## **1. Opening of the meeting**

1. Mr Gregor Strojin, Chair of the CAHAI, opened this 6th and final meeting of the CAHAI-PDG by congratulating the Working Group for its work related to the impact assessment of AI applications on human rights, democracy and the rule of law, as well as on the use of AI in the public sector.
2. He underlined that this being the last meeting of the CAHAI-PDG, it was time to focus on the final product for the CAHAI. In the case of the CAHAI-PDG, this would be the chapter on impact assessment prepared by the Secretariat based on the outcomes of the discussions held within the CAHAI-PDG and its sub-working groups.
3. Mr Jan Kleijssen, Director, Information Society- Action against Crime, Council of Europe, continued the opening session by highlighting the tremendous work accomplished so far by the CAHAI-PDG on the impact assessment of AI applications on human rights, democracy and the rule of law, in particular bearing in mind that all the meetings have thus far taken place online.
4. He underlined that the chapter on impact assessment would be a crucial part of any future instrument and the utmost importance that, during these two days, the Working Group focuses on finalising its work.
5. Mr Kleijssen also drew the Working Group's attention to the agenda item concerning the examination of the document on human rights, democracy and the rule of law (HUDERIA) prepared by the Alan Turing Institute at the request of the Secretariat. He underlined that although the Group is invited to discuss and take note of the document, it is not intended to be adopted or otherwise approved by the CAHAI-PDG.

## **2. Adoption of the agenda**

6. The Secretariat informed the Group that it had requested the preparation of this document with the aim of advancing the work of the CAHAI-PDG and stimulating debate. It reiterated that the document is simply a reference document and the CAHAI-PDG is not expected to adopt it.
7. The agenda was subsequently adopted.

## **3. Examination of the document on human rights, democracy and the rule of law (HUDERIA) prepared by the Alan Turing Institute, followed by discussions**

8. Mr David Leslie (United Kingdom), member of the CAHAI Bureau, presented the document on Human Rights, Democracy, and the Rule of Law Assurance Framework (HUDERAF) for AI Systems, prepared by the Alan Turing Institute at the request of the CAHAI Secretariat. He explained that the proposals laid out in the document are based on the work of the PDG's Sub-Working Group 1, with the aim to operationalize the outline of a Model for a Human Rights, Democracy, and the Rule of Law Impact Assessment

(HUDERIA). Mr Leslie underlined that as a living document, it is destined to be edited and changed in accordance with future developments.

9. Following a valuable discussion on the various aspects (including methodology, the different specificities of the HUDERIA approach with respect to the impact of human rights, democracy and rule of law, the role and engagement of the stakeholders, coordination on the different phases of the algorithm lifecycle) of the document, it was agreed that many of these insights provided could be taken into the discussions on Chapter XII and impact assessment as an inspiration for debates.
10. The Chair of the CAHAI-PDG, Mr Wolfgang Teves (Germany) thanked the Alan Turing institute for its important work in having prepared such a comprehensive model.
11. The CAHAI-PDG took note of the document and decided to include its Executive Summary in the meeting report as an appendix. Depending on the future terms of reference of the committee replacing the CAHAI, it was agreed that it might be possible to further develop the ideas contained in the document.

#### **4. Brief summary by the Secretariat of discussions held within the CAHAI-PDG on Artificial intelligence in the Public Sector**

12. The PDG examined a document presenting a Summary of discussions held within the Working Group on Artificial intelligence in the Public Sector, prepared by the Secretariat.
13. Delegations discussed the terminology and whether AI in the public sector should be addressed in a transversal instrument or rather be part of a more sectorial approach. The Secretariat underlined that the discussion on the choice of a transversal or a sectorial approach should be left to the Committee of Ministers who will take the final decision.
14. The topics of human oversight as well as the right to be informed when interacting with an AI system and the right to alternatively interact with a human being where there may be serious consequences for the user were deemed particularly important.
15. The CAHAI-PDG also underlined the fact that any AI system used in the public sector will give rise to certain issues as regards human rights, democracy, and the rule of law and therefore the importance of giving due consideration to the use of AI systems in this field.
16. The Group decided that the reference to gender equality should be extended to other forms of discrimination and that the mention of other vulnerable groups should be extended to anyone adversely affected by the system.
17. Regarding public registers it was mentioned that they should be complemented with, inter alia, information on purpose, the actors involved, the model and the impact assessment.
18. It was decided that this important document on the use of AI in the public sector could be incorporated into the Elements document as Chapter XIII.

