Jeremy McBride, President

Barrister, Monckton Chambers, London, specialising in cases before the European Court of Human Rights and the UN Human Rights Committee. Scientific Expert for the adoption of the Fundamental Principles on the Legal Status of NGOs and the Recommendation on the Legal Status of NGOs in Europe (CM/Rec(2007)14). Member of the ODIHR-Venice Commission Expert Working Group for the preparation of the Joint Guidelines on Freedom of Association. Co-founder and former Chair of INTERIGHTS (International Centre for the Legal Protection of Human Rights). Formerly, Reader in International Human Rights Law, University of Birmingham and visiting Professor, Central European University. Mr McBride resides in Strasbourg.



Antoine Buyse

Professor of human rights in a multidisciplinary perspective and director of the Netherlands Institute of Human Rights (SIM) at Utrecht University. He has served in the boards of several Dutch and international NGOs, including the Association of Human Rights Institutes and the Dutch branch advisory board of the Scholars at Risk network. His teaching and research focus on international and European human rights law, including the issue of shrinking civic space, and he hosts a weblog about the European Convention on Human Rights. Pavel Chikov

Human rights lawyer and head of the Agora International Human Rights Group, member of the Presidential Council of Human Rights (Russia). Law School (Kazan State University, Russia) and MPA (University of North Dakota, USA) graduate, PhD in International Law. He has been working in the human rights field since 1999, organizing legal defence for hundreds of criminal cases against civic and political activists, bloggers and journalists. His team represents dozens of Russian NGOs that faced a lot of pressure since 2006, including the so-called Foreign Agents Law. Pavel Chikov resides in Kazan, Russia.



Simona Constantinescu

Legal expert actively working for a more favourable environment for civil society organizations for over 20 years. She started as a lawyer and since 2011 served as Head of Development and Advocacy for Civil Society Development Foundation. She managed grant-making programmes involving more than 250 NGOs and has been engaged in major advocacy campaigns for improving the legislation. She led or was part of some dozens of working groups on legislative changes affecting the third sector, either as legal writer, researcher, spokesperson or advocate for change at Romanian and international level. Co-founder and legal coordinator of the NGO "European Prison Litigation Network". She also serves on the Board of Trauma Treatment International and the Nuhanovic Foundation and is a member of the Advisory Committee of Lawyers for Justice in Libya. Australian qualified lawyer currently working in an independent organisation which inspects and monitors the treatment and conditions of detainees in the UK. She has worked across Europe providing legal and policy advice through projects on human rights, focusing on equality and non-discrimination and the prohibition of torture and other ill-treatment. Co-author of Justice or Complicity? LGBT Rights and the Russian Courts and previous Assistant Editor of the Equal Rights Review. Katerina Hadzi-Miceva Evans

Katerina has been working to protect and strengthen civil society space since she engaged in the NGO sector in Macedonia in 1998. Subsequently, she co-founded the Human Rights Students' Initiative at the Central European University where she earned a Master's degree in law. Seeing how a safe legal framework is needed to encourage citizen action, in 2001 she joined the European Center for Not-for-Profit Law and became its Executive Director. She provides expertise to NGOs, public authorities, international bodies; undertakes research, speaks at high level events and helps develop strategies that create policy and legal conditions for civil society to flourish. Consistently active in the field of human rights, he began his career as a humanitarian worker before becoming a consultant and researcher for governments as well as non-governmental and international organisations. The co-founder of Diritto Di Sapere (Right To Know), the first Italian organisation working on the right of access to information, he graduated in law at the University of Trento. Cyril Ritchie, Honorary President

He was President of the NGO Grouping on Civil Society and Democracy in Europe from 2000-2008.
