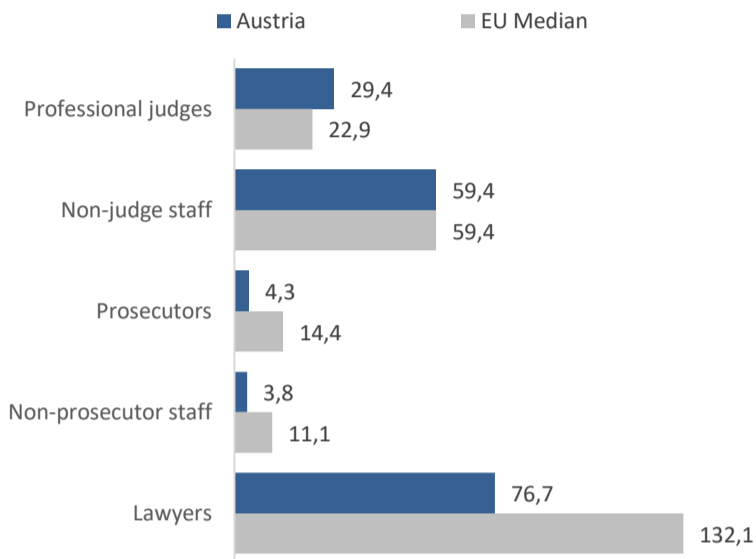

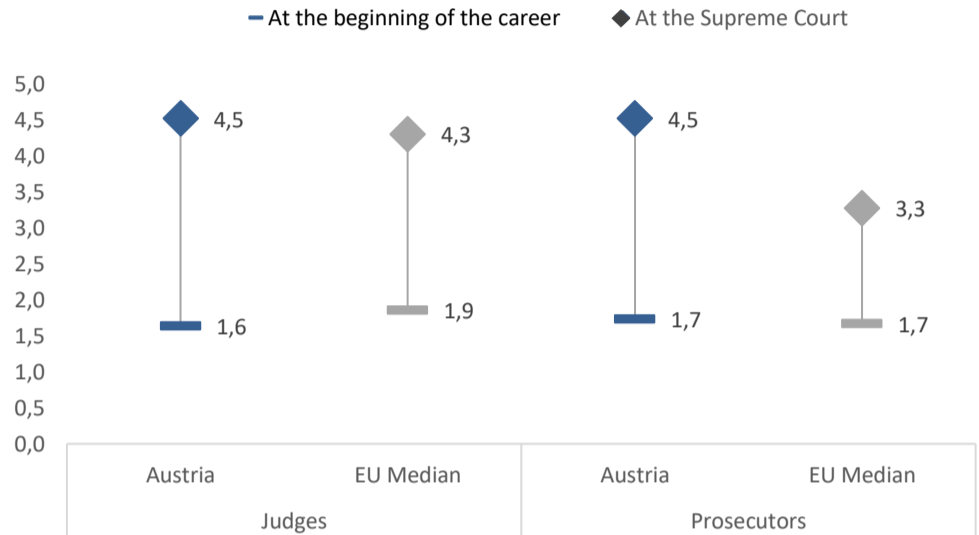

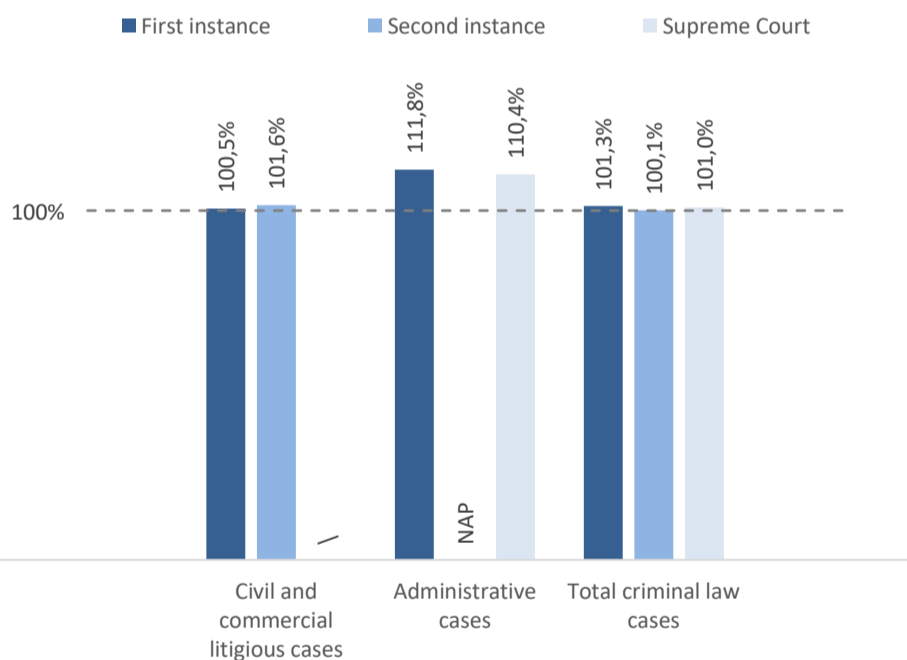


Gross salaries of judges and prosecutors vs average annual salary in 2022

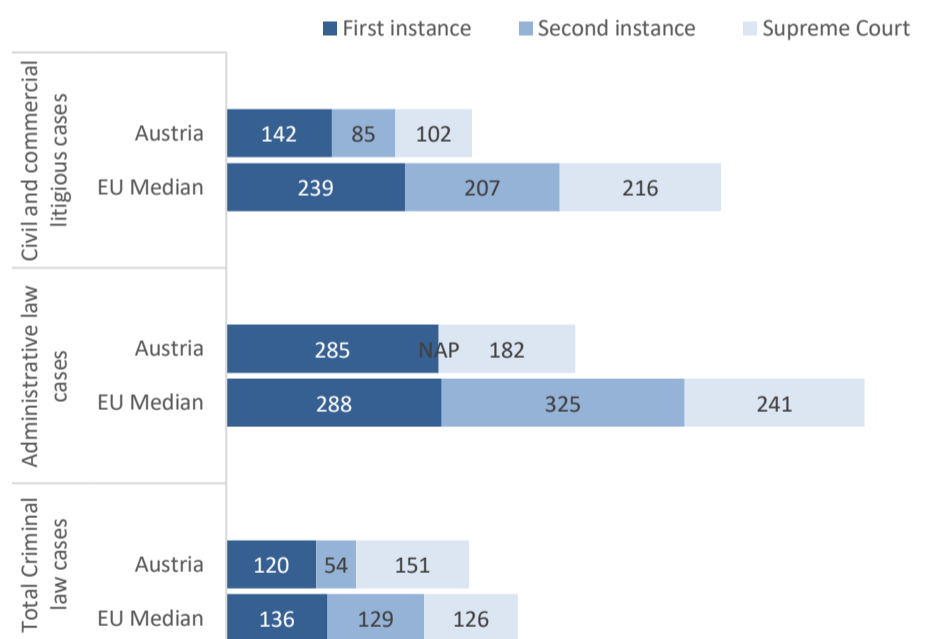

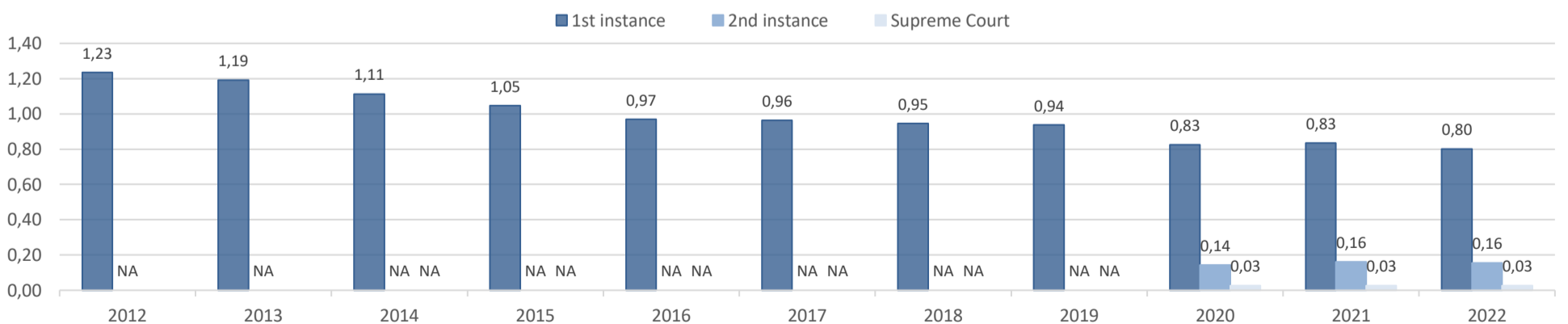


Disposition Time by instance and by matter in 2022 (days)

1. Judicial organisation in Austria (2022 data)

In 2022 in Austria, the number of courts considered as legal entities is 152. Namely, there are 133 courts of general jurisdiction and 19 specialised courts.

Among the 133 legal entities of general jurisdiction, 128 act at first instance, 4 at second instance and one at third instance.

More precisely, the 115 District courts and the 13 Regional courts of general jurisdiction intervene as first instance courts. It is noteworthy that the 7 other regional courts that have specialised jurisdiction are not taken into consideration here, but are counted as specialised first instance courts (infra). It is to be mentioned that the peculiarity of the 20 Austrian Regional courts is that even though these are first instance courts, some of them are also competent in respect of appeals against District courts' decisions.

The 4 Higher Regional Courts have appeal competence in respect of all civil and criminal cases.

The Supreme court is the highest instance court in civil and criminal matters.

