86,440 (net EUR 55,850), while a judge of the Administrative Supreme Court earns approximately EUR 150,000 gross annually.

Judges/prosecutors are first placed into a certain pay grade according to their position within the judiciary system (e.g. regional courts, supreme court, administrative courts etc.), where they receive the according base salary (§ 66 RStDG / § 190 RStDG). Every four years the salary increases by a fixed amount up until a certain maximum. Additionally there are several bonuses for advanced functions such as leading positions.

The highest possible salary of a judge of the Supreme Administrative Court is EUR 195.000.

The Public Authority’s Liability Act (Amtshaftungsgesetz) governs the liability of the state and other legal entities for the misconduct of their employees when exercising public authority.

This includes liability for damages caused during court proceedings and decisions, such as those arising from undue delays, wrongful arrests, or wrongful convictions. Liability under the Act requires proof of both wrongfulness and fault. However, in cases of wrongful arrest or criminal conviction, compensation may also be sought under the Penal Law’s Compensation Act (Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz), which does not require proof of fault by the authorities.

Procedures for claiming compensation are outlined in §§ 8 ff. Amtshaftungsgesetz and §§ 9 ff. Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz. An injured party may, free of charge, request the legal entity responsible for the damages to issue a written statement within three months, indicating whether the claim is accepted, partially accepted, or rejected. If the claim is denied in whole or in part, the injured party retains the right to file a complaint in court.

The regional court (Landesgericht) responsible for civil matters in the jurisdiction where the legal infringement occurred has exclusive jurisdiction over such claims. Compensation is financed from the general budget of the Public Authority, and liability is unlimited. Indemnities are provided exclusively in monetary form, with no fixed tariffs or standardized compensation amounts. Instead, the compensation awarded depends on the specific circumstances of each case, including the extent of the damage suffered and the degree of fault attributed to the Public Authority.

According to § 67 of the Code of Criminal Procedure (CCP), victims are entitled to seek reimbursement for damages caused by a criminal act or compensation for the impairment of their legally protected interests. The extent of the damage or impairment must be determined ex officio, using the results of the criminal proceedings or through simple additional investigations. If an expert is appointed to assess bodily injuries or health-related damages, they must also evaluate the periods of pain experienced by the victim. The payments according to the Public Authority’s Liability Act, European Convention on Human Rights and the Penal Law’s Compensation Act cannot be quantified regarding the different circumstances. Only the total amount of the payments can be provided. On this basis the payments according to the Public Authority’s Liability Act and the European Convention on Human Rights in the area of the courts were: € 524.788,14 and those according to the Penal Law’s Compensation Act were € 434.686,04 in 2024. The decrease of payments of more than 20% compared to the previous year is due to the fact that those payments are based on decisions by independent courts, which cannot be controlled by the judicial administration and are subject to strong fluctuations.

