CoE Manifesto on the Freedom of Expression of Arts & Culture in the Digital Era

- "Restrictions on freedom of expression and artistic freedom affect the whole of society, bereaving it of its pluralism and the vitality of the democratic process."
- "Artistic freedom is associated with curiosity, creativity, innovation, self-realisation, critical thinking"

### What is artistic freedom? UNESCO definitions

- 1. the right to create without **censorship** or **intimidation**;
- 2. the right to have artistic work supported, distributed & remunerated;
- 3. the right to **freedom of movement** of cultural professionals;
- 4. the right to **freedom of association** in the cultural sphere;
- 5. the right to the protection of **social & economic rights** of cultural professionals;
- 6. the right to participate in cultural life

### New initiatives – 2023/2024

- Artistic freedom **gathering momentum**: identified as a right among others at summits, studies, including at the Council of Europe & in EU initiatives
- Legislative change: Malta strengthens artistic freedom in law & Ireland's basic income for artists initiative leads to improvements in artists' welfare
- Artist & Cultural workers: artists continue to take **creative action** to counter censorship

• "..the justice system should not become a tool in the hands of those who want to stifle the arts and freedom of thought". (Malta)

# Recommendations & ways forward

- States: stand by ECHR & other international obligations to protect & artistic freedom, amend legislation, proactive steps to protect artistic freedom inc. complaint mechanisms, ensuring independence of cultural institutions etc.
- Civil society & cultural organisations: to expand remits & work together to counter repression of creative freedom.'
- Education institutions: include modules to promote greater understanding of artistic freedom
- Artists: work together to challenge repression, work with media & others for improved coverage & understanding of the importance of artistic freedom.
- Council of Europe: promote the Manifesto for artistic freedom within the Council & relevant debates, to provide cross-sectoral platforms for exchange including a possible database

# Further recommendations

- Develop the Free to Create website & initiate a database/observatory to follow trends, developments & solutions
- States to support artistic freedom by enabling platforms of exchange across sectors
- Artists & cultural workers to be central in the development of these projects

### Artists' comments

- "To be provocative is an important thing to do to open conversations, to break the status quo of the world we live in."
- "The government states that there should be one nation, one ideology and everyone should think in the same way and try to be a good citizen, and you can't even joke about it because it is forbidden!"
- When we are talking about freedom of speech whose freedom of speech are we protecting? Freedom of speech for everyone? How do we create dialogue? Everyone should be able to express their ideas. It won't make those controversial ideas disappear if they are suppressed."
