European Charter for the Safeguarding of Human Rights in the City. The signatory cities make a series of commitments which include the right to the city; the guarantee of equality and non-discrimination, the right to cultural, linguistic and religious freedom; the protection of the most vulnerable groups and citizens; and the right to education, contributing to raising consciousness with regard to the struggle against sexism, racism, xenophobia and discrimination, among commitments. Bilbao signed the Charter in 2017.

**Eurocities Integrating Cities Charter**. 

### OBJECTIVES BY AREA

#### A. GENERAL:

#### COMMITMENT

- Reinforce interculturalism as a principle of local mainstreaming action, together with town planning.
- Make the municipality's cultural diversity visible, via a shared intercultural communication framework that brings together language and imagery.
- Establish the value of interculturalism as a criteria for public recognition in prizes and grants.

#### **GOVERNANCE**

- Promote participation and advocacy of people of foreign origin in the political, social and cultural life of the city.
- Manage religious diversity.

#### INTELLIGENCE AND COMPETENCE

- Promote understanding of the city's situation in terms of diversity and integration through the Local Immigration Observatory.
- Improve the capacities of the municipal workforce to deal with diversity.
- Promote networking, incorporating the learning and experience acquired by other institutions and entities.

#### INTERNATIONAL OUTLOOK

- Strengthen participation in existing international networks.
- Promote greater involvement of foreign university students in Bilbao's social and cultural life.
- Promote collaboration strategies with the countries of origin of foreign immigrants in the municipality.

#### **LANGUAGES**

- Eliminate barriers to integration caused by language, strengthening knowledge and use of the official languages.
- Value and make the most of linguistic diversity as a source of social, cultural and economic wealth for the city.

#### COMMUNICATION AND MEDIA

 Promote a narrative of the city that aligns with the intercultural values.

#### RECEPTION

- Have tools available for the initial reception to facilitate incorporation into the general municipal services.
- Lessen the digital divide.
- Promote the integration of groups who have specific assistance needs.

## EMPOWERMENT FOR EQUALITY BETWEEN MEN AND WOMEN

- Promote the empowerment of women of foreign origin and hold men of foreign origin jointly responsible.
- Promote community health and the prevention of gender-based violence.
- Promote recognition of the contribution women of foreign origin bring to society.

#### ANTI-DISCRIMINATION AND RAISING AWARENESS

- Raise awareness among citizens, prevent and tackle the formation of prejudices and stereotypes linked to immigration and cultural diversity in the city.
- Detect situations of discrimination and collaborate in implementing measures.

 Promote mediation for intervention in situations of conflict between agents of different origins.

Reinforce the value of interculturalism in education settings.

 Redesign and update public services to meet the demands and needs of a diverse population, with a criteria of standardisation.

 Use the cultural, sports, art and leisure programme as a tool for coexistence.

Promote the use of public spaces, promoting intercultural coexistence.

- Promote intercultural municipal action regarding local economic development.
- Make the most of the skills and abilities of people of foreign origin for local development.