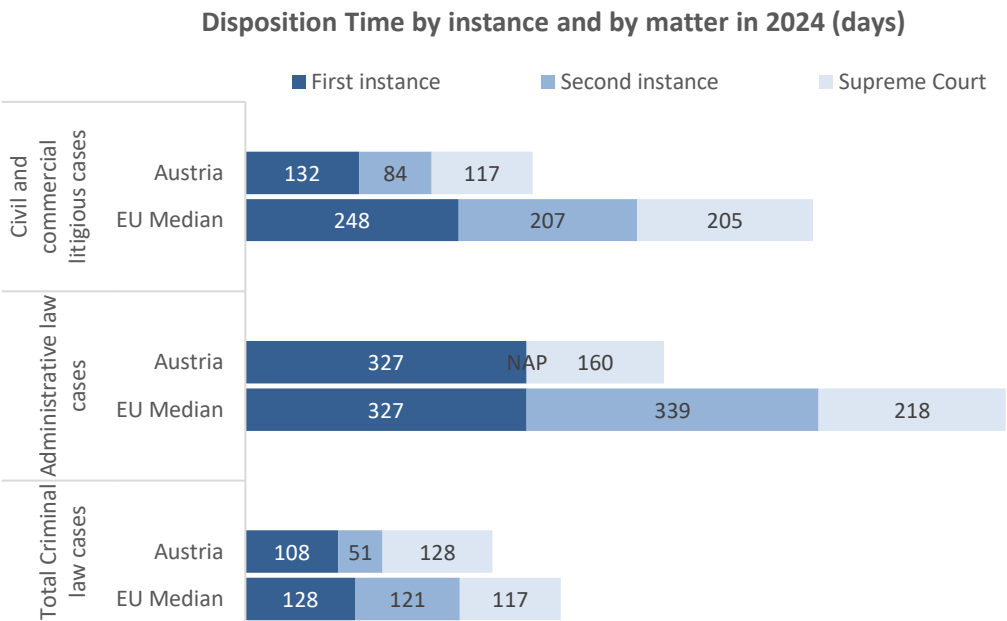
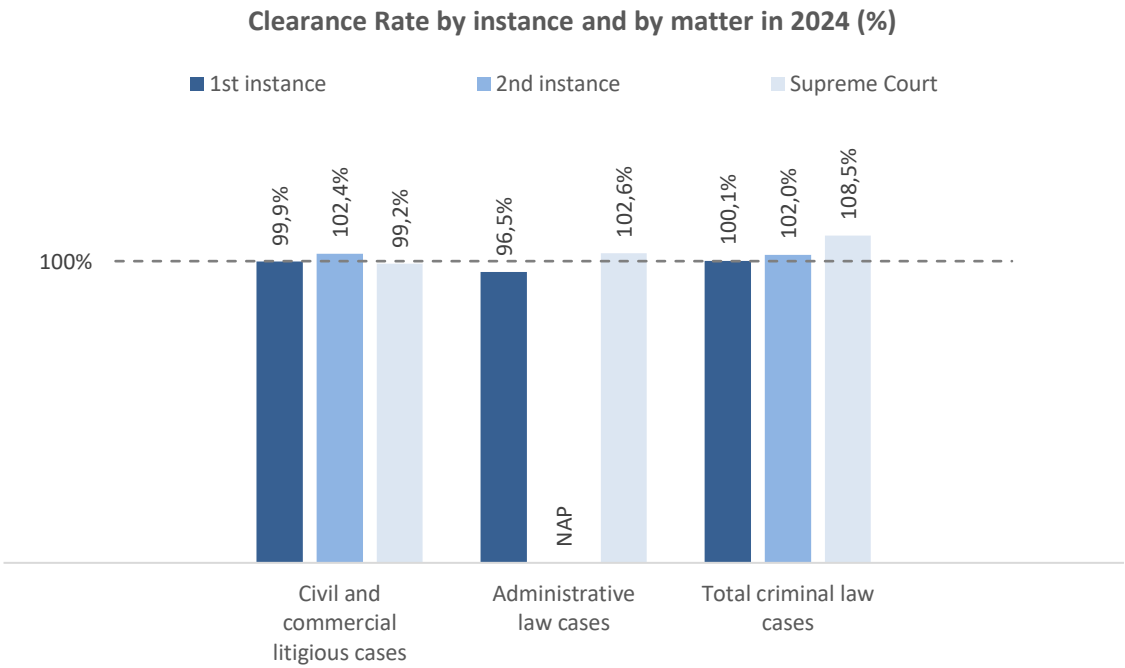

In 2024, Austria recorded the shortest duration for criminal proceedings (287 days for all the three instances together), consistent with the trend observed across the European Union.

Notably, civil proceedings in Austria were almost as brief as criminal ones, with an average duration of 333 days, significantly shorter than the EU mediane.