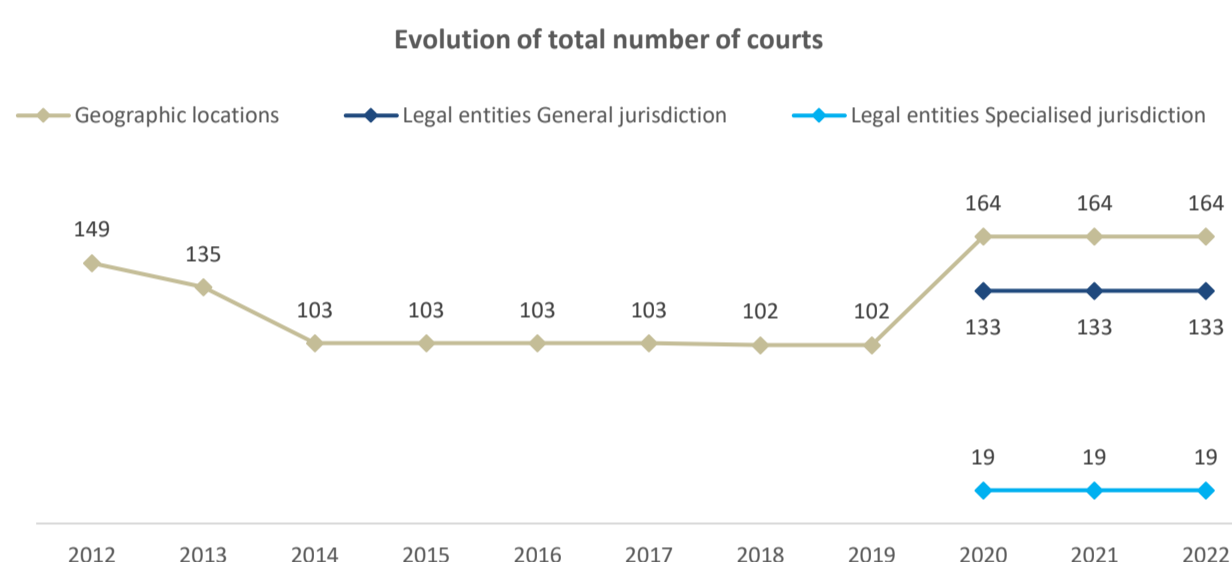
Among the 19 legal entities of specialised jurisdiction, 18 are of first instance and are competent for all legal matters not reserved to District courts. Within this total we have the 7 Regional courts of specialised competence.

The Supreme Administrative court is the highest instance in administrative matters.

In terms of geographic locations, there are 164 courts among which 158 are of first instance.

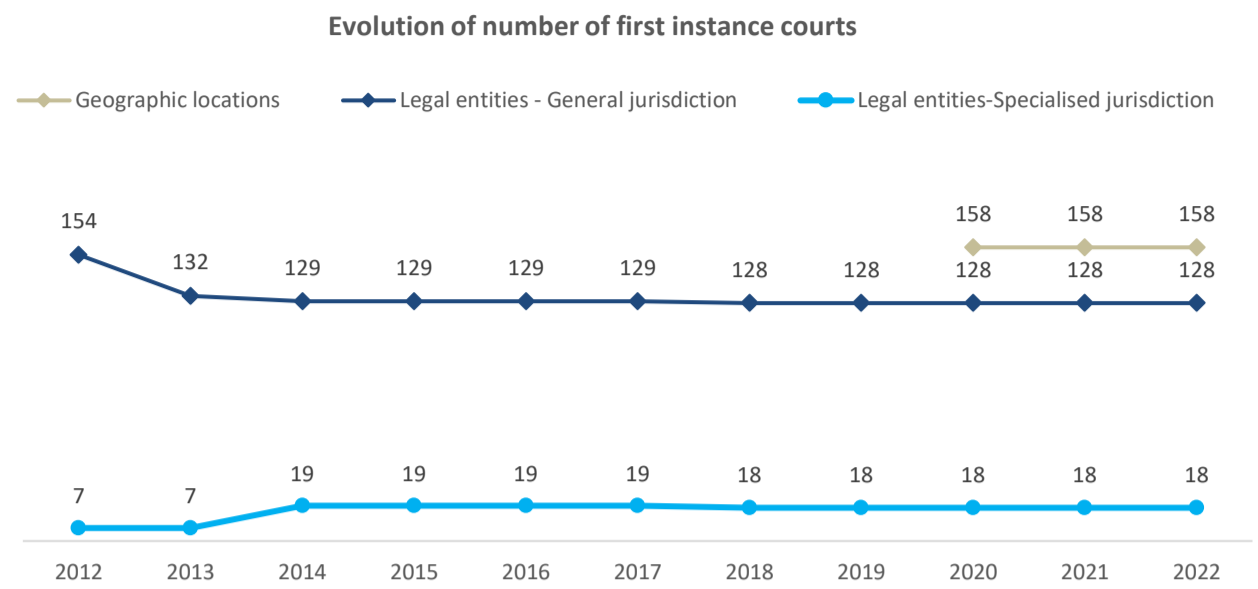

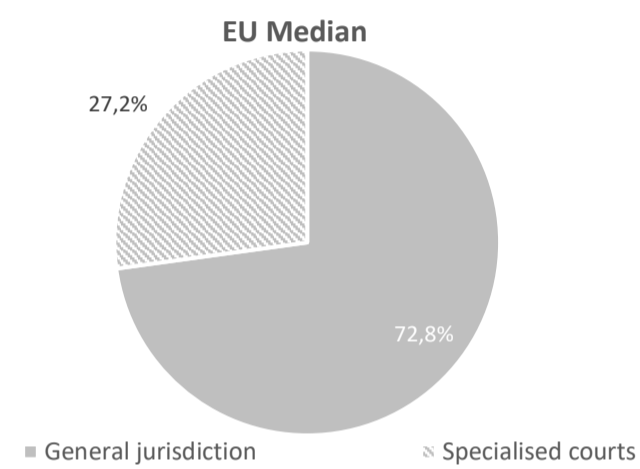
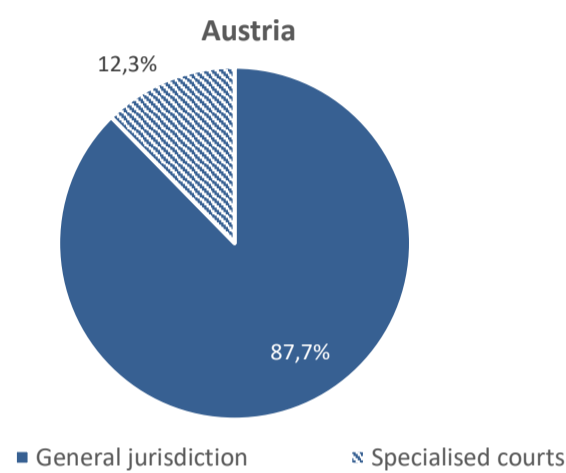

The distribution between first instance general jurisdiction courts and first instance specialised courts in Austria is 87,7% - 12,3% which is close to the distribution tendency in EU: 72,8% - 27,2%.

As a rule every court has to deal with all judicial issues; in the biggest Austrian cities certain courts are specialised, i.e. six in Vienna (civil cases, criminal cases, commercial cases [2 x], labour and social welfare cases, administrative cases) and two in Graz (civil cases, criminal cases). Since there are special courts for civil law cases in Vienna and Graz, which cannot be selected individually here, and because of the Court for labour and social welfare cases in Vienna (Arbeits- und Sozialgericht Wien) that is competent for labour and (some) social welfare cases, the sum of the individual courts does not correspond to the total number of specialised courts.

The two "other specialized first instance courts" are the two civil law courts (in Vienna and Graz), while the two specialised criminal courts also located in Vienna and Graz are specialised on the enforcement of criminal sanctions.

It is noteworthy that one commercial court in Vienna, both courts (in Vienna and Graz) specialised on civil cases and both courts (in Vienna and Graz) specialised on the enforcement of criminal sanctions also act as second instance courts.

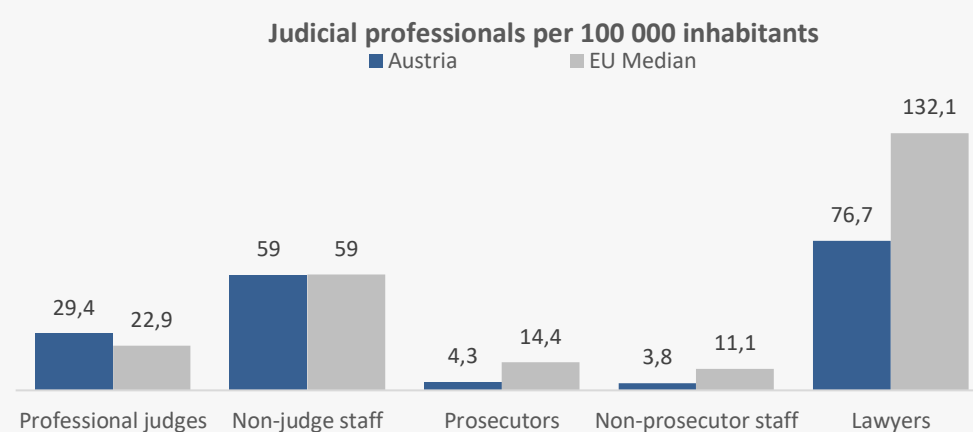
From January 1st, 2014 there are 11 newly found courts for administrative law in Austria, namely 9 regional administrative courts, 1 Federal administrative court and 1 Federal Tax Court.

