The Council of Europe's Committee on Artificial Intelligence (hereinafter referred to as "the CAI" or "the Committee") holding its 14th Plenary meeting in Strasbourg, from 3 to 5 November 2025, in conformity with its terms of reference adopted by the Committee of Ministers, decided to:

Agenda item 1. Opening of the meeting

- Take note of the opening remarks of Mr Mario HERNÁNDEZ RAMOS, Chair of the CAI, and Ms Hanne JUNCHER, Director of Security, Integrity and Rule of Law.
- Welcome Ecuador as a new observer to the Committee.

Agenda item 2. Adoption of the agenda and order of business

- Adopt the agenda and order of business without amendments.

Agenda item 3. Adoption of the Meeting Report of the 13th Plenary meeting

- Adopt the report of the 13th Plenary meeting of the Committee.

Agenda item 4. The Committee of Ministers' Decision(s) with relevance for the CAI including requests for the CAI's opinion

- Take note of the relevant Committee of Ministers' Decisions as they appear in document CAI(2025)10.
- At the request of the Committee of Ministers, adopt the CAI Comments on the Parliamentary Assembly Recommendation 2300 (2025) – "Artificial Intelligence and Migration" with a view to its transmission to the Committee of Ministers with amendments made during the meeting as it appears in Addendum I.

Agenda item 5. The Framework Convention on Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law – State of Play

- Hold an exchange on the current status of signatures and prospects for ratification of the Framework Convention on Artificial Intelligence and Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law (Framework Convention), while welcoming existing signatures and information from Members on the progress of ratification procedures. Stress the importance of the entry into force of the Framework Convention as soon as possible.
- Take note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the interest in the Framework Convention by states which did not participate in its negotiation process.

Agenda item 6. Developments and activities in the field of Artificial Intelligence

- Hold an exchange of views on various developments and activities in the field of Artificial Intelligence on the basis of presentations by Canada, Georgia, Israel, Italy, North Macedonia, the Republic of Korea, Ukraine, and invited experts to the Thematic Hearing. The Committee heard presentations by the Chair and Bureau members as well as the Secretariat regarding participation in various events.

Agenda item 7. Presentation of HUDERIA-related activities:

- Take note of the presentation by the Secretariat and the experts of the Alan Turing Institute on activities undertaken to support the dissemination and practical application of the HUDERIA Methodology, in particular the HUDERIA Academy (16-18 June 2025) and the HUDERIA Platform (19-20 June 2025).
- Take note of the presentation by the Ministry of Digital Transformation of Ukraine on their experiences with a pilot on HUDERIA implementation among Ukrainian startups.

Agenda item 8. Draft Model for the Risk and Impact Assessment of Artificial Intelligence Systems from the point of view of Human Rights, Democracy and the Rule of Law (HUDERIA Model)

- Take note of the outcomes of the Working Group meeting held on the 2nd of September 2025
- Take note of the presentation by invited experts and the Secretariat on the operationalisation of the HUDERIA Model.
- Take note of the Secretariat proposal for the preparation of a feasibility study on the operationalisation of the HUDERIA Model including its format, objectives and usability as a basis to ensure continuity of the work in 2026.
- Hold an exchange on the way to proceed regarding the HUDERIA Model and agree that continued progress was necessary in the common interest of maintaining momentum in a transparent and inclusive manner, whilst also recalling its non-binding and inspirational character.
- Examine and adopt, as a non-legally binding *sui generis* tool, the HUDERIA Model: Context Based Risk Analysis (COBRA) Resources as it appears in Addendum II.

Agenda item 9. Thematic Hearing: Connecting Asia, the Global South and Europe on Responsible AI in the Public Sector

- Hold a thematic hearing titled “Connecting Asia, the Global South and Europe on Responsible AI in the Public Sector” with presentation from leading experts and policymakers from Brazil, India, Japan, Malaysia, the Republic of Korea, Tunisia, and the United Kingdom.
- Welcome the global interest in the Framework Convention and stress the importance of continued cooperation on connecting Asia, the Global South and Europe on responsible AI in the public sector.

Agenda item 10. Discussion on transitional measures for 2025-2026

- Take note of the information provided by the Secretariat on transitional measures linked to the ongoing discussion within the Committee of Ministers on the Council of Europe’s Programme and Budget cycle for 2026-2027.
- Subject to the Committee of Ministers’ decision on the establishment of the Steering Committee on New and Emerging Technologies (CDNET), invite the Secretariat and the CAI Bureau to continue, in close consultation, the follow-up on ongoing work and the preparation of relevant documentation for consideration by a future CDNET.

Agenda item 11. Date and place of the next meeting

- Take note of the information provided by the Secretariat and instruct the Secretariat to revert to the matter of the date and place of the meeting, subject to the Committee of Ministers’ decision on the establishment of the CDNET, once further clarity is available.

Agenda item 12. Any other business

- Take note of the information provided by the Secretariat on the ongoing evaluation by the Council of Europe’s Directorate of Internal Oversight (DIO) with the purpose of assessing the Council of Europe’s work on AI and its contribution to the protection and promotion of human rights, democracy and the rule of law. The results of this evaluation are expected to provide guidance on how the Council of Europe should position its work on AI to ensure the relevance of that work.
- Take note that CAI Members, Participants and Observers might be individually invited by the DIO to contribute to the evaluation.
