

**Ms Ia Dadunashvili** is a Georgian national. She holds a Law degree and a Public Administration degree from the Georgian Technical University in Tbilisi, an LL.M degree in Comparative Constitutional Law from the Central European University in Budapest, and a PHD in Law (thesis related to trafficking in human beings) from the Georgian Technical University. She also holds a certificate from the University of Essex on research methods on hidden and marginal populations, including victims of human trafficking.

Ms Dadunashvili has 15 years of experience working with UN agencies (ILO and UNODC) and OSCE in the areas of human rights, including action against forced labour and trafficking in human beings and action against gender based violence, as well as working with World Vision International on child rights.

In 2007-2014, Ms Dadunashvili was a member of the Permanent Identification Group on the status of victims of trafficking in human beings in Georgia, and in 2007-2011, she was a member of the International Co-ordination Council for implementation of measures against human trafficking in Georgia. In 2012, Ms Dadunashvili worked with the Women's Information Centre on the development of the monitoring report on implementation of the National Action Plan against trafficking in human beings in Georgia. In 2012, Ms Dadunashvili co-founded the Georgian Coalition for Child and Youth Welfare. Currently, she is a member of the interagency working group on street children in Georgia.

From 2007 to 2018, Ms Dadunashvili was responsible for monitoring and evaluation reporting at the ILO Project Office in Georgia.

Ms Dadunashvili currently works as Chief of Analysis and Reporting Cell under the Human Rights and Communities Department at the OSCE Mission in Kosovo\*<sup>1</sup>.