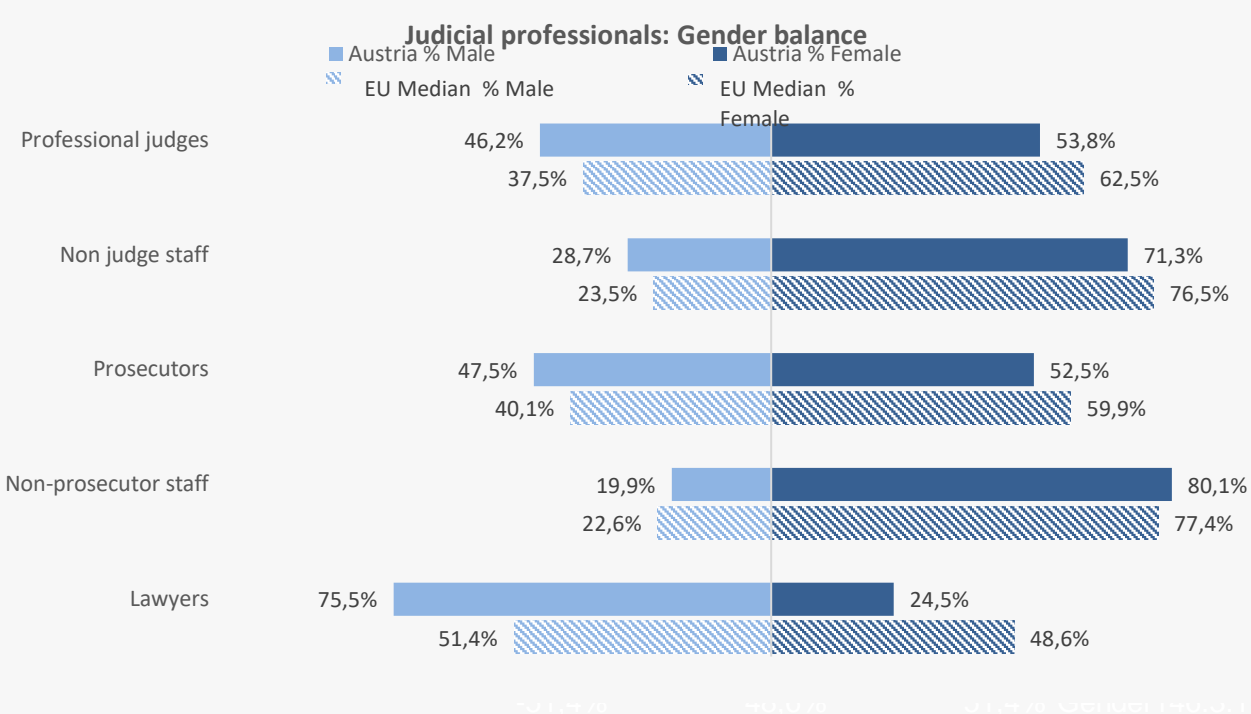

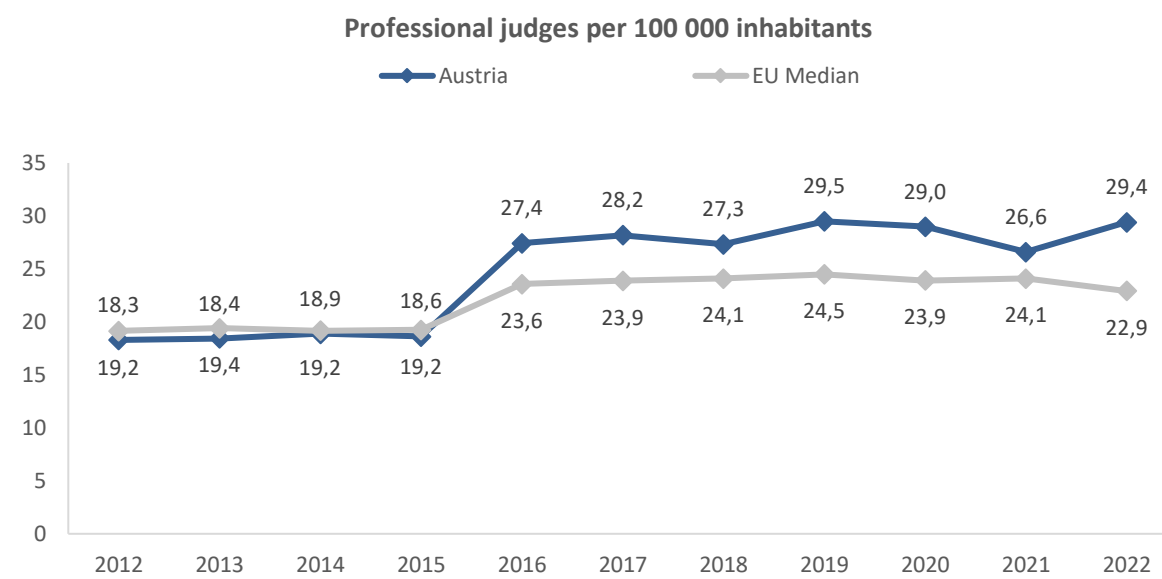

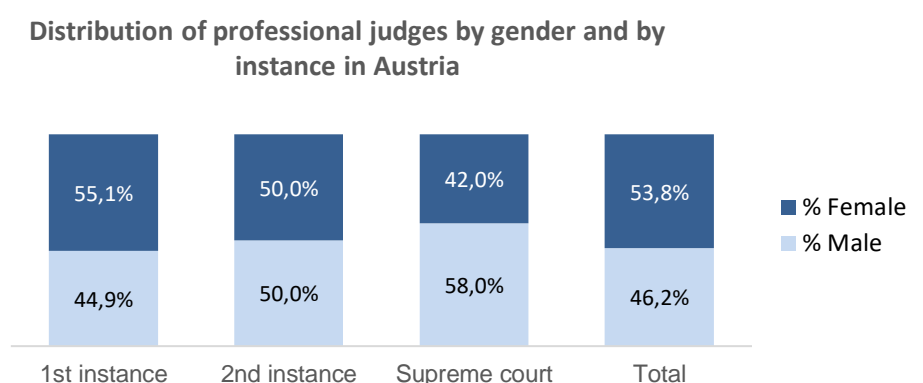
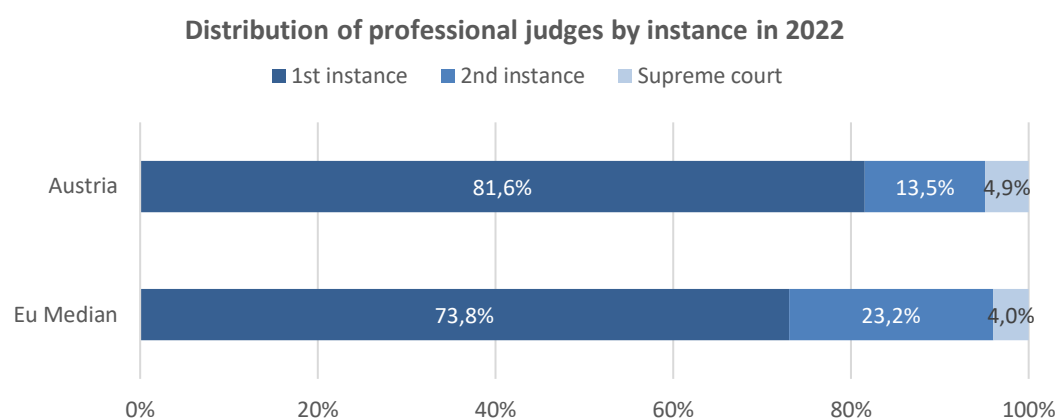


According to 2022 data, the total number of professional judges sitting in courts (all instances) in Austria is 2 677, which is 12,1% more than in previous cycle.

More precisely, in Austria, there are 29,4 professional judges per 100 000 inhabitants (this figure is above the EU median of 22,9 judges per 100 000 inhabitants)

In this cycle, the total number of female professional judges (all instances) is 1 440, which represents 53,8% of the total number of judges.

The total number of judges is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 2 184 are sitting in the first instance courts (of which 1 204 are female); 362 are sitting in the second instance courts (of which 181 are female) and 131 are sitting at the Supreme Court (of which 55 are female).

Compared with the EU distribution of professional judges per instance, a similar trend is to be noticed in Austria as in the European Union.

As regards the distribution of the number of judges among the different judicial instances, Austria presents some peculiarities which should be mentioned. Namely, the first instance judges sit in District and partly regional courts as well as in administrative courts. The second instance judges sit in partly regional courts and Courts of appeal. The last instance includes judges sitting in the Supreme Court and the Supreme Administrative Court.

As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that, female judges constitute the majority at first and second instance, but not at the level of the Supreme court.

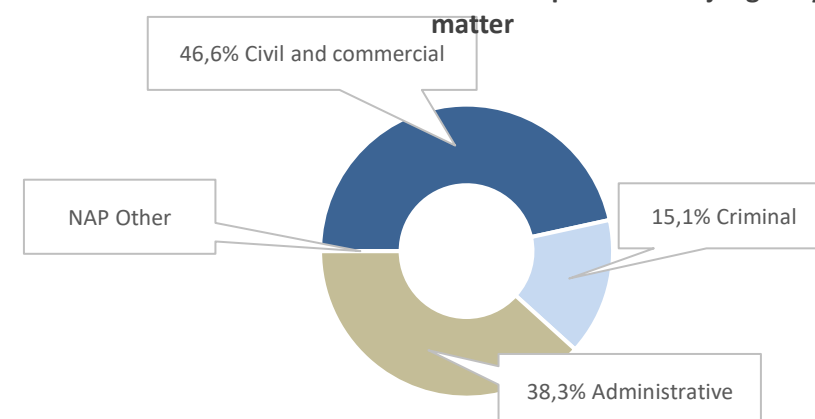

Distribution of the total number of professional judges by matter

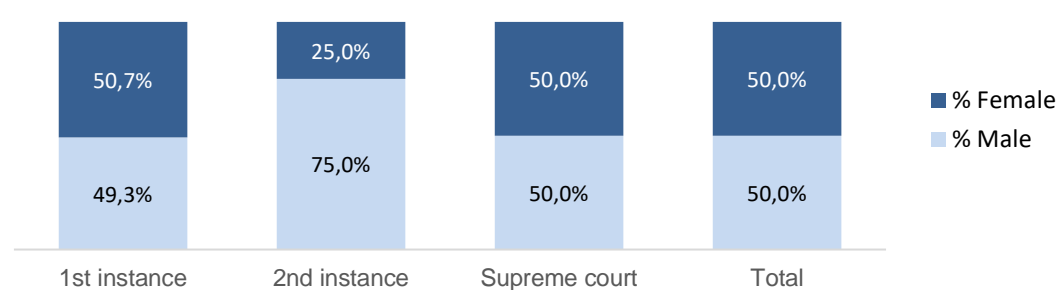

Distribution of court presidents by gender and by instance in Austria



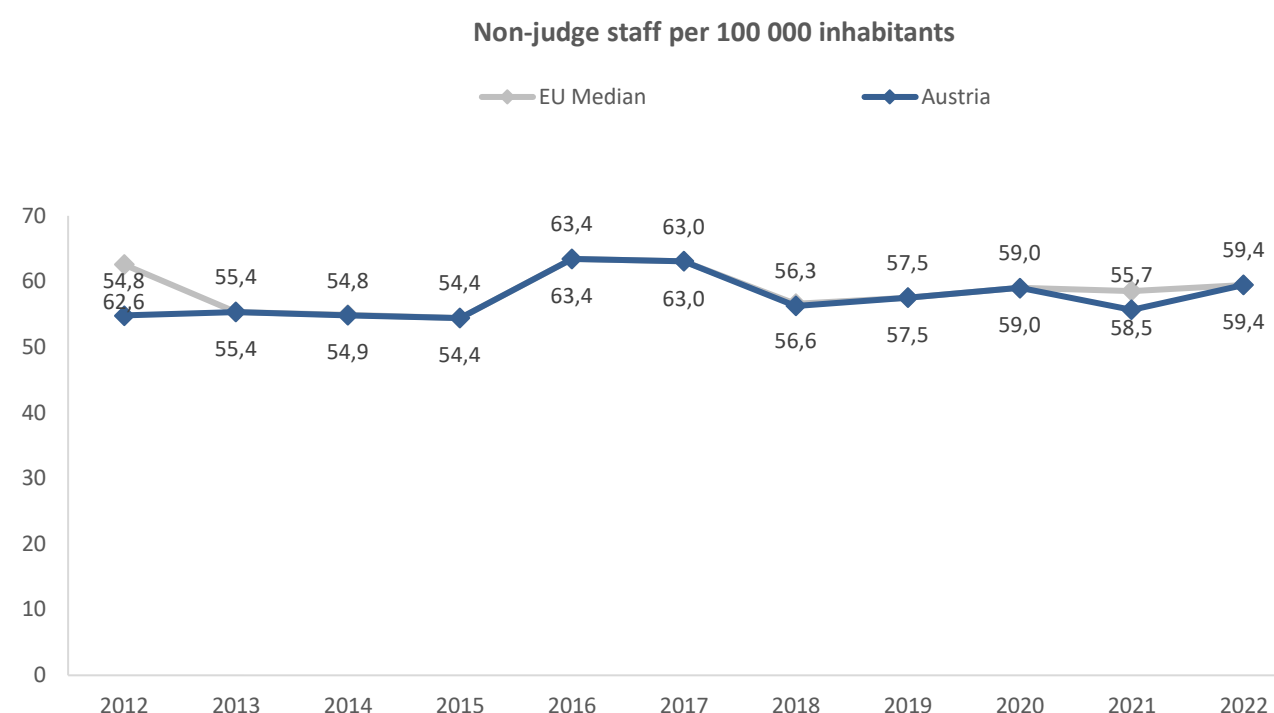
In this cycle, the total number of female court presidents (all instances) is 74, which represents 50,0% of the total number of court presidents.

