# BIO/ENF-CP Drafting Group on Developing a Guide to good practice concerning the participation of children in the decision-making process on matters regarding their health

Second meeting, 10-11 March 2022

Videoconference

**DRAFT MEETING REPORT** 

# I. Opening

- 1. Mr Joost Van Haelst (CDENF, Belgium) and Ms Ritva Halila (CD-BIO, Finland), co-Chairs of the BIO/ENF-CP Drafting Group, opened the meeting thanking members of the group for their interest and participation, and specifying that this session would be chaired by Mr Van Haelst, as previously agreed. The Chair reminded the Drafting Group about the objectives of the meeting, notably to produce a preliminary draft guide for presentation to both parent committees at their upcoming meetings.
- 2. Ms Laurence Lwoff, Head of the Human Rights and Biomedicine Division, informed about the implications for the drafting group of the Committee of Minister's decision of 25 February 2022 to suspend the Russian Federation from its rights of representation in the Committee of Ministers.

# II. Adoption of the Agenda

3. The drafting group adopted the agenda for this meeting as it appears in Appendix II to this report, thereby agreeing to discuss point 3 (State of play of activities), in the context of point 5.2 (Exchange on next steps towards finalisation of the guide).

# IV. <u>Presentation of the first draft outline of the Guide to good practice concerning the participation of children in the decision-making process on matters regarding their health</u>

- 5. The Secretariat presented the preliminary draft Guide (BIO-ENF/CP (2022)1(confidential)), as prepared on the basis of a background paper provided by the consultant. The background paper would be shared with the group following last editorial revisions shortly after the meeting.
- 6. The members of the Drafting Group expressed their general satisfaction with the Draft, which they considered to be well-structured and a good starting point, and emphasised the importance of producing a guide which is tailored to the target audience, implying that it has to be easy to read, practical, meaningful and accessible.
- 7. The drafting group exchanged on the target group of the guide which would primarily be health professionals. The guide should also be accessible to other stakeholders, such as parents and other legal representatives and public health policy makers. The <u>Guide on the decision-making process regarding medical treatment in end-of-life situations</u> could serve as inspiration in this respect.

#### V. Discussion

#### 1. Continued revision of the draft Guide

- 8. Regarding the <u>scope of the Guide</u>, the group agreed that the guide should acknowledge the collective level of child participation, but focus primarily on the individual decision-making process. Collective initiatives could notably be included as a way of improving the quality of conditions under which decisions are taken.
- 9. The group further agreed to limit the scope of the guide to "children" within the meaning of the UNCRC (under 18 years). The question was raised whether the scope should also encompass children having legal capacity to consent to medical interventions

under national law, while Art. 6 (2) of the Oviedo Convention, which formed the starting point for this guide, only applied "where, according to law, a minor does not have the capacity to consent to an intervention". While acknowledging that the case of children having legal capacity did not strictly fall under the notion of "child participation", some group members pointed out that the right to receive information, as enshrined in the UNCRC, applied regardless of capacity to consent, and the group agreed on the importance of appropriate and child-friendly information in both settings.

- 10. The group emphasised the importance of addressing common barriers faced by children when participating in decisions relating to their health, such as: socio-cultural differences, misinformation, lack of awareness of health care professionals, possible conflict of interests with or between parents or other carers, and barriers faced by specific groups of children, such as children with disabilities, and children belonging to marginalised and minority groups.
- 11. The drafting group continued the revision of the text, paying particular attention to clearly differentiate between the different elements of informed consent (information, consent, assent, dissent and decision-making capacity).
- 12. With regard to the examples from member States, it was agreed that, in case of doubt, these should be checked with national Delegations prior to inclusion in the text.
- 13. It was agreed to develop a visual part (a diagram or a picture, possibly inspired by Hart's ladder of participation) showing different levels and stages of child participation. It was also proposed to use more graphics in the Guide in order to illustrate better the main concepts.

#### 2. Exchange on next steps towards finalisation of the guide

- 14. The Secretariat introduced the new proposed timeline for the development of the Guide as it appears in Appendix III to this report, to allow for sufficient time for a meaningful children and stakeholder consultation process. The members of the Drafting Group agreed with this approach.
- 15. The BIO/ENF-CP agreed to send their written comments and suggestions on the draft Guide by 18 March 2022 with a view to allow enough time for the Consultant to prepare the revised version by 7 April 2022.

# VI. Other tasks of the Drafting Group

- 16. General modalities of organisation of the children and stakeholder consultation process were discussed. It will be held in October-November 2022. The Secretariat is to prepare a concept note on its organisation and to present it to the Drafting Group for comments.
- 17. The Secretariat updated on the progress achieved with regard to collection of examples of practices of decision-making process, noting that only three examples were received. It was agreed to make another call for examples through target dissemination of the form by members of the Drafting Group.

#### VII. Any other business

18. The Secretariat informed about a video clip produced by the TEDDY network with support of the CDBIO Secretariat on general concepts of informed consent of children and their right to receive information about their health. The clip will be finalised in April and will be presented to the Spring Plenaries of both Committees.

# VIII. Closing the meeting

19. The BIO/ENF-CP Drafting Group agreed to hold its next meeting on 22-23 September 2022. The format would be adapted according to the current travel restrictions and the general sanitary situation.
