Ms Nathalie MARTIN is a French national. A lawyer with a Master II in International Public Law of the University of Toulouse I, she is specialised in International Public Law, Human Rights Law, Refugee Law and Criminal Law (International and domestic).

Between 1999 and 2015, Ms Martin was a Legal Adviser for Amnesty International France and was responsible for Human Rights, serious violations of International Humanitarian Law, International Criminal Tribunals and International Criminal Court (transposition into the domestic law of the obligations deriving from the UN Security Council and the Rome Status of the ICC) as well as the Refugee Law, main reforms of the criminal procedure and serious forms of criminality (organised crime, violence against women and trafficking in human beings). She also closely followed the drafting of the CoE Anti-Trafficking Convention by the ad hoc committee against trafficking in human beings (CATEH) and the campaign for the ratification of the Convention. She also participated on behalf of Amnesty International in the working group in charge of drafting the first national action plan on action against trafficking in human beings and protection of victims between 2008 and 2010.

Since 2015, she has been a consultant and legal adviser for NGOs specialised in the assistance of victims of trafficking in human beings and victims of gender and domestic violences. She assists victims in criminal procedures in co-operation with French Law Enforcement Agencies (Police and Gendarmerie) and during the asylum procedures. Ms Martin also organises regular training on identification and assistance to victims of trafficking and Refugee Law.

As a Lieutenant-Colonel of the Gendarmerie nationale Reserve Force, she is appointed at the Central Office for Combating Crimes against Humanity, Genocides and War Crimes (OCLCH) since 1 January 2017.

As an Assistant at Toulouse I and Toulouse II Universities, she taught Criminal Law (substantial and procedural), International Public Law and, currently, Civil Law and Intellectual Property Law. She is the author of publications about the international legal mechanisms for the protection of human rights, the most serious international crimes, action against violence against women, Refugee Law and action against trafficking in human beings.

After having collaborated with the Council of Europe as an expert in 2015 and 2016 for cooperation activities on Trafficking in Human Beings in Tunisia and Morocco, Nathalie Martin was elected Member of GRETA on 4 November 2016 and re-elected on 6 November 2018.