The total number of court presidents is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 142 are sitting in first instance courts (of which 72 are female); 4 are sitting in second instance courts (of which 1 are female) and 2 are sitting in Supreme Court (of which 1 are female).

Starting from 2022, data correspond to persons exercising the function of court president. Previous data were expressed in full time equivalent.

In 2022, Austria has 5 410 non-judge staff (of which 3 856 are Female). The total number of non-judge staff in comparison with the previous cycle reveals an increase of 8,3%.

In 2022, the number of non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants has increased (from 55,7 in 2021 to 59,4 in 2022).

During the same period, the number of judges per 100 000 inhabitants evolved from 26,6 judges per 100 000 inhabitants in 2021 to 29,4 in 2022.

In this cycle, the non-judge staff is broken down as follows:

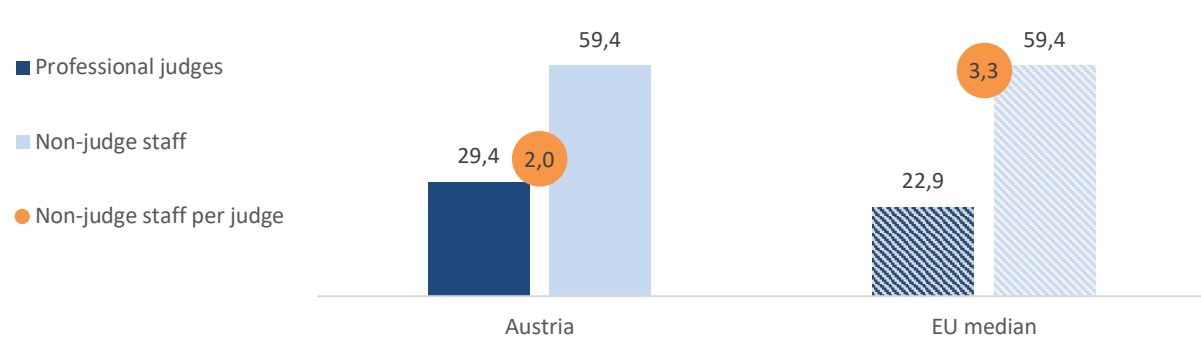
- 721 Rechtspfleger (or similar bodies) with judicial or quasi-judicial tasks having autonomous competence and whose decisions could be subject to appeal (among which 456 are Female);
- 660 non-judge staff whose task is to assist the judges such as registrars (of which 483 are Female);
- 3 552 staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the court management (of which 2 632 are Female);
- 102 technical staff (of which 36 are Female);
- 377 other (of which 249 are Female);

Starting from 2021, the "Kanzlei" who are responsible for handling of case files are no more counted as "other staff" but as "staff in charge of different administrative tasks and of the management of the courts". Moreover, starting from 2021, "technical staff" also includes staff working at the courts' IT departments. "Other staff" only includes trainees (including trainees for Rechtspfleger) and staff representation. The trainees concerned are nearly all trained for the handling of case files. A small number of trainees is trained for IT-support. Generally speaking, in the last years, efforts were made to enhance the methodology of presentation of data for Q52 and ensure better compliance with the CEPEJ categorization.

Professional judges and non-judge staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio



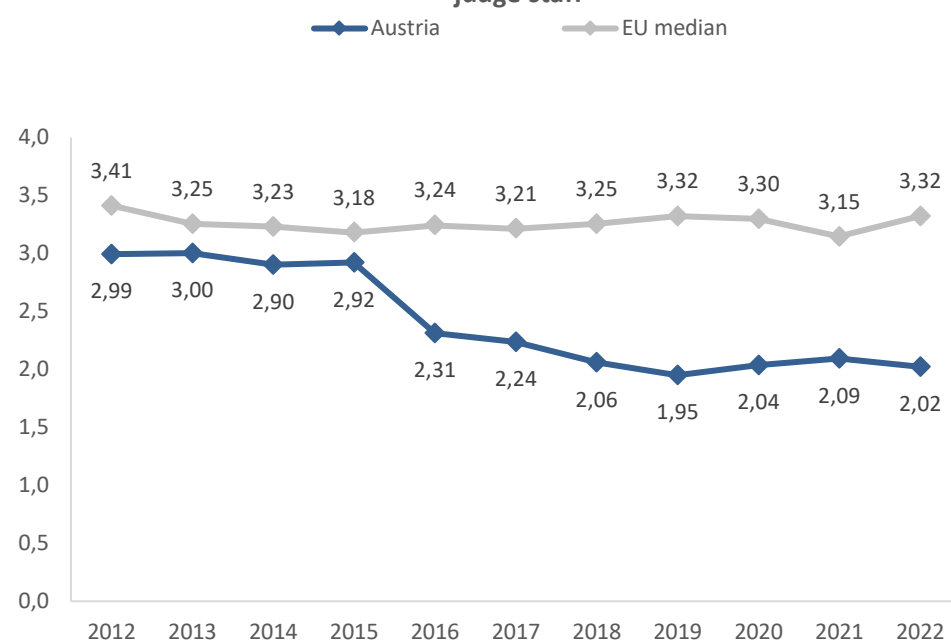

There is no significant difference compared with previous cycle when this ratio was at 2,1 non-judge staff per judge.

Evolution of the ratio between professional judges and non-judge staff

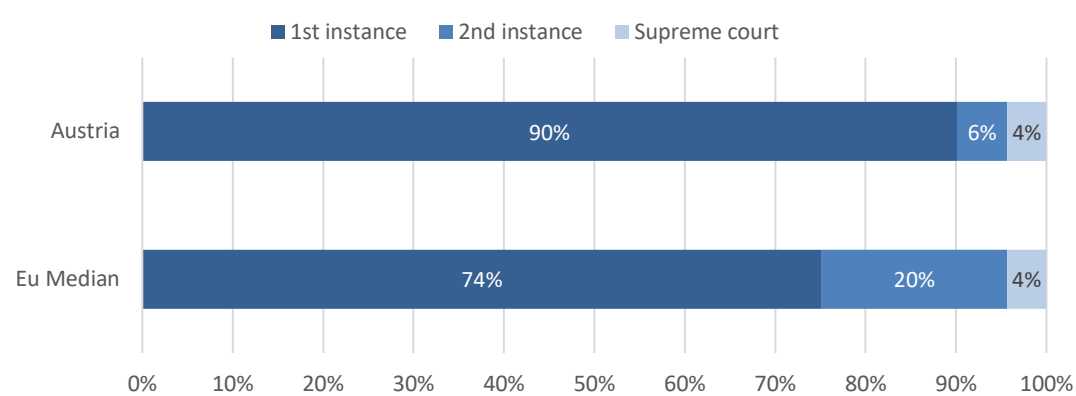

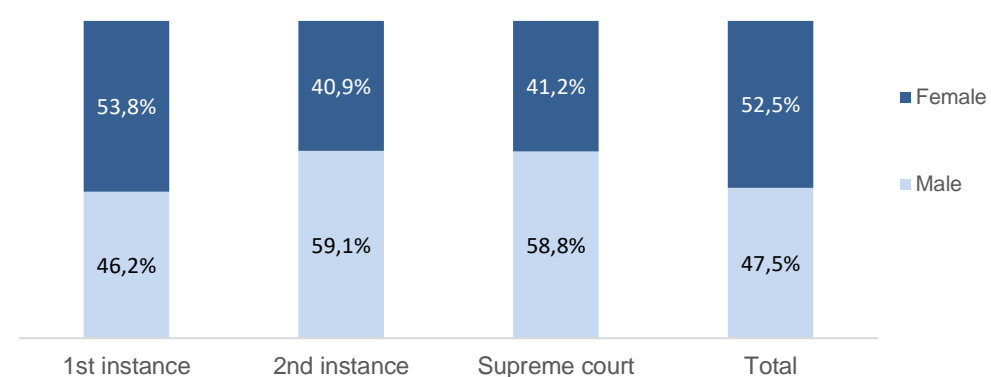

The total number of prosecutors is distributed among the different judicial instances in the following way: 355 in first instance (of which 191 are female); 22 are in second instance (of which 9 are female) and 17 in final instance (of which 7 are female).

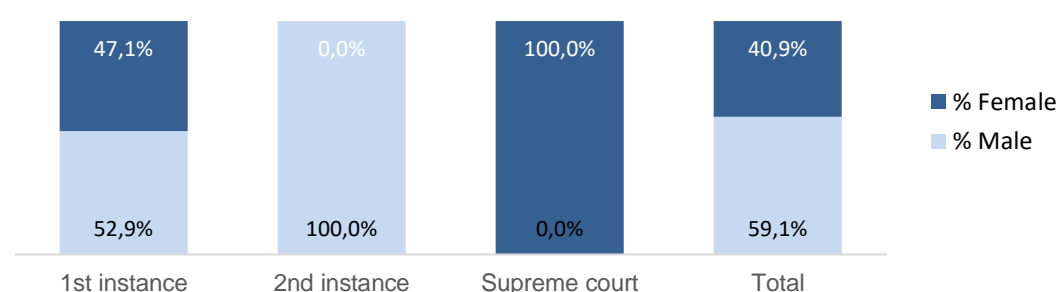
As regards the distribution male/female, it has to be specified that female prosecutors constitute the majority only at first instance.

In this cycle, the total number of female Heads of prosecution (all instances) is 9, which represents 40,9% of the total number of Heads of prosecution.

