

AVMSD TRANSPOSITION HIGHLIGHTS – GERMANY



Germany has transposed the AVMSD 2018/1808 mainly with the adoption of the Media State Treaty (MStV) from 14-28 April 2020 that entered into force on 7 November 2020:

Protection of minors (Article 6a of the AVMSD)

- Contents which are evidently liable to seriously impair the development of children and young people or their education to become autonomous and socially competent individuals are prohibited
- Appropriate measures include categorising the broadcast, scheduling the time of the broadcast, or using technical measures that make it impossible or very difficult to access the content.
- Technical systems for the protection of minors are software programmes which are designed to identify only individual age groups or allow access to telemedia in closed systems.



Accessibility (Article 7 of the AVMSD)



Broadcasters and telemedia should, in addition to their existing commitments, include accessible offers
within the limits of their technical and financial capabilities and extend the scope of these offers in a
continuous and progressive manner.

European works (Article 13, 16, 17 of the AVMSD)



- 30% quota obligation for European works in VOD catalogues and a specific prominence obligation with an assessment method for fulfilling the obligation.
- Financial contribution obligation: to be paid to the Federal Film Board for both domestic and non-domestic targeted VOD service providers -> 1.8% of their turnover if < EUR 20 million; above that, 2.5%.
- More than half of the transmission time obligation for broadcasters
- 10% transmission time for independent works



Advertising (Article 23 of the AVMSD)

• Television advertising spots and teleshopping spots: 06.00-18.00 and 18.00-23.00 and 23.00-00.00: max. 20% of that period

Video-sharing platforms (Article 28b of the AVMSD)



- Specific requirements must be observed by VSPs for the establishment and operation of electronic complaint mechanisms.
- VSPs shall take appropriate measures to prevent the excessive intake by minors of foods and beverages which are not recommended for them
- Specific Statutes have been adopted to regulate the organisation and procedure of the out-of-court settlement of disputes between users and VSPs



Media literacy (Article 33a of the AVMSD)

• Funds from the Interstate Treaty on Broadcasting Funding may be allocated to non-commercial broadcasting and projects aimed at promoting media literacy.