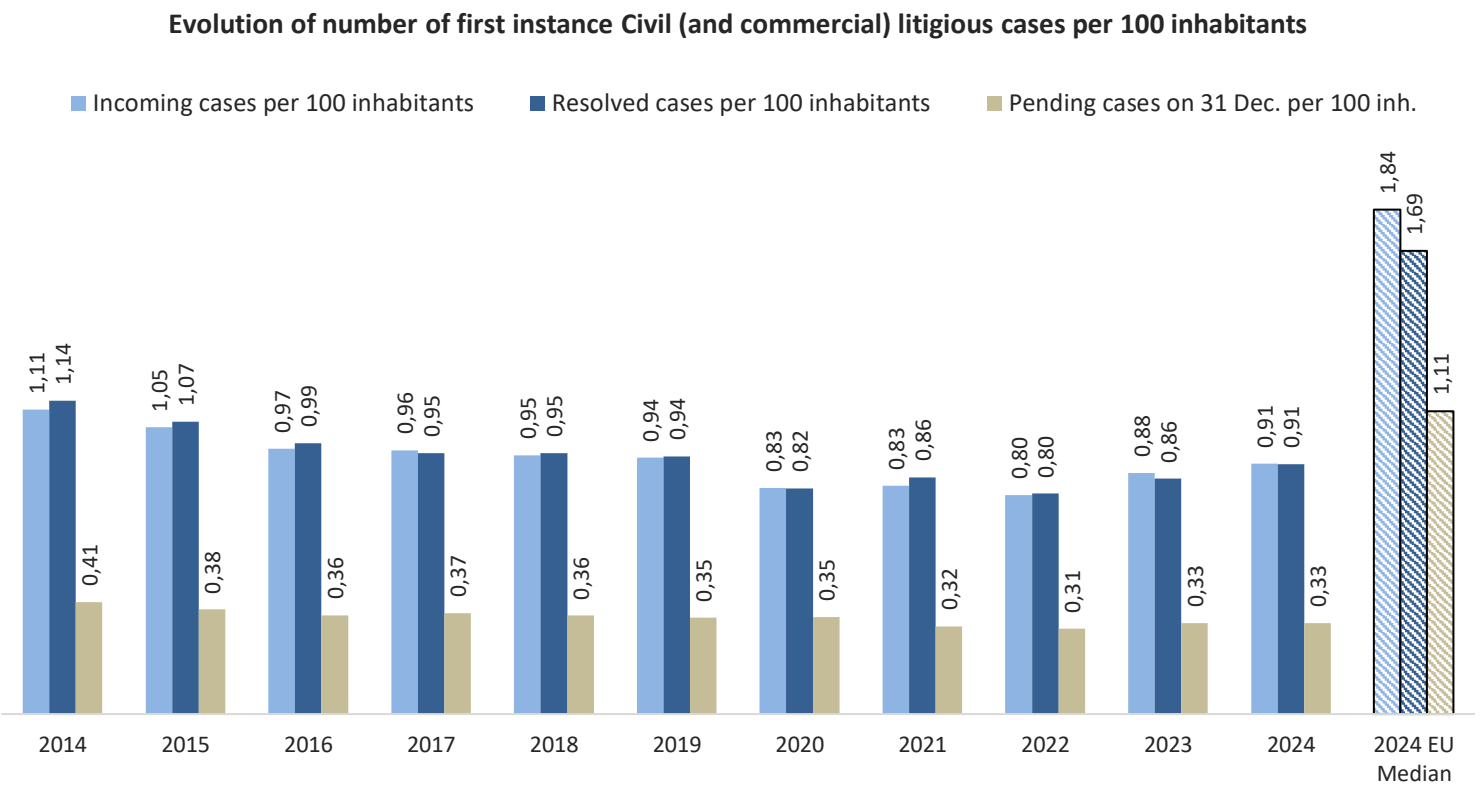
As in the EU, administrative proceedings in Austria were the longest among the three categories (criminal, civil, and administrative), but their duration was nearly half the EU median of 884 days. This can be attributed to Austria's two-instance system for administrative matters, consisting of a first and a final appellate instance.

Overall, in 2024, Austria's Clearance Rate exceeded the 100% benchmark in third instance administrative law cases, all instances in criminal, and in second instance civil and commercial matters. Meanwhile, the Disposition Time indicator was below EU medians across most categories, except for third-instance criminal cases, where it slightly surpassed the median. In this regard, it should be recalled that Austria presents the peculiarity to encompass in the total number of third instance criminal cases data on administrative criminal cases before the Supreme Administrative Court.