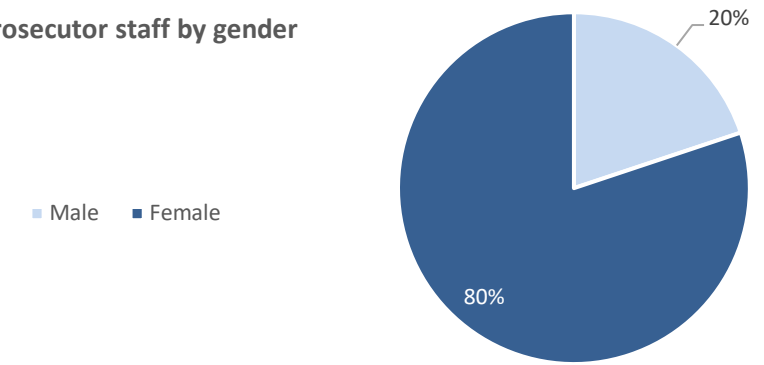

Non-prosecutor staff by gender

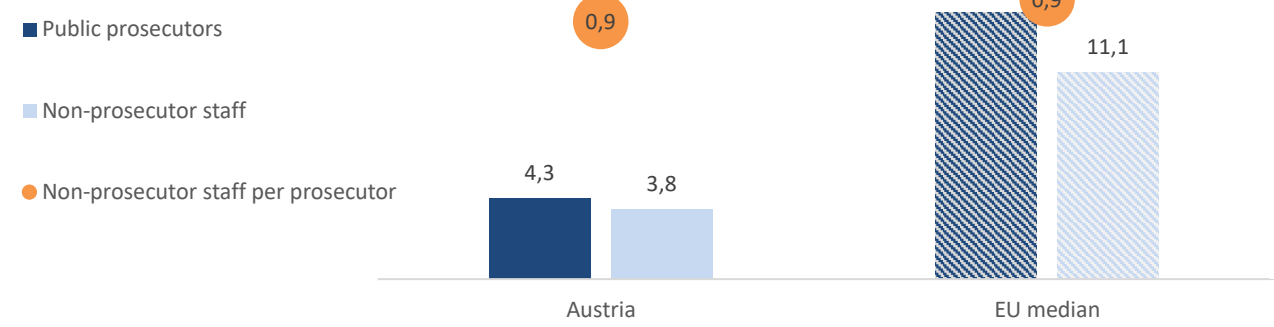

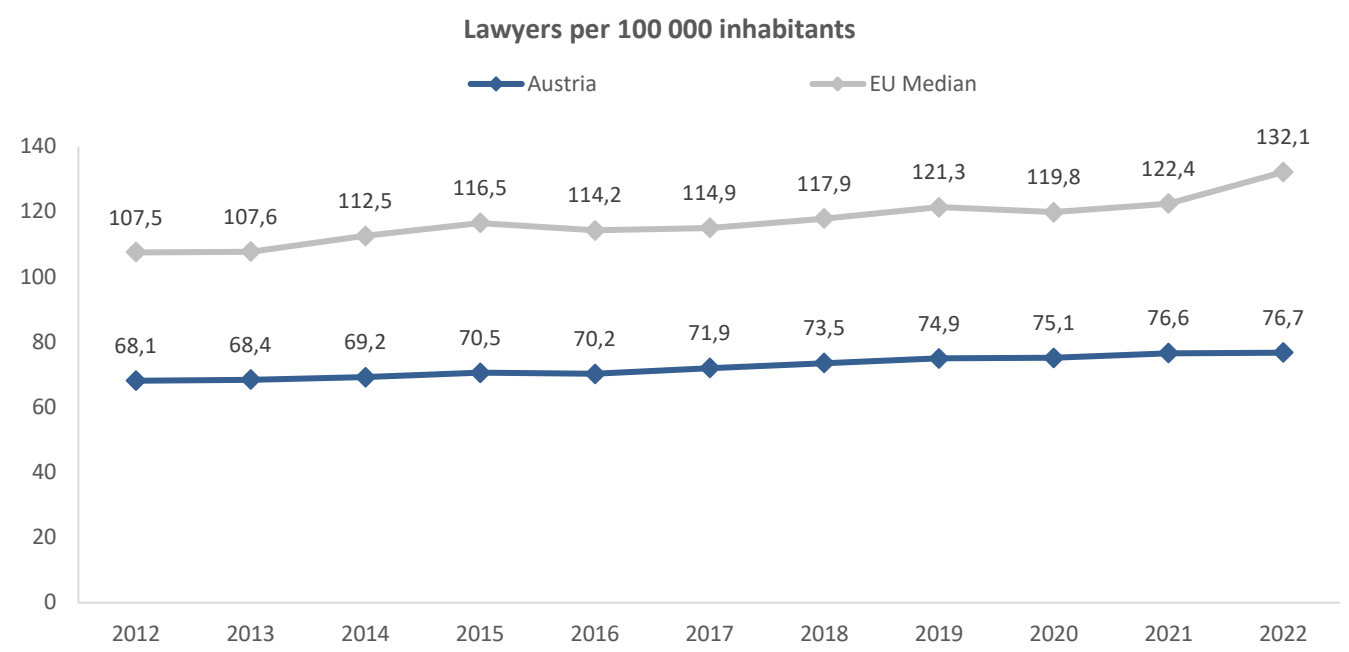
Public prosecutors and non-prosecutor staff per 100 000 inhabitants, and their ratio

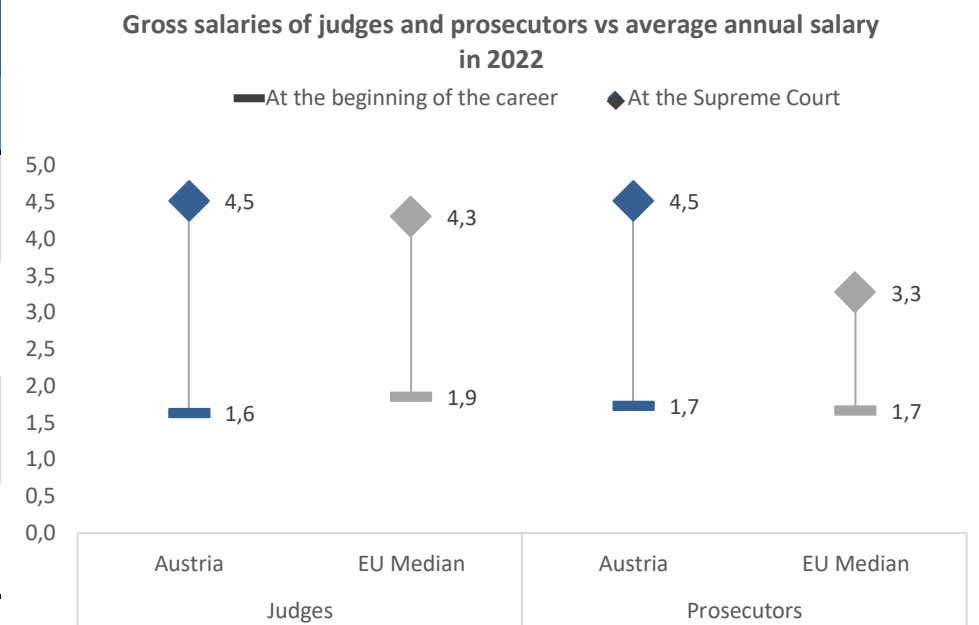
In 2022, there are 6 984 lawyers, which is 1,6% more than in 2021.

There are 1 711 female lawyers which is 24% of the total.

Austria has 76,7 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants, which is below the EU median of 132,1 lawyers per 100 000 inhabitants.

In the European Union, the absolute gross salary for a judge at the beginning of career ranges from a minimum of 26 931€ to a maximum of 140 244€.

According to 2022 data, the absolute gross salary of a judge at the beginning of his/her career in Austria is 59 188€, which is slightly above the EU median of 54 224€ (9% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a judge at the beginning of his/her career is 1,6 times higher (the EU median is 1,9).

At the highest level, the range of the EU absolute gross salary for a judge is from 53 144€ to 261 648€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for judges at the highest level is 54% above the EU median of 106 533€.

For the public prosecutors, the range for the absolute gross salary at the beginning of career is from a minimum of 24 609€ to a maximum of 96 084€.

In 2022, the absolute gross salary of a public prosecutor at the beginning of his/her career in Austria of 62 782€ is rather above the EU median of 48 728€ (29% above).

Compared with the annual average salary in the country, the salary for a public prosecutors at the beginning of his/her career is 1,7 times higher (the EU median is 1,7).

At the highest level, the minimum absolute gross salary for prosecutors in the European Union is 44 880€ and the maximum is 194 005€. Austria's absolute gross salaries for prosecutors at the highest level is 88% above the EU median of 87 247€.

Judges/prosecutors are first placed into a certain pay grade according to their position within the judiciary system (e.g. regional courts, supreme court, administrative courts, etc.), where they receive the according base salary (§ 66 RStDG / § 190 RStDG). Every four years the salary increases by a fixed amount up until a certain maximum. Judges and public prosecutors in certain senior positions, such as the head of a district court, the vice president or president of a court of first instance or the head of a senior public prosecutor's office/public prosecutor's office, are entitled to a service allowance (between EUR 171.90 and EUR 1332.30 as at 31 Dezember 2022). The service allowance is part of the monthly salary. The service allowance is part of the monthly payment together with the salary.

In principle, it could be stated that the salary covers all additional work performed by judges and public prosecutors in terms of quantity and time.

The Public Authority's Liability Act (Amtshaftungsgesetz) provides for liability of the state (and other legal entities) for misconduct of their employees in the exercise of public authority, including court proceedings and court decisions, causing damage to persons or property by excessive length of proceedings, wrongful arrest and/or wrongful condemnation. The liability presupposes both wrongfulness and fault. In the case of wrongful arrest or wrongful criminal condemnation, compensation can also be obtained according to the Penal Law's Compensation Act (Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz) without proving fault of the Authorities. The compensation procedure is laid down in para. 8 ff. Amtshaftungsgesetz and para. 9 ff. Strafrechtliches Entschädigungsgesetz. The injured person may demand – free of costs - of the legal entity against which the claim for damages is to be raised to forward her/him within a three months' term a written statement indicating as to whether it accepts or partially or totally rejects the claim for damages. If the claim is partially or totally rejected, the complaint can still be filed at court.

The exclusive jurisdiction over the claim of the injured person against the legal entity rests in the first instance with the regional court (Landesgericht) in charge of civil matters in whose range of jurisdiction the infringement of law occurred. Compensation is funded by the Public Authority's general budget. The liability is unlimited, indemnity is to be paid in terms of money only. To make sure that compensation is paid following the concrete circumstances of each individual case, there is no such thing as a daily tariff or a flat compensation sum. The amount of compensation depends solely on the magnitude of damage suffered by the victim and the degree of fault attributable to the Public Authority.

