

Ms Lynn Chircop Faure holds Doctor of Laws degree, a Master's degree in Human Rights Law and Practice, a Master's degree in Diplomatic Studies, a Post Graduate Diploma of Notary Public, and a Bachelor of Laws (hons) Degree on European studies from the University of Malta.

As Head of the Human Rights Initiatives Unit and Chairperson of the Anti-Trafficking Inter-Ministerial Committee from July 2021 until June 2024, she worked closely with government and non-governmental entities and provided substantive input in the development of Malta's first National Strategy on Combating Human Trafficking. During this period, she represented Malta as the National Focal Point on Human Trafficking in international fora and participated at various meetings at the OSCE, UN, ICMPD, the Council of Europe and the European Union.

Ms Chircop is a member of the Committee of the Parties to the Council of Europe Convention against Trafficking in Human Organs. She contributed towards Malta's proposed organ donation reform through a publication on balancing ethics and human rights in the shift from opt-in to opt-out and its societal implications. Lynn was awarded the 'Gogòl Omaggio al Sorriso' and is officially a SMILE Ambassador for her voluntary work and support to vulnerable persons.

Ms Chircop acted as Rapporteur for the 'Right of Everyone' during a public consultation as part of the Family Court Reform and advocated for a more efficient, equitable and effective social and justice system, particularly addressing the Court Services in the best interests of the child.

She regularly participates on TV and radio programmes as an expert on human rights and the rights of victims of gender-based violence and domestic violence. She has produced various creative works aimed at raising awareness on issues in the public interest such as human trafficking, domestic violence, children's rights, mental health and organ donation.