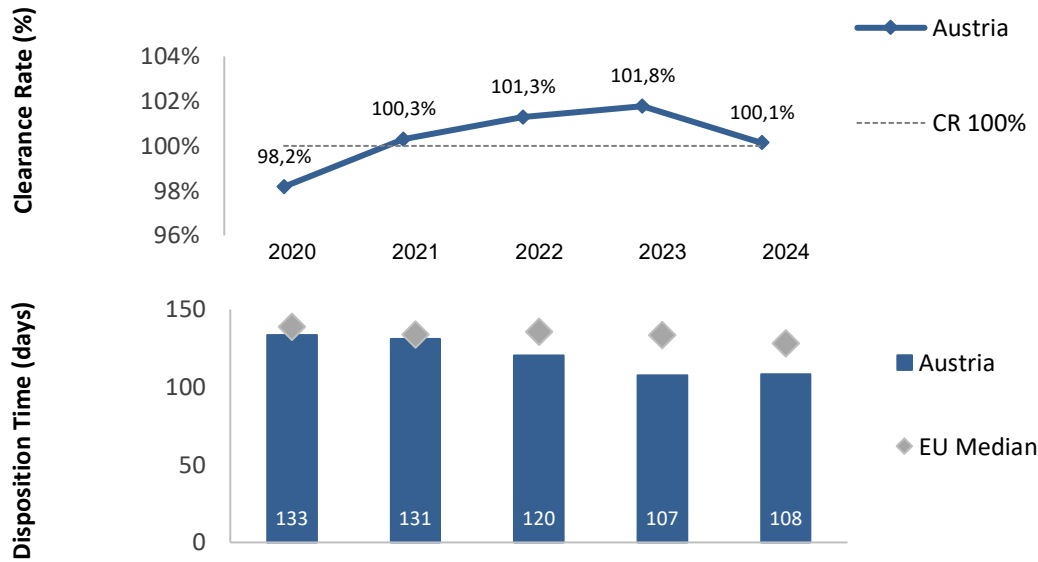

In 2024, there are 1 820 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 19,8 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants.

The variation of the number of mediators between 2023 and 2024 is about 4,1%.

To become a registered mediator in Austria, an individual must meet the following requirements: 1) be at least 28 years old, 2) have completed appropriate mediation-specific training in accordance with the relevant regulations (ZivMediat-AV), 3) demonstrate trustworthiness, and 4) maintain professional liability insurance with a minimum coverage of €400,000. Applicants must submit a written application to Austria's Ministry of Justice, along with documentation proving that these criteria have been met. Once registered, mediators are required to pay a fee of €345 for the first five years and again every ten years thereafter to maintain their registration.

Comments on writing assistance tools

An electronic case file system is used for the administration of investigative and court proceedings at public prosecutor's offices and courts. The case file system enables users to store, organise and structure documents as well as to use templates to create and sign documents electronically. Files can also be uploaded to the electronic case file. These files may also be dictated using speech-to-text applications, such as Dragon.

Templates for LibreOffice are made available to all users. In addition, users can also create their own templates, so-called "structured short orders" for registry instructions and other tasks, using text modules and custom text samples. Automatically generated text is generally created by workflow rules and not by LLM-based artificial intelligence. LLM-based artificial intelligence is used for the anonymisation of documents.

Regarding the Administrative Courts, not all functions are available in all the courts.

Comments on recording of court hearings

Administrative: Numbers are for the Federal Administrative Court only. The others do not have tools for recording hearings yet.

In recent years, the rate at which recording solutions have been deployed has steadily increased, and these systems are now implemented throughout the entire judicial system. Consequently, there are very few areas remaining where such solutions are not utilised—provided their application is considered appropriate. Notably, in criminal cases, audiovisual recordings of hearings are primarily employed, whereas in civil and administrative proceedings, dictation devices are predominantly used. These devices enable decision-making bodies to summarise and record the session in a concise protocol.

Description for the ordinary courts and the Federal Administrative Court:

Each court is equipped with a video recording system; additionally, decision-making bodies and court clerks may use mobile audio recording devices to document court proceedings. Audio and video files may be electronically entered into the case file and transmitted electronically to the parties. The automatic transcription of audio tracks using AI (including time stamps, speaker identification, etc.) is currently under evaluation. The decision whether to produce a summary protocol or a verbatim transcript lies with the decision-making body.