According to sec 67 CCP victims have the right to claim reimbursement for the damage caused by the criminal act or compensation for the impairment of their legally protected interests. The extent of the damage or the impairment has to be established ex officio as far as this can be done on the basis of the results of the criminal proceeding or with the help of additional simple investigations. If for the assessment of a bodily injury or damage to the health of a person an expert is appointed, he/she also has to be requested to establish the periods of pain.

The payments according to the Public Authority's Liability Act, the European Convention on Human Rights and the Penal Law's Compensation Act cannot be quantified regarding the different circumstances. Only the total amount of the payments can be provided. On this basis the payments according to the Public Authority's Liability Act and the European Convention on Human Rights in the area of the courts were 458.891,35 Euro and those according to the Penal Law's Compensation Act were 593.651,96 Euro in 2022.

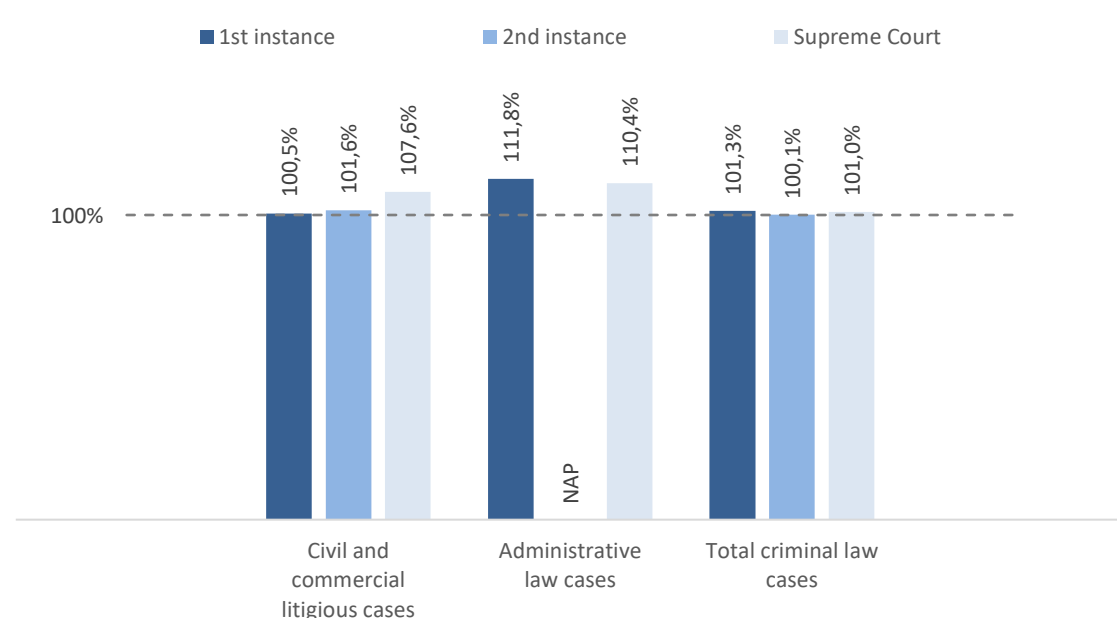

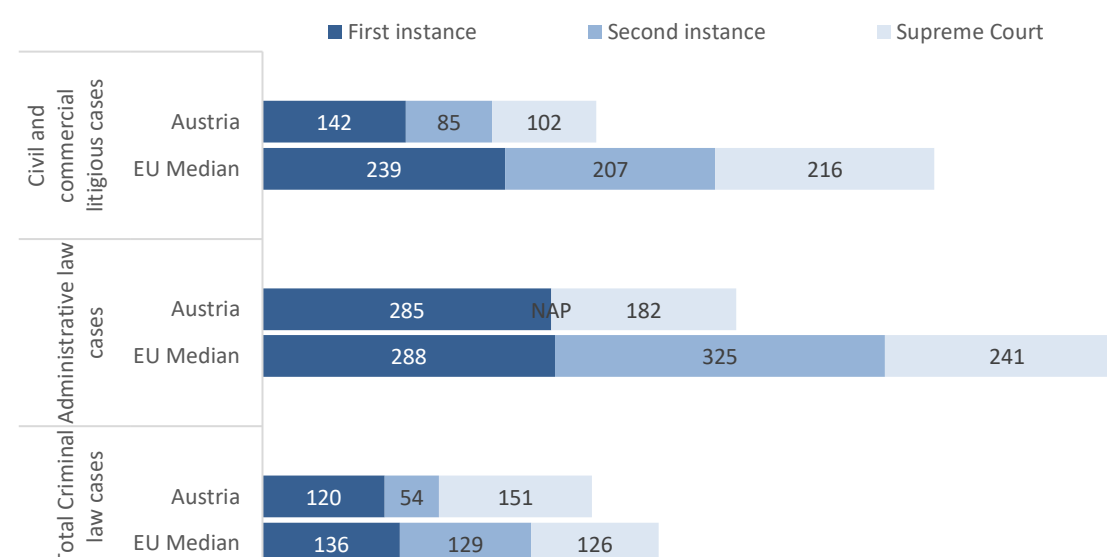

In 2022, in Austria, the total length of criminal proceedings proves to be the shortest one which is aligned to the trend established in the European Union. However, it is worth pointing out that in 2022, civil proceedings in Austria are in total as short as criminal ones, while at the level of the EU the total length of civil proceedings is of 662 days, i.e., considerably higher than in Austria (329 days).

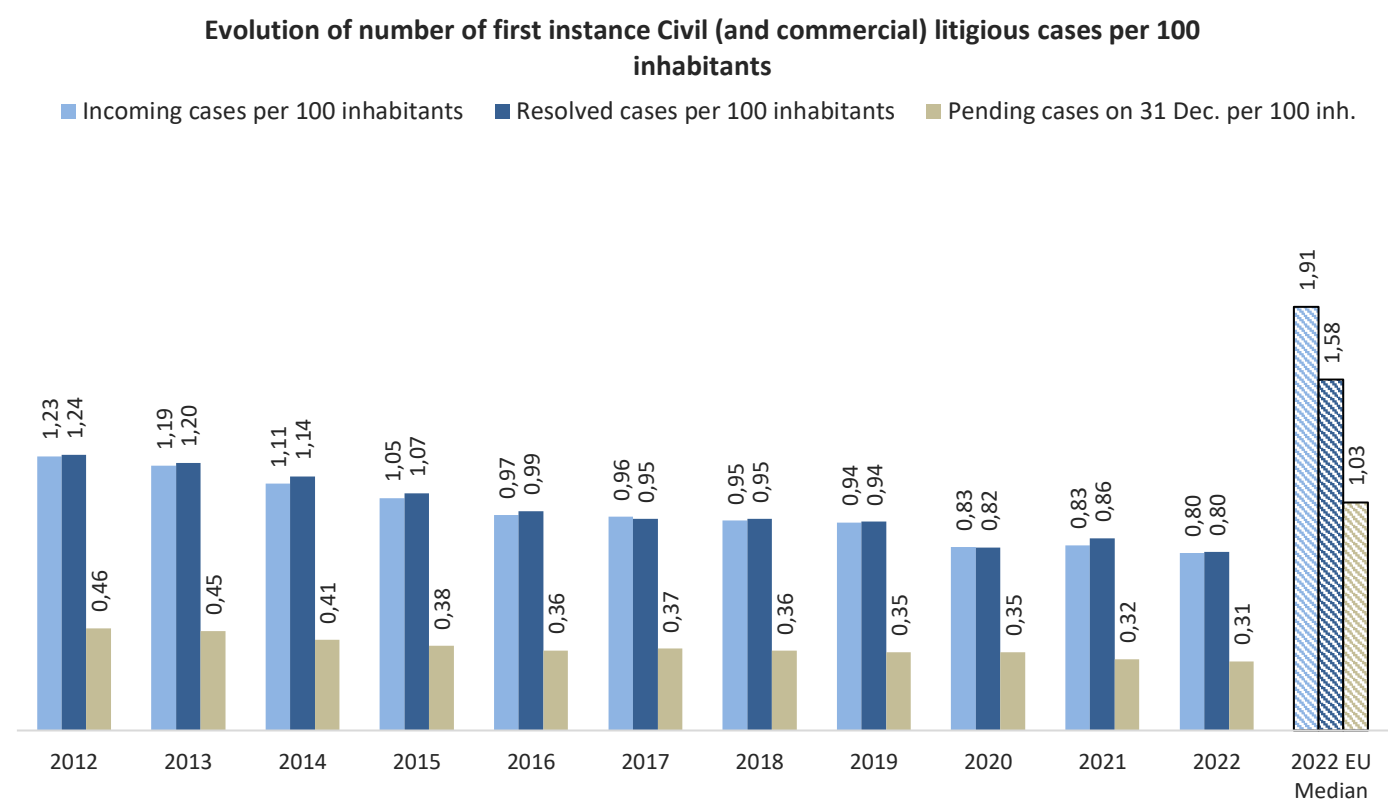
Similarly to the EU trend, administrative proceedings are the longest ones compared to civil and criminal cases, but their total length is almost twice below the total length of administrative proceedings at the EU level (854 days). It can be recalled that in Austria, in administrative matters, there are only two instances - first and last.

Generally, in 2022, the Clearance Rate indicator is above the 100% threshold in all matters and at all instances, while the Disposition Time indicator is below the respective EU medians, except for third instance criminal cases where it is slightly above. In this regard, it should be recalled that Austria presents the peculiarity to encompass in the total number of third instance criminal cases data on administrative criminal cases before the Supreme Administrative Court.