19. The CAHAI-PDG unanimously approved the document with the modifications agreed upon during the meeting and instructed the Secretariat to insert it into the Elements document as a new Chapter XIII and to submit it to the CAHAI for finalisation at its next and final plenary meeting (30 November – 2 December 2021). After the meeting, the representative of the Russian Federation has informed the Secretariat that his Delegation could nevertheless not support the inclusion of the document as Chapter XIII.

**5. Examination of elements for Chapter XII, Impact Assessment, of the document on ‘Possible elements of a legal framework on artificial intelligence, based on the Council of Europe’s standards on human rights, democracy and the rule of law’ as prepared by the Secretariat**

20. The CAHAI-PDG examined the elements for Chapter XII on impact assessment of the Elements document. The Co-Chair of the CAHAI-PDG, Mr Zoltan Turbek (Hungary) underlined the importance of ensuring the interlinkage between human rights, democracy and the rule of law. Moreover, he stressed that the document needs to be short and concise.

21. There was discussion on the use of the term “proxies” and it was agreed that clarification is needed. In particular when democracy is concerned, it may be difficult to know which standards are applicable.

22. The Group agreed that the need for transparency is paramount and that transparency requirements can contribute to determine whether an AI system should be subjected to an impact assessment, and in which proportion.

23. There was a discussion on how the risk level will be analysed and which risks are relevant. The need to provide methodology for low, medium and high risk was highlighted.

24. The use of an AI system for new purposes was explored, in particular as concerns which dimension of the reuse would need to be reassessed for risks. The Working Group agreed that this depends on the new purpose of the AI system and that risk assessment is needed when using an AI system for a new or different purpose or in a new or different context.

25. It was agreed that stakeholder engagement is key and that there is a difference between stakeholders and right-holders, which should be reflected in the text, as well as the acknowledgement that in certain contexts, stakeholders are simply members of society.

26. Certain delegations proposed to leave the responsibility for defining the elements for impact assessment to the national level. However, the majority of the Working Group disagreed with this approach.

27. The CAHAI-PDG unanimously approved the draft text for Chapter XII with the modifications agreed upon during the meeting and instructed the Secretariat to submit it to the CAHAI for finalisation at its next and final plenary meeting (30 November – 2 December 2021). After the meeting, the representative of the Russian Federation

informed the Secretariat that his delegation could nevertheless not approve the text of Chapter XII.

## **6. Approval of the HADERIA elements for Chapter XII**

28. It was agreed that the updated version, including Chapters XII and XIII, of the Elements document (CAHAI-LFG (2021)10) will be presented at the CAHAI Plenary to be finalised and approved before being transmitted to the Committee of Ministers as one of the main deliverables of the CAHAI, along with the feasibility study submitted last year, and therefore fulfilling its mandate.

## **7. Any other business**

29. Mr Turbek informed the PDG members about the high-level multi-stakeholder conference co-organized by the Hungarian Presidency of the Committee of Ministers and the Council of Europe on 26 October 2021, in virtual format, focusing on the theme of “Current and Future Challenges of Coordinated Policies on AI Regulation” (<https://www.coe.int/en/web/artificial-intelligence/ai-conference-current-and-future-challenges>) .

30. No further issues were raised under this item.

**8. Closing remarks by Ms Claudia Luciani, Director, Directorate of Human Dignity, Equality and Governance, Council of Europe**

31. Ms Luciani congratulated the CAHAI-PDG for a very productive meeting. She underlined that the task of the Working Group is to provide the best work possible, with quality documents finalised within the time constraints. She continued that in order to achieve this objective, the Working Groups of the CAHAI should be mindful to maintain a respectful atmosphere at all times and carry out the work in a spirit of mutual respect which is conducive to producing the most qualitative outputs.
32. Mr Teves also thanked all those who contributed to this fruitful meeting.