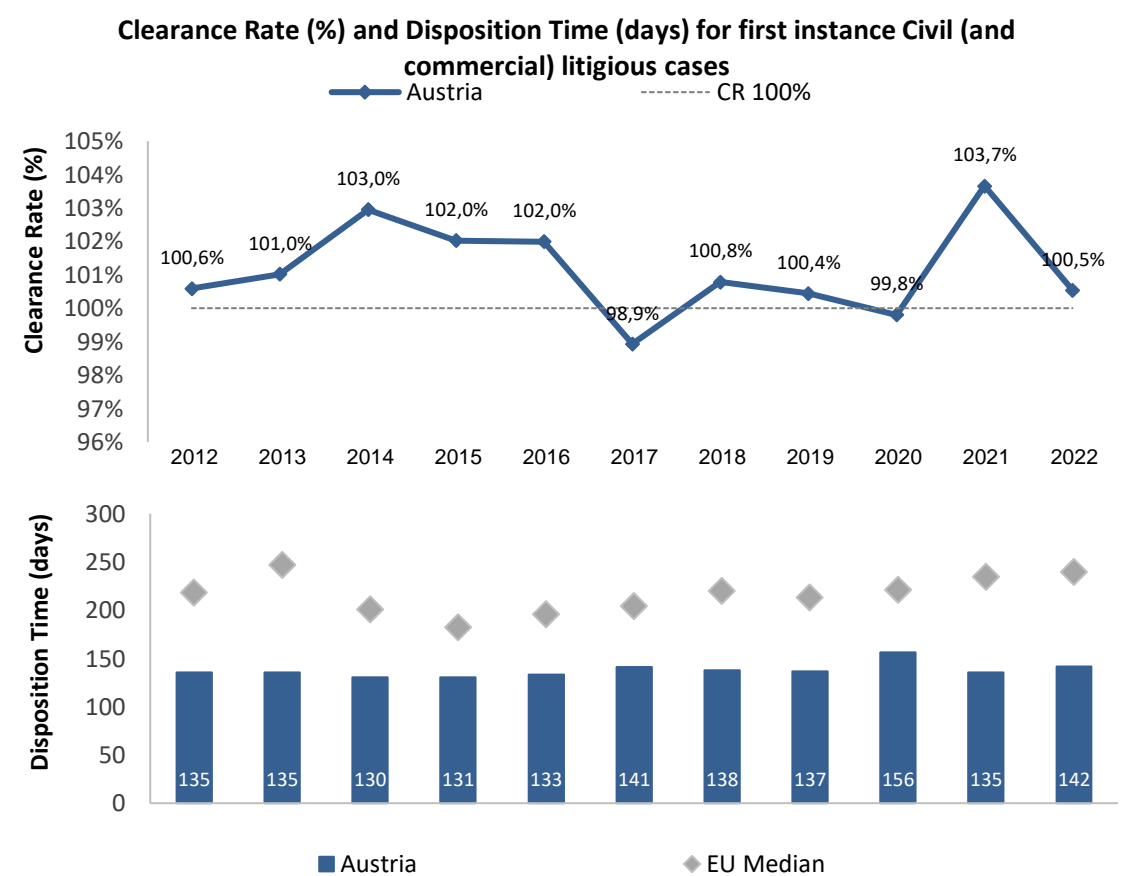

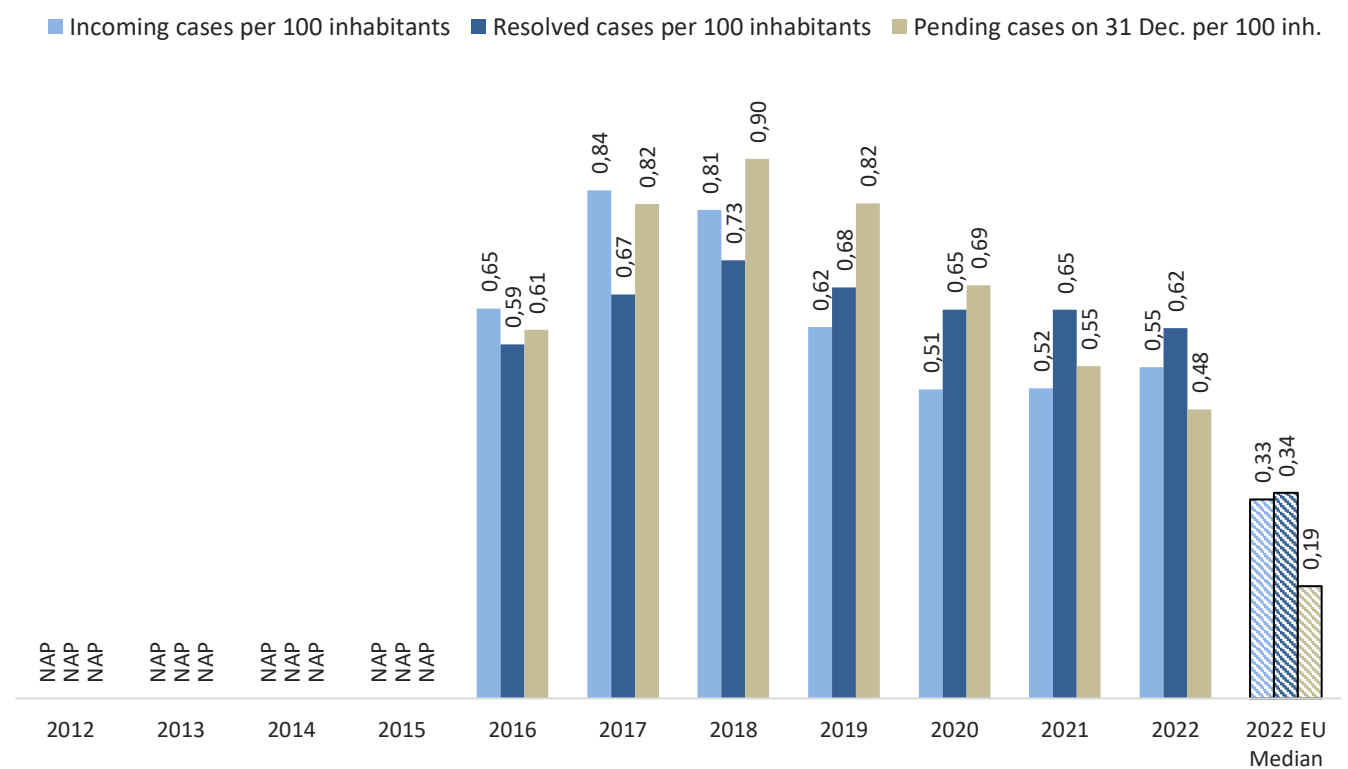

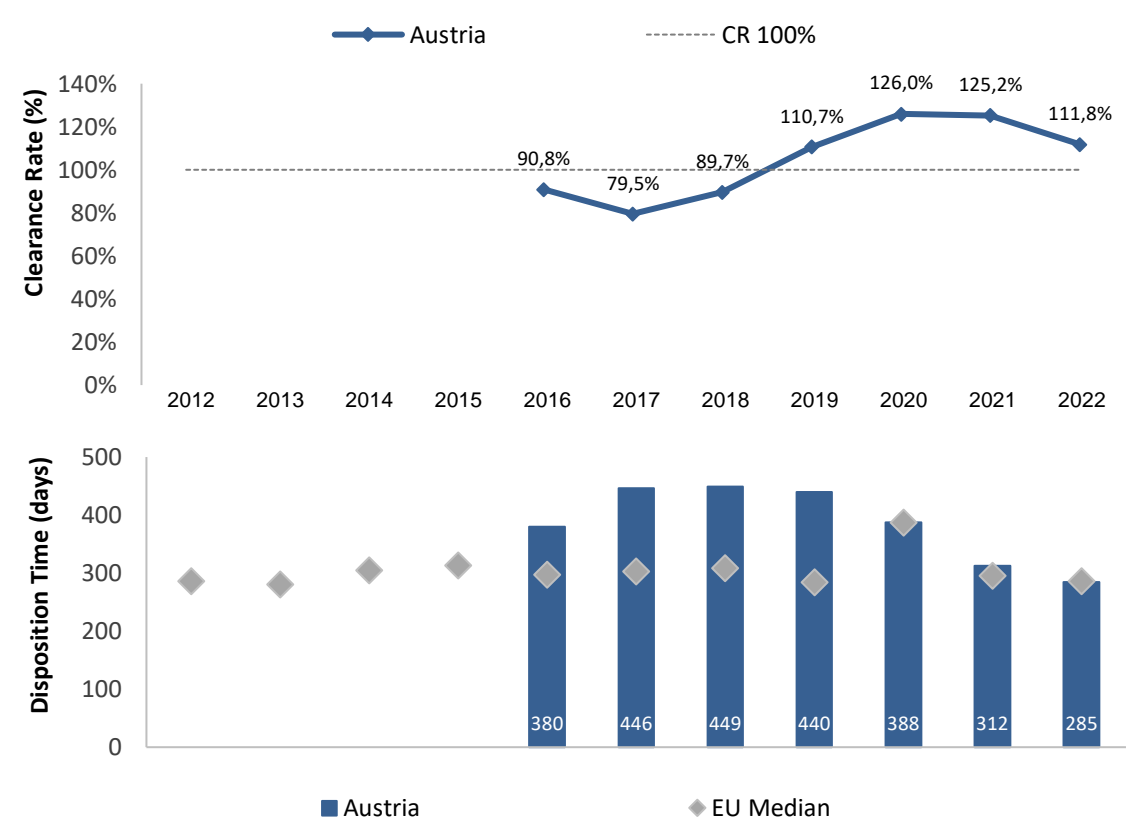

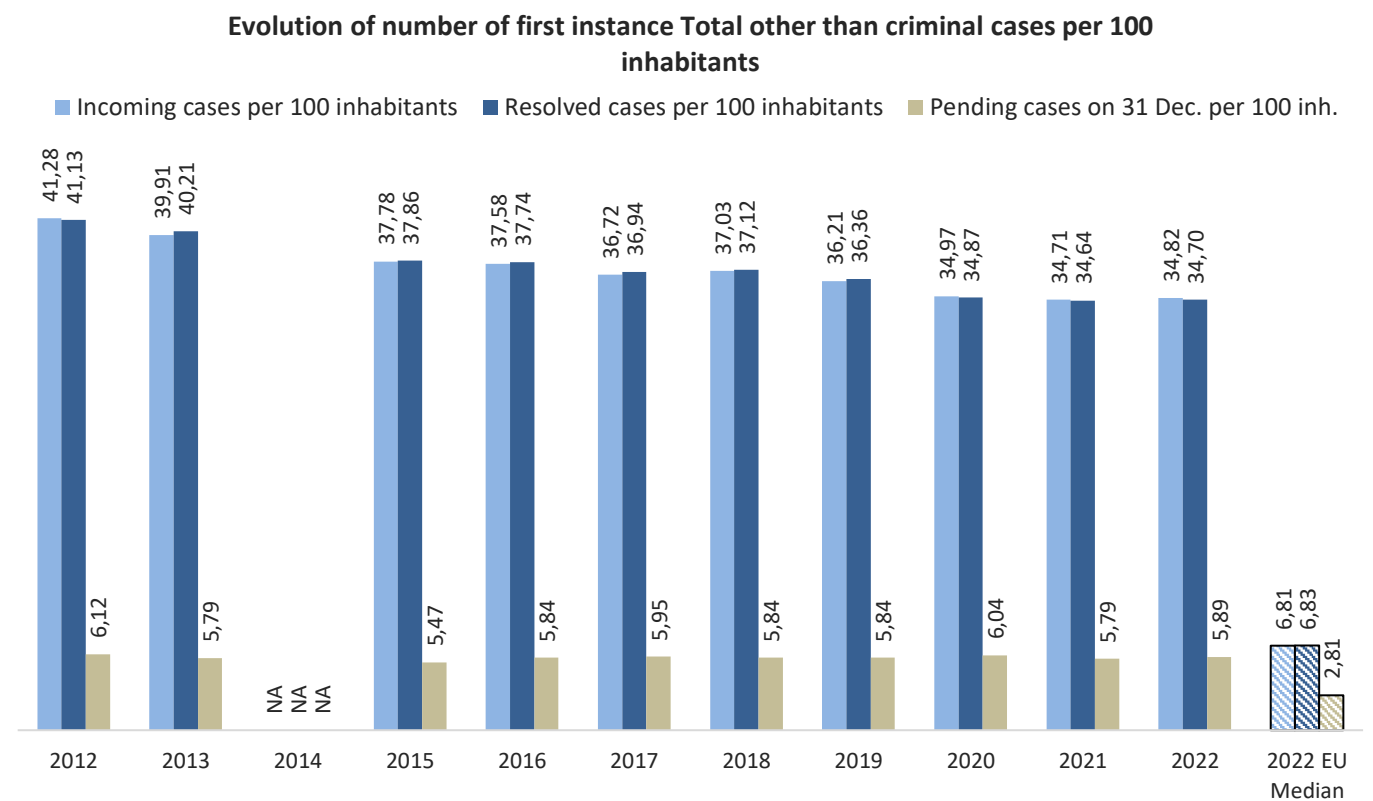

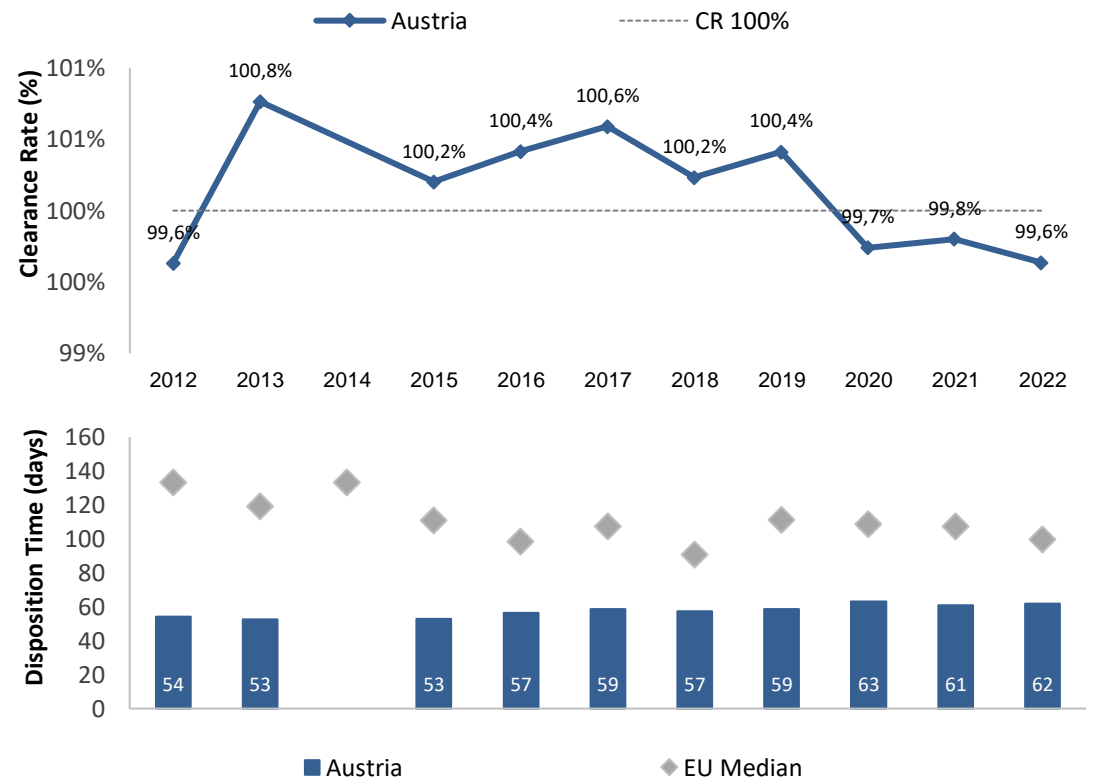

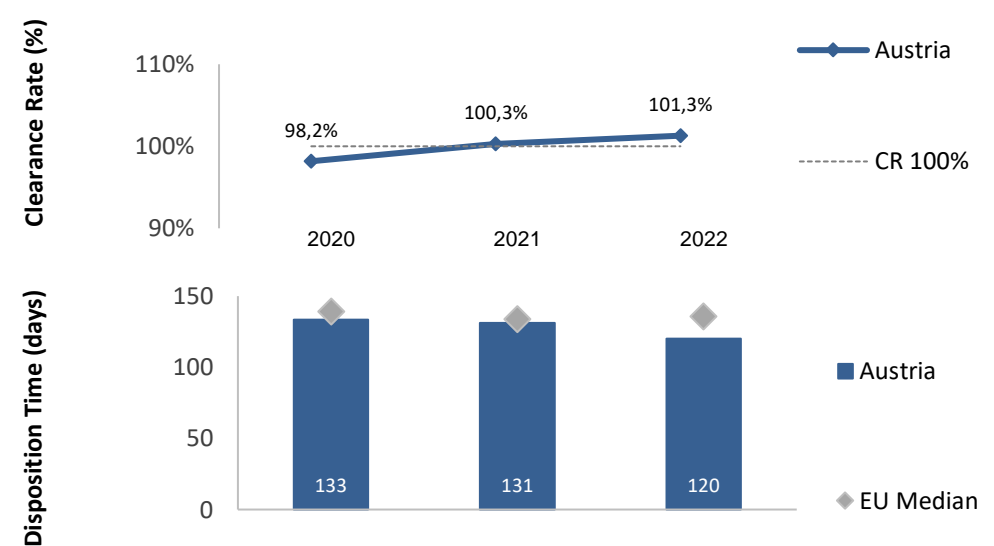

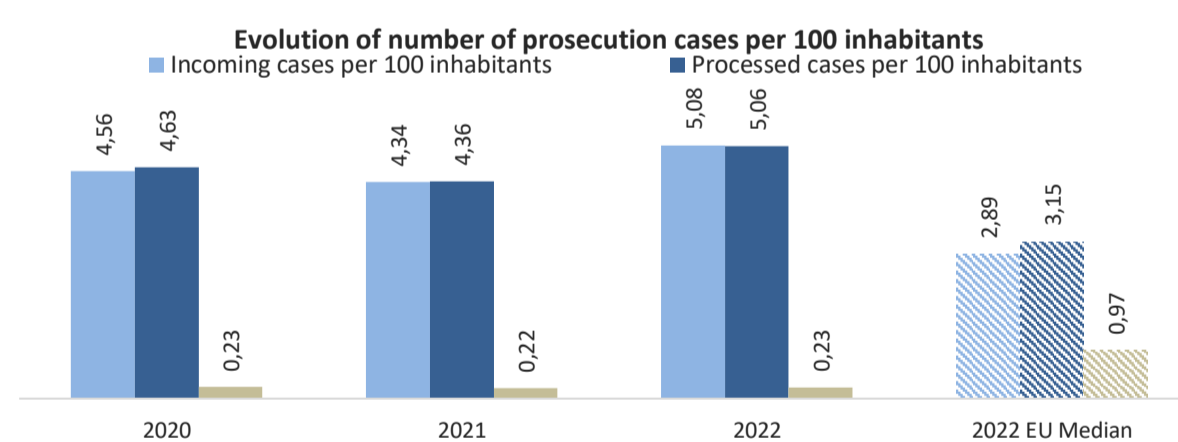
The provided number of cases discontinued for other reasons (3.1.4) contains cases discontinued because the offender is fugitive or an investigation may not be instituted or continued by law (e.g. because of diplomatic immunity of the offender), also cases (investigations) that were not instituted in the first place because of a lack of an initial suspicion and all other cases that were discontinued but can not be allocated to one of the above mentioned reasons or the other reasons under 3.1.

Following a change in Question 107, starting from 2022, cases previously reported as "closed for other reasons" are included in "discontinued for other reasons". Such cases are closed cases against unidentified offenders which were discontinued because of another reason than not identifying the offender in the end (mostly cases in which at least one formerly unidentified offender could be identified and therefore the case against the unidentified offender(s) is closed and another (new) case against the known offender(s) is opened).

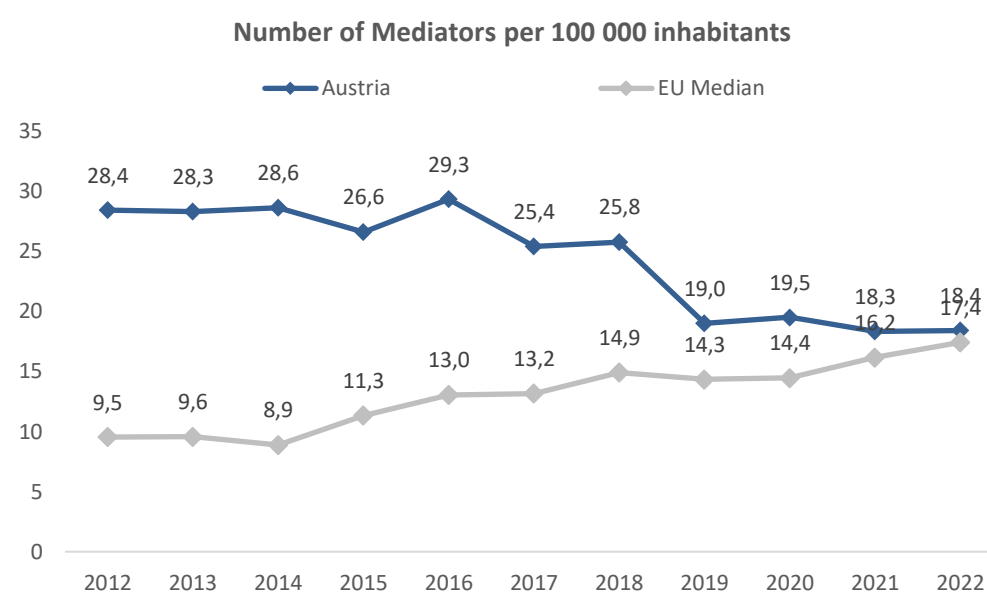

In 2022, there are 1 674 accredited or registered mediators who practise court related mediation which represents 18,4 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants (the EU median being of 17,4 accredited or registered mediators per 100 000 inhabitants).

To become a registered mediator one must be 1. at least 28 years of age, 2. qualified (the applicant has undergone proper mediation-specific training in accordance with ZivMediat-AV BGBl.pdf (justiz.gv.at)), 3. trustworthy and 4. insured (liability insurance). Anyone who meets these requirements can be registered in the Austrian Ministry of Justice's list of mediators. A written request and proof that the requirements are met have to be provided. There is a fee of 345 Euro for the first five years and every ten years after that to uphold the registration.
